Visit to RHS Garden Wisley on Wednesday 25th July

If you would like a Summer's day out to lift the spirits, then join us on a coach trip for a day at Wisley. Wisley is the flagship garden of the Royal Horticultural Society and is home to some of the largest plant collections in the world. You may well have been to Wisley before but it is continuously developing and the pace of change has recently increased substantially, so be prepared for a few surprises! Despite the large size of the garden, you don't have to be a fit walker to be able to enjoy it. If you are no longer as mobile as you used to be, rest assured that there are many facilities to enable access for disabled people, including manual wheelchairs by the entrance and an electric mobility vehicle which drives around the gardens for those who cannot walk too far. There are also some powered mobility scooters available, but these need to be booked in advance. However you get about the garden, you'll be in need of some refreshments during our visit. There are four different catering options as well as picnic sites. Also, don't forget to visit the Wisley Shop and the extensive Plant Centre for top-quality plants and great ideas for home and garden.

As *THACS* is affiliated to the RHS, there will be no entry charge for us. The adult price for the coach is £15 for *THACS* members and £20 for non-members. The children's price for the coach is £10 if at least one parent / carer is a *THACS* member and £12 otherwise. An optional walking guided tour of the gardens is available for an additional cost of £3 per person. The tour will last about 90 minutes and is scheduled to start at 11:30.

The coach will leave Tewin (opposite the Rose and Crown) at 9.00am promptly and leave Wisley at 3.30pm. 





Team Vicar's Letter

"I believe in Christianity as I believe that the sun has risen; not only because I see it, but because by it I see everything else" C.S. Lewis.

I think this is a pretty good description of faith. Sometimes we can confuse faith with certainty or a list of dogmas – or with some kind of perfected lifestyle. Yet I rarely find that understanding of faith when I meet other Christians. Most of us, in my experience, carry our doubts alongside our beliefs. We can get a bit muddled if you try to pin us down on exactly what we mean when we recite the creed. We may forget to pray, be rather hazy on our bibles and sometimes would rather stay in bed on a Sunday morning*. Faith seems to me to be less about what we know, and more about how we see.

The Christian faith, as a lens through which we see the world, invites us to look upon each person as being made in the image of God. It invites us particularly to see God in the forgotten and the unwanted, the poor, the sick and the prisoner. It invites us to see ourselves as in need of forgiveness as much as the ones who have wronged us. It invites us to see creation as holy and precious and something we should treasure. It invites us to train our eyes to see hope, our hearts to yearn for peace and our hands to work for good, because we believe in a God whose love is stronger than any evil and whose presence is found in the ordinary kindnesses we show to one another. This month our churches celebrate with a group of people from teenage years to retirement as they confirm their faith in Christ at a special service. Each one will have their own personal story and experiences of what has brought them to this decision. They will each have seen different things in life, known different loves, joys and sorrows, but in common they hold the experience of having found Christianity as that lens which starts to give focus to what they see – and to understand the way that God sees each one of them: "This is my child, my beloved, in whom I am well pleased" (Mark 3:17)

The Confirmations take place on Sunday 10th June 6:30pm at St Mary's Church in Welwyn. The Bishop of Hertford will be presiding. All are welcome to come and show their support and be part of this special service. But if you've never tried it before, perhaps put on that lens for just a day. Try to see the world and all whom you meet as if they were created out of the love of God. I wonder what difference it might make? Susannah
