#### **Tree in Cannons Meadow**

The presences of dead branches on the ash tree in Cannons Meadow was reported to Herts Highways and tests revealed that the trunk was rotten inside and it needs to be removed.

#### Parish Litter Bins

Please be sensible as to what you put in the litter bins . Too often there are large bags of rubbish stuffed in to them, leaving no room for genuine litter, including dog poo bags. If you are having a picnic, please take your rubbish home with you. Please do not put household rubbish in litter bins. If your rubbish is going to fill the bin, then you should be taking it away with you.

#### Common Ragwort (Senecio Jacobaea)

This is a common weed found throughout the British Isles. However it is very toxic to horses and other livestock and can have potentially fatal consequences if ingested either in its green or dried state.

Under the Weeds Act 1959 the Secretary of State may serve an enforcement notice on the occupier of land on which injurious weeds are growing, requiring the occupier to take action to prevent the spread of injurious weeds. The Weeds Act specifies **five** injurious weeds: Common Ragwort, Spear Thistle, Creeping of Field Thistle, Broad Leaved Dock and Curled Dock.

By promoting good practice and good neighbourliness it is hoped that this weed can be controlled.

**If you find you have it in your garden please put rubber gloves on and remove the plant and place it in the <u>black bin</u> to prevent livestock eating it. Fragments of root will remain in the ground so new growth will have to be monitored and removed year after year.**



More Tea Vicar?

One of the clues to how I am obviously a real and proper vicar – is how much tea I drink. I just love it. On occasion I can be classy with some Lady Grey or even a Lapsang Souchong – but most of the time my days are fuelled by bog standard builders tea. The day does not begin until at least two cups are consumed, and then for every task, every procrastination, every writing of a vicar's letter – a cup of tea is a familiar friend. But of course the best way to drink tea, is with others.

The invitation 'fancy a cuppa?' has often been the catalyst for deepening friendships, for truth telling, for talking through griefs and problems and for a bit of happy gossip and laughter.

The Japanese have a tea drinking ceremony where strict traditions are followed and honoured. Our tea drinking is perhaps less ceremonial, but still a cultural necessity in terms of giving attention and time to one another.

I have a tapestry on my kitchen wall that was made by a Palestinian women's project in Bethlehem. 'Make tea, not walls' it reads. It is a reminder of the great power of spending time with others, and the consequence of not giving proper attention to the building of relationships.

Perhaps today you might think who you could give the gift of a cup of tea to? It's probably the cheapest gift we have to offer and yet, perhaps, for someone you know it might be the most precious.

#### St Peter's Summer Outing

Ely Cathedral, with its unique 14<sup>th</sup> Century octagonal lantern tower, is counted among the marvels of the medieval world. Much of the cathedral is over 900 years old and it offers a rich architectural history, including the sumptuous 13<sup>th</sup> Century Quire and beautiful 14<sup>th</sup> Century Lady Chapel.

Around the cathedral itself you can explore attractive parkland and one of the largest collections of medieval monastery buildings still in daily use. It is easy to spend a whole day, and longer, visiting the cathedral, and also the city of Ely with its attractive riverside and other tourist attractions.

## Friends of Danesbury & Queen Victoria Memorial Hospital

'What happens at Danesbury and QVM Hospital?' is a question we are often asked. Both are well known in the local, and wider, community but for some exactly what services they provide is a mystery. Many recall past experiences, maybe rather personal, and for some it is the original appeal which in 1993 provided funding for building what is now Danesbury Neurological Centre.

Then Danesbury Home, as it was originally named, provided a home for residents of all ages who needed full time medical care. Now there is just one remaining resident and Danesbury is a Neurological Centre – one of only two in Hertfordshire. The centre provides care for both in-patients and out-patients who have a range of acute neurological problems. The medical team includes Physiotherapists, Psychologists, Speech Therapists, Dieticians and Specialist Parkinson's and MS nurses.

Built in 1902 Queen Victoria Memorial Hospital was for many decades a Community hospital for Welwyn, Codicote and Digswell. Now it cares for patients who need rehabilitation following a stay in one of the acute hospitals, particularly Lister Hospital in Stevenage. Most have had a stroke or similar medical condition and usually stay up to six weeks whilst the specialist team help them to maximise their independence.

Both Danesbury and QVM are part of the Herts Community NHS Trust. Unlike the trust administering the acute hospitals, the Community Trust is responsible for the whole of the county and in today's financial climate is obliged to juggle its resources between its various sites.

With our supporters' help the Friends are privileged to be able to fund some of this wonderful care provided by both establishments.
