EXTERNAL AUDIT

BDO LLP has completed the audit of Tewin Parish Council accounts and has issued an unqualified audit opinion as they consider the information in the annual return is in accordance with proper practices and no matters have come to their attention giving cause for concern that relevant legislation and regulatory requirements have not been met. The audit form will be displayed on the Parish Council notice board for the statutory 14 days.

PLANNING APPLICATIONS

With regard to the planning application for conversion of an agricultural building into a 5 bedroomed dwelling on land to the rear of Upper Green, Tewin, East Herts Council has given prior approval with a condition that the brick walls to the south and west be demolished. Permitted development rights have also been removed for the creation of walls, fences and gates.

Consultation on Proposed Changes to Bus Services

Hertfordshire County Council is proposing to save between £700,000 and £887,000 from its £3.8 million bus budget. To do this the proposal is to reduce funding for evening and Sunday services of the 119 services supported. A 12 week consultation has been launched which runs until 8 October 2014. The 388 is one of the services affected with the 18.45 service from Welwyn North to Hertford and possibly the 18.05 service from Hertford to Welwyn North at risk. 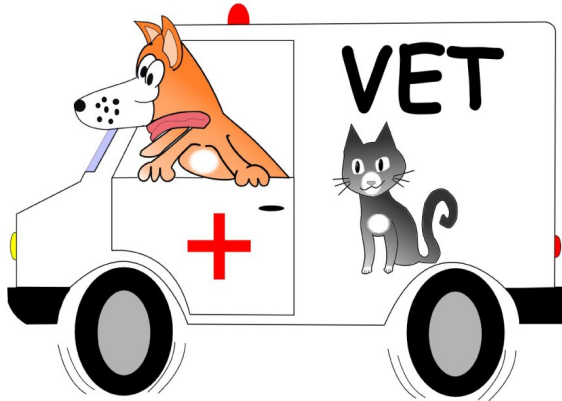

Tewin Cowper School

We are so proud of our children: we came top in the Interschool rounders tournament, resulting in a final between our two teams: a brilliant achievement! Our sports day was fantastic: we were blessed with good weather. The winning house team this year was Cowper (yellow team). The icing on the cake was our SATs results – the tests the Year 6 children take at the end of their time here:

Maths – 100% achieved level 4+; 48% level 5+ and 14% level 6.

Reading – 95% achieved level 4+; 52% level 5.

Grammar Punctuation and Spelling – 81% achieved level 4+; 52% level 5

Writing is teacher assessed - 81% achieved level 4+; 14% level 5

NB level 4 is the National Expectation.

21 children took the tests, so each child accounts for almost 5%.

The levels of achievement are good, exceptionally so in maths; the progress is excellent across all subjects as all the children made at least 2 levels of progress across Key Stage 2, except one child in writing.

Across the school, our children have made excellent progress and we look forward to building on this in the new year. So we have lots to celebrate as we come to the end of the term. We are disappointed that Ofsted have not visited as yet but hope they will carry out an inspection early on in the Autumn Term.

During the summer break, the school continues to be a hive of activity with Mrs Wright running a summer club for the first two weeks, Mr Le Tissier running a football club for the next two and of course our Swimming Pool will be open through the summer for those families who make use of this great facility. Teachers return to school on 1st September for two INSET days; the children begin the academic year on 3rd September and so begins the new school year with a new curriculum, new faces, high expectations and our enthusiasm to make the most of every opportunity and challenge.

TEWIN MEMORIAL HALL

MEMORIAL HALL MAINTENANCE:

It is due to your support for the Fete and other events such as our bi-annual Jumble Sales and Book Sales etc., and through private bookings during the year, as well, of course, contributions to our monthly lottery, that the upkeep of the Hall is possible. A building such as the Memorial Hall will inevitably show wear and tear over the years and it's vital that this is kept at bay where necessary. Our latest large expenditure has been the renewal of all the Hall's guttering. The cost of this was £6,720, which included scaffolding to reach the high section on the car park side, plus the guards which have been put up as an added protection against slipping roof tiles. The maintenance company also checked the tiling and carried out minor repairs. It is anticipated that the same company will be returning next year to replace any broken tiles or carry out other necessary repairs and it is hoped that by doing so, any possible major problems will be avoided in the future. Thankfully, at the present time the roof appears to be in good condition.

However, we now have another project in hand. It is necessary to repair and refurbish the Car Park at the back of the Hall. Obviously, with so many activities over the years, plus the regular groups who use the Hall during the week, there has been a good deal of deterioration so arrangements have been made to carry out the necessary work in the near future.

Recent Purchase. The Hall's old grey plastic outdoor chairs have served us well, but they made their last appearance at the Fete. They have now been replaced with new red plastic chairs, which we hope will serve us for many years to come.

So once again, our grateful thanks to everyone who supports the Hall in any way. Please continue to do so and if you are planning a private party or event of any kind in the future, please consider the Hall as a possible venue – it now has modern facilities, a lot of space, and the ability to cater for any function, whether large or small. Team Vicar's Letter

“Our days are like the grass; we flourish like a flower of the field; when the wind goes over it is gone and its place will know it no more”.

These words from Psalm 103 form part of the Church's funeral liturgy. They are a sobering reminder of the frailty of our lives and the reality that for most of us, when we die, in centuries to come we will be forgotten. Yet the psalmist continues in his song to express that whereas human memory may come to an end, divine memory is eternal.

However, there is a small group of people personal to this community that each year we pledge never to forget; those young men who lost their lives in the First and Second World Wars. In preparation for the centenary of the First World War this month a small group of people from the church and village have been working hard to gather information about the soldiers of 1914-1918 on our War Memorial and other memories in order to help those lives not get lost in the passing of time.

It seems absolutely right not to forget their sacrifice. To record what we can as memories of them get ever distant. To honour the debt we owe as the Kohima Epitaph expresses: “When you go home tell of us and say, for your tomorrow, we gave our today”.

We remember them also because by remembering who they were, we remember who we are; human beings with a capacity for great good and also for much evil. Remembering the Great Wars (great in size, not in goodness), we are reminded of the need to daily work, pray and speak for peace.

Do come and visit the exhibition and events put on to mark this occasion. There will also be a special act of Remembrance at 9:30am on Sunday 3rd August around the War Memorial for collective remembering. The Revd Simon Chapman, ex RAF chaplain will be our guest preacher that day.

At the going down of the sun and in the morning, we will remember them.

River Lea Boat Trip

Tewin Bird Survey

Since 1995 I have carried out annual breeding bird surveys around Tewin on behalf of the British Trust for Ornithology. The methodology is straightforward – I walk a standard route through a 1 km square in both directions on paths at least 200m apart and count the birds that I see or hear. My square is TL2615 on the local OS map which covers the path through Dawley Wood in one direction and returns on the path behind Orchard Road up to the duck pond. I do this twice shortly after dawn in mid April and end May and the higher of the two counts is recorded and included in a national database. Some of you will have seen me with my binoculars and recording sheet.

In the years I have been doing it I have recorded 60 species with between 29 and 39 in a particular year. Many of the commoner species have remained relatively unchanged in numbers – Blackbirds, Blue Tits and Woodpigeons for example. Some species have noticeably increased in numbers such as Great Spotted Woodpeckers, Goldfinches, Red Kite, Buzzard, and Chiffchaff, but more have fallen in numbers or disappeared like Grey and Red legged Partridges, Turtle Dove, Skylark, House Martin, Swallow, Linnet and Mistle Thrush. What is interesting is how consistent local data from just one small area is with national data. A good local population of birds remains though despite habitat changes.

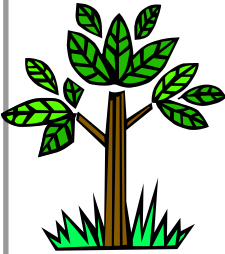
