

HELP US LOOK AFTER LOWER GREEN

the grass begins to grow, however in the meantime we would be very grateful if everyone could help us by being careful not to drive over the edge of the green.

ELECTIONS - VOTER ID REQUIRED FOR 2023

The UK Government has introduced a requirement for voters to show photo ID when voting at a polling station at elections. This new requirement will apply for the first time in England at the Local Elections on Thursday 4th May 2023.

Which forms of ID can I use to vote?

You may already have a form of photo ID that is acceptable. You can use any of the following:

Passport, Driving Licence (incl provisional licence), Blue Badge, certain concessionary travel cards, Identity card with PASS mark (Proof of Age Standards Scheme), Biometric immigration document, Defence identity card, certain national identity cards.

NB: If you have a form of accepted ID that is out of date, you can still use it to vote at a polling station if it still looks like you.

No ID: If you don't already have an accepted form of photo ID, or you are not sure whether your photo ID still looks like you, you can apply for a free voter ID document, known as a Voter Authority Certificate. You can apply for this at www.gov.uk/apply-for-photo-id-voter-authority-certificate.

Application forms will be available online to download and print, or you can request a paper application form to be sent to you by the Electoral Services team at East Herts Council on 01279 655261.

<u>Deadline</u>: The deadline to apply for a Voter Authority Certificate for use at the elections in May 2023 is 5pm on Tuesday 25th April 2023.

Have You Got a Wheelchair You Don't Want?

I was recently asked if I had a wheelchair as someone in the village needed to visit a London Hospital and the corridors, he knew, would be too long for him to walk. Luckily, I was able to point the gentleman in the right direction and a wheelchair was procured for the day.

Many people in our village may need the occasional use of a wheelchair, say, if you've an elderly or infirm parent or friend coming for the week or just for a few days. Having a wheelchair would give you, and them, access to shops, garden centres etc.

The thought crossed my mind – 'Why don't we a have village wheel-chair'? I discussed the matter with the Memorial Hall Management Committee who readily agreed that the chair could be kept in our shed under lock and key until required.

However, before we purchase a brand-new chair, it occurred to me that there may be one or two wheelchairs in the village doing nothing except taking up space at your house. If it is in good working order and you are happy to donate it, I'd be happy to hear from you.

Once we have a chair – or two? – they could be lent out as and when needed. I don't intend to sterilise them every time they are used but we will keep an eye on their maintenance. It will, of course, be up to the borrower to check that the wheelchair is suitable for their intended use. Should you be able to help please call me.

Our Farming Life

The Ukraine War is a year old, and still dominating our daily life. The price of Gas and Electricity is up. The costs of all our crop inputs, including fertiliser, are up. Sulphur plays a very integral role in Nitrogen use. We used to buy a mix of Nitrogen & Sulphur. This season we can't.

I wrote an article about this a few years ago. Sulphur used to fall out of the sky due to the emissions from the industrial cities, coal fires at home, steam trains etc, but the Clean Air Act stopped it.

Luckily we have some exciting new products coming on the market. So this year our Sulphur comes from a mine, under the North Yorkshire Coast, at Boulby almost a mile under the sea. It's mined as a rock called Polyhalite and is crushed, screened and marketed as Polysulphate Certified Organic. It has the lowest carbon footprint of any fertiliser on the market, helping me to meet one of the many environmental obligations I have to make on my farm now. Polysulphate consists of 48 percent Sulphur, 14 percent Potash, 17 percent Calcium and 6 percent Magnesium, all good as it has slow release over 3-4 months on our growing crops.

My sprayer has had its yearly MOT test and is ready for work. We seem to have a early spring on the way? As of Monday the 30th of January, our fields had just dried out and Martyn started ploughing on the 1st of February in perfect conditions. We have the pea seed in store ready for when the soil temperatures are warm enough for sowing in about a month's time. But I feel winter is not passed yet.



Our plan is also to sow a few acres of Sunflowers, to add a bit of colour to our countryside and we hope to combine this new crop in October.

Martyn and myself went on the 7th of February to an Agricultural Show in Essex. The future in farming and agriculture is fast changing and we have to keep ahead of the game.

Screen On The Green

On the 20th March we are showing "*Rififi* (1955)", the classic French crime-and-suspense yarn that provided the benchmark for many subsequent Film Noir heist movies. It was directed by Jules Dassin on a shoestring with mainly 'non-stars' in the leading roles.

It tells the story of ageing gangsters tempted out of retirement by potentially lucrative safe-cracking jobs to carry out a major jewel theft in Paris. The film is cleverly plotted and sharply scripted with stunning and evocative shots of Paris and the drama doesn't stop with the heist.

Upon its original release, film critic and future director, Francois Truffaut praised the film, saying that "Out of the worst crime novel I ever read, Jules Dassin has made the best crime film I've ever seen". *Rififi* contains adult material and some violence typical of the period.





Team Vicar's Letter

Have you ever looked up at the stars in the sky and wondered about the significance of human life?

Have you ever walked through creation awed by its beauty and variety?

Have you ever felt your heart is heavy and weary and too tired to go on?

Have you ever had your soul lifted by the most perfect symphony that feels like it's from heaven?

Have you ever felt crushed by the betrayal of a friend or completely alone?

Have you ever felt God so near and trustworthy you need no words, for he knows it all already?

Have you ever felt God is so far, that he has abandoned you at the bottom of a pit?

If the answer to any of these is 'yes', then there is a psalm for you. The psalms are the songs of the bible. They flow from the very human souls that wrote them — and they speak with beauty and honesty about all that it means to be human. There are psalms of joy and psalms of lament. There are psalms that thank God for his goodness and psalms that accuse him of cruelty and abandonment. There are psalms that speak of love and psalms that speak of hate. They encompass every human emotion and, in an honesty that would be good for us all to learn to use in our prayers, bring it all to God.

During Lent our churches are running a 5 week course where we will look at some of the psalms together – and in doing so find ancient words that express the life we see around us now.

St Peter's News

The sun this month has been very welcome and has brought forward the spring bulbs. We do not yet know if it will last or whether the February we are accustomed to will return. It seems that this month is an odd one for the church as well with the little hangover from Christmas followed by the rather different mood of Lent. At St Peter's we are doing a bit of long-awaited repairs. All the lighting system has been removed and replaced with LED lamps which appear to give better illumination with quite a few other advantages.

For me, the great benefit is the long life of the lights which means we do not have to get out the big ladder and get up to the beams quite so often. By the time you read this the work will be done so come and see the result for yourself. We hope you will be impressed with the change.

Necessary repairs and upgrading are also needed for the clock. Work has now begun on a thorough overhaul of our antique tower clock. We think it was put in sometime in the late seventeenth century. This means we have to be careful to use appropriate experts and methods and that of course means more money. While the clock is being overhauled an auto winder is to be fitted so that it will no longer be necessary for someone to go up the tower every week to wind the clock and check the time. It seems to be the right moment to thank David and all the other helpers in the past for all their continued work keeping Tewin on time.

Our other big project being discussed at the moment is the building of an annex to serve as a meeting room. We held a meeting a few weeks ago to introduce this project to the village as a whole and to take on board comments and suggestions. On April 1st there will be two presentations at the Memorial Hall to build on the earlier meeting. One starts at eleven and the other at two. Do come.

Because of the Covid restrictions during the last few years we have not been able to carry out the annual spring clean. With all the accumulation of dust over that time it is even more important that we should not miss it this year. We plan to do the big clean on the 12/13 May. In the past we have moved all the furniture out of the way on the Friday and scrubbed and polished on the Saturday. I know it is some way off yet but please do come and help. It is usually a cheery

event which everyone seems to enjoy. No doubt Pete will leave a sheet of paper at the back of the church to collect the names of likely volunteers. Once again this seems a good moment to thank our team of regular cleaners who take it in turns to do the weekly hoover and polish (I could also take this moment to ask if you might be able to join their ranks).

Tewin Tennis Club



Spring is around the corner and there's plenty to get excited about. We've seen some let up in play on the courts over the winter, obviously. But as I write this, in mid-February, I

have just got back from the Saturday morning RATS social tennis and ten players turned up for the 11am session. We have evolved a rota system for doubles play if more than eight arrive, so no one is off court for more than ten minutes for the whole session.

The weather was pleasant, well, not cold, and the playing surface nicely dry, though previously we have been hit by cold frosty weather that stopped play earlier in the day. This has meant that morning play has often being replaced by morning coffee in the Plume and tennis shuffled back to after lunch.

As you will have read last month, at our AGM it was agreed that we would resurface the courts with Tiger Turf rather than the hard surface we have now. Essex Tennis Courts is our preferred contractor, chosen on the basis of their price, their willingness to engage during the contracting process and the positive testimonials from a range of tennis clubs.

While at the time of writing we haven't tied down the exact start date, we have targeted getting the work completed in time for the Datchworth League matches which start on April 17th.

You may be relieved to hear that, despite the choice of brightly coloured Tiger Turf surfaces on offer (though no spots as suggested by Mark last month) we are going all traditional, with a two-tone green which will look very smart and in keeping with the location adjacent to Upper Green. The courts will be out of action for around a week while the work takes place, and members will be kept informed of progress by email.

Finally, if the soles of your tennis shoes are looking rather polished and worn, now's the time to think about replacements to get the best out of the new courts.

BOWLS CLUB NEWS



Good day to you all, hopefully you have survived the worst of what our weather has had to throw at us over the last few months. The bowls green has held up remarkably well

through this period and is recovering from the Fusarium fungus which invaded the green in early winter.

Some of you might have noticed a tractor on the green one day at the beginning of the year; although this is a heavy piece of machinery it does not damage the green due to the oversized tyres spreading its weight. The reason for the tractor was that the green required deep spiking. This is where metal spikes are driven in to the ground to a depth of 30 cm to break up compacted soil below the 10cm level. This compacted layer is the result of years of maintaining as level a playing surface as possible by heavy rolling and of course the continuous to-ing and fro-ing of the player whilst bowling. This has resulted in areas of the green not draining properly, with the result that the water does not penetrate deep enough through the soil sub structure, preventing the grass from taking up much needed moisture, which is required to enable it to withstand the hot dry spells of weather we have been experiencing and resulting in large areas of dry brown grass, which not only look unsightly, but affect the running of the bowls.

It is hoped that with the normal spiking program, along with the deep spiking in January, this problem has been overcome.

The normal closed season activities have been continuing at the Bowls Club, Sunday Lunches, Quiz Nights, Carpet Bowls *Monday Night*, Art Class *Wednesday Morning*, Bridge Club *every other Thursday Afternoon*, and Table Tennis *Friday Nights*. The **Bar is Open** *Friday Nights and Sunday Lunch times*. You are welcome to pop in when any of these activities are taking place and you will be assured of a warm welcome.

There will be a Quiz Night in March, look out for the posters outside the Club House and in the Village Shop.

Another date for your diaries, May 27th to 29th, we will be holding our open weekend in conjunction with Bowls England, come along and try your hand at Green Bowls, bring your friends.
