



PRECEPT

At their meeting on 5th December 2022 the Parish Council reviewed the precept options for the Financial Year Ending 31.3.2024 and in accordance with the Financial Regulations of the Council they unanimously agreed to increase the precept by 6% from £33,000 to £35,000.

MOTORBIKE NUISANCE

With regard to reports of off-road bikes, Herts Rural Police advise that there have been one or two reports over the last few weeks but nothing like the reports received in previous years. They ran an operation with quad bikes to catch some of the worst offenders and it has certainly calmed it down. However if any motorbikes are seen by walkers please can they call it in on 101 at the time so that if we have the resources, we can deal with them there and then. Word soon gets around in the biking community that the Police are active in certain areas. **PLANNING**

RE: 3/22/2448/FUL - Land To The West Of Churchfield Road,` Tewin Retrospective application for the change of use from agricultural land to dog walking field, erection of fencing and the creation of parking area.

Tewin Parish Council (TPC) would prefer not to have this dog walking field as it is Green Belt, is within a Registered Park & Garden, in close proximity (110 meters) of the River Mimram chalk stream, the SSSI and Nature Reserve at Tewin Bury and to Tewin Lodge. TPC request that the following be consulted: Hertfordshire Gardens Trust, Historic England and the conservation/Landscape officers, Natural England and Herts & Middx Wildlife Trust and the residents of Tewin Lodge.

TPC are supporting a local initiative to protect the environment and habitats of the valley of the River Mimram chalk stream – see Lower Mimram Valley Initiative - Tewin Village.

The Council has requested the following conditions be imposed:-

- no sheds, tyres, apparatus or other paraphernalia, no lighting, restriction to a maximum of 2 cars and six dogs at any time, no parking on the road to use the facility, no organised events or training sessions, restricted access hours of 8 am to 7 pm and less at weekends.

A change of use may lower the planning protection on the land, and this may be taken advantage of by future owners. TPC ask EHC Planning to carefully consider the removal of permitted development rights and the imposition of other restrictions, to ensure that further development does not take place in the future.

Winter On the Farm

At this time of year, Martyn and myself have a meeting with our Agronomist, who works for a company called Agrii. They run regional variety trials at their Technology Centres, giving their customers the latest information. We talk about our crops of the past season, our spray program of herbicides and fungicides, soil health and fertiliser rates. We will also be discussing the most economic use of Nitrogen, as all inputs have risen sharply with the sowing of next year's crops and at this moment we do not know what the prices will be next summer.

There is a lot of unknown in the farming world, at the moment with Bird Flu, the price of eggs (if you can get them), the price of vegetables etc for next year.

The war in Ukraine dominates all of our grain prices at this time. It affects how many ships leave with cargoes of wheat or oilseeds or maize and how much of the country will be sown to crops in the coming season.

Myself and Vaughan, decided to sell 20 acres of our River Meadows, at Archers Green. This is a lovely area of River Meadows, and particularly the lovely chalk stream, the River Mimram. We bought the Meadows some years ago, to save it from the person who was turning the neighbouring land into plot lands for future building. Sadly we are getting older and unable to maintain it in the standard we would wish. We are so pleased that the Herts and Middlesex Wildlife Trust have bought the site and will manage it as one of their nature reserves. The site will now be well looked after for future generations.

Willow is the only national charity working with seriously ill young adults (aged 16 to 40) helping them to experience uplifting and unforgettable Special Days.

Since 1999 Willow has helped to arrange 17,000 Special Days for young adults with life threatening conditions such as cancer, motor neurone disease, cystic fibrosis, muscular dystrophy, Huntingdon's disease along with many other rare conditions.

Willow was founded in 1999 by former Arsenal goalkeeper and TV presenter, Bob Wilson, and his wife Megs as a lasting memorial to their daughter, Anna, who died of cancer, aged 31. The inspiration for Willow came from Anna's determination to live every moment to the full, despite the most difficult circumstances. "Anna's love of life and her own Special Days taught us that quality of life and quality of time is so very important" said Bob and Megs Wilson.

Team Vicar's Letter

As we move into a New Year, I was tempted to simply leave you some space to write your hopes and plans for the year ahead. After all, there is something very appealing about a blank sheet -a fresh start.

But then I thought sometimes there is nothing more frightening than a completely blank page! Where on earth do we start? We need some guidelines – a framework – a jumping off point. What do we want to change spiritually, emotionally and physically? And what do we want to do to change the lives of others? Where do we want to be by the end of 2023?

But actually we don't ever start with a blank page. It's like the old joke about asking people for directions, where they say "well, I wouldn't start from here". We don't start with a pristine white page, we start with the world as it is; with us as we are. It's not simple. We would perhaps prefer to start from somewhere else. And sometimes we can't quite see how to do that.

Recently I was speaking with a friend who had attended a charcoal drawing workshop. They had been surprised when the tutor's first instruction was to cover the entire sheet in thick black charcoal and then to smudge it with a paper towel. They'd expected to draw the outlines and shade them in, leaving the white parts – as if drawing with a pencil. But here they were faced with a smudgy charcoal page (and, rather smudgy charcoal hands!). Instead of drawing the dark onto the light, they used a charcoal rubber to draw the light out of the dark.

The conversation reminded me of something really profound – that the light and beauty of our lives often emerge from darkness, too. The darkness doesn't overcome the light, it never will. Just as we celebrated the light of Christ coming into the world's darkness at Christmas, so we celebrate His light in us as we move into a new year. We start from where we are – with all of our dark parts and smudges – and Jesus draws the light out in us. We are enhanced, illuminated and we are able to reflect His light into the world around us, too. May God bring you his light and his peace this January and throughout 2023.

Tewin Tennis Club



Firstly New Year wishes to all our members and the wider community in Tewin. The committee hopes you had a nice Christmas and have at least some good thoughts about 2023. The next months will be an

awkward time for many, yet exercise, in the form of tennis or simply walking, can do a great deal for your mental wellbeing.

Let me here give a sideways plug for the Thursday morning walks that leave from Lower Green at 9.30 and 10am each week. The 10.00 start means a shorter walk and I understand that both tend to wind up with a sociable coffee. I have done these in the past and they are invigorating.

As I write this is mid-December, tennis has effectively been called off for the week due to snow. It's such a rarity for the weather to stop our keenest players from getting a game – they don't stretch to umbrellas quite yet but a game in showers of rain is hardly unknown.

Which brings us to the Tewin Tennis Club AGM. This takes place on Friday January 13 at the Pavilion, and we'd implore members to make the effort to attend. This is our first AGM for three years, which gives us all something to catch up on as well as the very important subject of the court resurfacing.

The committee has made a recommendation that we move to Tiger Turf, an all weather artificial grass (for want of a better description). Members have already been circulated the committee's thoughts on this from chairman David Room, notably that it will be easier on the joints and is less slippery in marginal conditions.

Archers Green, Tewin A New Nature Reserve On Your Doorstep

Herts & Middlesex Wildlife has just purchased a new nature reserve in Tewin Parish, Archers Green, which alongside the Trust's existing Tewin Orchard and Tewinbury nature reserves underlines how valuable the parish is for the recovery of nature. Archers Green has flower-rich meadows, flanking the beautiful River Mimram. It runs alongside the B1000 and provides an important connection for wildlife to other local sites, such as Panshanger Park and Tewinbury Nature Reserve.

In September, the Trust secured a philanthropic loan to purchase Archers Green enabling this important wildlife site to be taken off the open market and ensure its special wildlife is protected. The Trust is now fundraising to raise $\pounds 500,000$ to repay the loan, improve the site and to manage it. Here, they explain why this is so important, not only for the wildlife that thrives at Archers Green but for future generations too.

Rare gem

We may take it for granted as it's on our doorstep but the River Mimram that flows through Archers Green is a chalk river and one of only 240 in the entire world. This habitat is as rare and as globally precious as a rainforest, hence why it is so important to protect it and, fortunately, the stretch at Archers Green is in great condition.

All creatures great and small

Archers Green abounds with wildlife - birds, fish, mammals, amphibians and invertebrates all call this very special site home. Notable birdlife includes Redwing, Yellowhammer, Snipe, Marsh Tit, Grey Partridge, Cuckoo and Skylark. Five bat species have been recorded here – cast your eyes to the sky at dusk and there's a chance you may see the Common Pipistrelle, Soprano Pipistrelle, Nocule, Leisler's or Daubenton's. Water Vole, Otter and Grass Snake are known on the site too, along with many invertebrates, including three extremely rare, red-listed water beetles

Securing the future

The Trust's aim is to improve the ecological value of Archers Green and see diversification of species and populations grow.

Volunteers Needed To Help Run Digital Inclusion Drop-in Sessions

CDA Herts www.cdaherts.org.uk has received funding from Clarion Futures Housing Association to provide digital help to people in some Hertfordshire villages, now including Tewin.

The aim is to help those who are not yet able to make full use of the internet and digital devices. Isolation worsened during the covid lockdowns and projects such as this one also help to prevent loneliness and its associated health and wellbeing problems.

Online shopping and banking have become the norm, as has meeting friends and family through video platforms such as Zoom, FaceTime, Teams and WhatsApp.

Fortnightly **Digital Drop In Sessions** will be run in conjunction with the Over 50s Club which meets on Thursday afternoons at Tewin Memorial Hall. Tewin Parish Council is also supporting the project. A trial session has already taken place and was well attended.

It will provide a friendly, informal environment to enable learners to gain confidence and become more familiar with using their own IT devices, such as laptops, iPads and smartphones. Some equipment will also be provided by the coordinator. Basic skills will also be covered, such as connecting to the internet, sending emails and meeting friends & family virtually using FaceTime, Zoom etc.

We are looking for some local volunteer 'Digital Champions' or 'Digital Buddies' who would be able to help run the sessions. The two-hour sessions will take place in the Kimberley Room at the Memorial Hall on alternate Thursday afternoons, whilst the Over 50s Club is meeting in the main hall.

To become a volunteer you don't need to be an IT expert or have any special qualifications, as long as you can operate a mobile phone, tablet, PC or laptop and are able to use your own knowledge to explain the best ways of doing things.

If you don't feel confident in directly helping others with their IT needs & queries, you might want to help with the other essential jobs: setting up the room, meeting and greeting attendees, helping to keep records of the types of enquiries received, as well as providing tea & cakes and tidying up at the end.

Winter is Here

Herts County Council have been out gritting 13 times in 8 days (from Monday 5th December until Monday 12th December inc.). That's over 30,000km covered and around 4,500 tonnes of salt used. Believe it or not, that's the same weight as a slightly overindulgent hippo or 2 medium sized rhinos...!

We have two teams of approximately 70 people to cover 58 gritting routes in Hertfordshire, including operatives loading the gritters, supervisors and gritter drivers across a fleet of 70 vehicles. They have been out in the early hours on a number of occasions, with road temperatures as low as -7. With these cold temperatures, our forecaster even had to stop using the red colour to mean 'danger' and start using purple instead.

During snow events we grit the roads more often meaning 70 of our workforce are unavailable for other maintenance works. Our drivers also have legal stand down periods so if they grit overnight, they have to have an 8 hour break before they can return to work.

The gritter lorries are all fitted with tracking devices and you can check the roads that have been gritted on our website at https://tinyurl.com/Herts-Winter-Roads.


