

Tewin Parish Council



<u>Planning Application 3/17/0722/OUT -</u> Land East of Upper Green Road, Tewin

Construction of 9 dwellings consisting of 4 x 3 bedroom and 5 x 2 bedroom homes with two new vehicular accesses - Tewin Parish Council agreed to object to the proposal as the applicant has not justified building on Green Belt land, the proposals are incompatible with the submitted District Plan

and therefore not a sustainable development and it would create a precedent for other developers with land around the village. The Parish Council also supported parishioners comments against the proposed application. *East Herts Council has refused this planning application*.

Lower Green

The Parish Council has agreed to purchase two new litter bins for Lower Green. One will be installed in the centre near the benches and the other by the well cover.

Please be sensible as to what you put in the litter bins. Too often there are large bags of rubbish stuffed in to them, leaving no room for genuine litter including dog poo bags. If you are having a picnic, please take your rubbish home with you. Please do not put household rubbish in litter bins. If your rubbish is going to fill the bin, then you should be taking it away with you.

Tebbutts Shop

The shop has been bought by Datchworth Stores and is now open once again.

Common Ragwort (Senecio Jacobaea)

This is a common weed found throughout the British Isles. However it is very toxic to horses and other livestock and can have potentially fatal consequences if ingested either in its green or dried state.

Under the Weeds Act 1959 the Secretary of State may serve an enforcement notice on the occupier of land on which injurious weeds are growing, requiring the occupier to take action to prevent the spread of injurious weeds. The Weeds Act specifies **five** injurious weeds: Common Ragwort, Spear Thistle, Creeping of Field Thistle, Broad Leaved Dock and Curled Dock.

By promoting good practice and good neighbourliness it is hoped that this weed can be controlled.

If you find you have it in your garden please put rubber gloves on and remove the plant and place it in the <u>black bin</u> to prevent livestock eating it. Fragments of root will remain in the ground so new growth will have to be monitored and removed year after year.

Ever Heard of Tewin Charities?

Tewin Charities is registered by the Charities Commission (reg no 1054863) to administer funds, bequeathed long ago, for the benefit and protection of people of limited means who are going through difficult circumstances and are resident within the Parish of Tewin.

These funds have become, with the passage of time and inflation, relatively small. The Charity can foresee a situation in which its work and purpose will be seriously hampered through lack of reserves.

Tewin Charities would be enormously grateful to anyone who might be prepared to consider making a donation or bequeathing a gift to the charity when making or reviewing their will. Any bequest to a registered charity would be exempt from inheritance tax and currently an estate can pay Inheritance Tax at a reduced rate of 36% on some assets if you leave 10% or more of the 'net value' to registered charities in your will.

Stay Safe During The Heatwave

Although the extraordinarily high temperatures of late June have thankfully abated, Public Health England has issued some basic guidelines for coping with very hot weather.

High temperatures can be dangerous, especially for people who may be particularly vulnerable such as older people, young children and those with serious illnesses. Residents are advised to follow a few simple precautions:

- Stay out of direct sun between 11am and 3pm.
- Wear loose-fitting clothes and a hat; apply sunscreen and walk in the shade.
- Have plenty of cold drinks and keep cool with cold showers or baths if necessary, cold foods and by avoiding extreme activity.
- Keep homes cool as best you can, perhaps by keeping the curtains drawn on very hot days, and well ventilated.
- Remember some medicines need to be kept cool check the instructions on the packet.

Babies, children and older people (and pets) should not be left in stationary cars. If you feel unusually unwell consult your doctor if symptoms (such as headache, intense thirst, dizziness or muscular spasms) persist.

Even if temperatures do not hit extreme levels, Public Health England (PHE) still advises people to keep safe in the sun, seek shade to cool down and keep hydrated with plenty of cool fluids.
