

Apply Now For A Free Early Education Place For Your Child

Applications for free early years education places for children aged between three and five years are now being accepted by childcare providers in the county.

All children from the term after they are three are entitled to 570 hours of free early education per year until they start full-time school. However, working families in Hertfordshire will be able to extend this to 30 hours of free childcare per week, a total of 1140 hours per year, provided they meet the application criteria.

The process to apply for a free early education place at a nursery class/school has changed and applications from parents should now be made directly to the early years provider of their choice.

- visits and open days
- how they allocate places

• flexible provision, part-time placements, 30 hours free childcare and additional hours.

Team Vicar's Letter

These days of March are Lenten days. Days where the Church remembers Jesus' retreat into the wilderness. A place where he was alone, where he knew temptation, a place of hardship and of great vulnerability. A place where he encountered that voice which whispered half-truths and illusionary realities.

But you don't have to leave home to be in the wilderness. You can find it right under your duvet in the early hours when the world is asleep. That time when it is just you and your racing thoughts – in the lonely hours of between -time: where it is not still night, but not yet dawn.

And in this wilderness we can feel equally alone and vulnerable. Our minds whisper to us the fear, the worry, the sickness and grief, which, during daylight hours or in the company of others, we suppress. Here too is a wilderness place: a vast space that feels as if it bears only us and us alone. A place with nothing to hide behind. A place where the voices often seem too big to confront and the realities they speak of too difficult to bear.

Yet should we awake, in that small hour, we might remember the voices in our heads are similarly half-truths and illusions. Reaching into our deepest fears they often speak with an authority that they truly should not possess. Fear which factors out hope, or the comfort of another, or the reality of a brighter day. We might tell them 'you are not the whole truth, there is always light to cast out the dark'.

For Christians that light is known to be Jesus. The wilderness is a place he inhabits for us, so that we should not inhabit it alone.

A prayer I sometimes use before bed comes from the New Zealand service of Compline. You may find it helpful:

Lord, it is night. The night is for stillness.

Let me be still in the presence of God.

It is night after a long day.

What has been done has been done.

What has not been done has not been done.

Let it be.

The night is dark.

Let our fear of the dark of the world and of our own lives rest in you. The night is quiet.

Let the quietness of your peace enfold us,

all dear to us and all who have no peace.

Amen.

DRIVESAFE TEAM UPDATE AND A REQUEST FOR INFORMATION FROM YOU

By now you will have noticed that a permanent Speed Indication Device (SID) has been installed opposite Upper Green following our successful application to the Hertfordshire Police and Crime Commissioner.

The DriveSafe team is now considering its next initiatives. A key objective remains safe driving through appropriate speeds. Tewin is covered by a maximum limit of 30mph. Evidence shows the lower the speed of a collision the less severe the injury, to pedestrian, cyclist, horse rider or passenger. In due course we aim to retrieve data from the SID to show what the average speed is at that point. We will also monitor average speeds at other points in Tewin. The data will help us build a picture of driving styles throughout the village and help us decide future steps.

One thing THAT YOU CAN HELP WITH is collision data. Collisions have occurred in recent years within the village, often where the road narrows. Some have resulted in severe vehicle damage. Thankfully it is many years since there was a road fatality within Tewin but that and serious injuries are always a risk. So, can you <u>tell us if you have seen any collisions in Tewin in the last two years</u> to help build a picture? You need not have witnessed the actual incident just have been aware of, or passed it. If so please email the team at drivesafe.tewin@gmail.com giving :

-Tewin location, the year & approximate date / month

New Year, New Yoga? by Kirsty Dickenson

At the start of a new year it is usual to start to think about new challenges. Yoga is a popular practice for many to take up as it has numerous benefits for both physical and mental health and wellbeing. The word yoga means 'union' and the practice of yoga is to bring about an internal connection and deeper awareness, creating space and opening to a stronger and more flexible body as we begin to balance the body energy as well as the physical body. Although there are a number of different styles of yoga, I believe it is not essential for a new student to get too focussed on their differences. I believe it is more beneficial to try as many classes as you feel necessary because it is important to find a style and a teacher that you connect with. If you are completely new to the practice, as a general rule, look for a class or course described as 'Beginners', 'Foundation' or 'Fundamentals' and below I have outlined a few of the more common styles you will encounter when searching for classes.

- **Hatha Yoga** one of the oldest forms of yoga. The word Hatha means 'force' or 'effort' in Sanskrit and refers to the physical practice of connecting Asana (posture) and Prana (breath). Classes will usually be gentle with elements of meditation.
- **Iyengar Yoga** A form of Hatha Yoga with a strong focus on precision and alignment in poses. To aid correct alignment, props such as bricks, blocks and bolsters will be used in classes.
- **'Flow'** classes will be a continually moving sequence with one movement following another and a heavy focus on the connection of the breath to movement.
- **'Hot'** classes are performed in a climate controlled environment. The room is heated which enables the body to heat up quicker leading to increased flexibility.

To summarise, below are my top 3 things to remember:

- 1. Making a strong connection with your teacher is key.
- 2. Every day is different. There will be days when you will feel more connected, more flexible, more present, and other days you will not.
- 3. Set an affirmation or intention to yourself every time you step onto your mat.
