#### **ELECTIONS - VOTER ID REQUIRED FOR 2023**

The UK Government has introduced a requirement for voters to show photo ID when voting at a polling station at elections. This new requirement will apply for the first time in England at the Local Elections on Thursday 4<sup>th</sup> May 2023. Which forms of ID can Luse to vote?

#### Which forms of ID can I use to vote?

You may already have a form of photo ID that is acceptable. You can use any of the following:

Passport, Driving Licence (incl provisional licence), Blue Badge, certain concessionary travel cards, Identity card with PASS mark (Proof of Age Standards Scheme), Biometric immigration document, Defence identity card, certain national identity cards.

NB: If you have a form of accepted ID that is out of date, you can still use it to vote at a polling station if it still looks like you.

**No ID:** If you don't already have an accepted form of photo ID, or you are not sure whether your photo ID still looks like you, you can apply for a free voter ID document, known as a Voter Authority Certificate. You can apply for this at www.gov.uk/apply-for-photo-id-voter-authority-certificate.

Application forms will be available online to download and print, or you can request a paper application form to be sent to you by the Electoral Services team at East Herts Council on 01279 655261.

**Deadline:** The deadline to apply for a Voter Authority Certificate for use at the elections in May 2023 is 5pm on Tuesday 25<sup>th</sup> April 2023.

#### **Outcome of the THACS Annual General Meeting**

The twenty-first *THACS* AGM was held in Tewin Memorial Hall on the evening of Monday 27<sup>th</sup> February 2023.

Previously, the three incumbent elected officers – me as Chairman, Malcolm Allen as Treasurer and Tina Lord as Secretary – had all declared our wish to stand down from our current roles at this AGM.

There were no new candidates for any of the elected officer roles at the AGM. Consequently, I am sorry to announce that the society is no longer viable in its present form. It will now be mothballed.

I was re-elected as Chairman and Malcolm Allen was re-elected as Treasurer, on the understanding that we would not be doing anything other than managing the mothballing project and supporting the skeleton committee with anything they wished to organise in the meantime.

Existing committee members Terry Brand and Lynne Burgess were reelected and newcomers Martin Taylor and Kristina Lawson were elected onto the committee.

These elections gave us the mandate needed for the mothballing project and will enable Malcolm and I to devote the time and effort to it, free from most of the usual responsibilities of Treasurer and Chairman. It also keeps a THACS committee ticking over, ready to run events and to welcome any newcomers.

#### **Our Farming Life**

As I said last month, we hope for an early Spring with warmth and soil temperatures warm enough to sow the peas. We have snowdrops, crocuses, and daffodils bursting into flower, the daylight hours are getting longer at a quickening pace, but the weather does not seem to have got the message, and we are about to head into a cold period. In early March, a morning was spent with our Agronomist walking all fields to see how they have come through the winter. It's good to see how the autumn herbicides have worked. We were quite concerned by how dry the land was. A recent article in a daily paper asked '*Has the 2023 Drought started*?' as we have just had the driest February for 30 years.

Most fields are clean of weeds, but one or two have cleavers and some brome grass on the headlands. Martyn has spread the Polysulphate over all crops, and also the first application of Urea. With the price of Nitrogen this season, I want to maintain yield and quality while lowering Nitrogen use. This is a hot topic in farming circles at the moment. I also want to lower my carbon footprint.

I can't see us sowing the peas until April, as we are in a cold snowy time.

#### Screen On The Green

On the 17<sup>th</sup> April we will be showing "*Laura*" (1944), a classic murder mystery produced and directed by the great Otto Preminger. It stars Gene Tierney, Dana Andrews and Clifton Webb with Vincent Price and Judith Anderson in supporting roles.

In one of the most celebrated 1940s film noirs, Manhattan detective Mark McPherson (Dana Andrews) investigates the murder of Madison Avenue executive Laura Hunt (Gene Tierney) in her fashionable apartment. On the trail of her murderer, McPherson quizzes Laura's best friend, gossip columnist Waldo Lydecker (Clifton Webb) and her comparatively mild fiancé, Shelby Carpenter (Vincent Price). As the detective grows obsessed with the case, he finds himself falling in love with the dead woman. It's a gripping tale of intrigue, suspense, passion and murder.

Laura received several Oscar nominations and won the award for Best Black and White Cinematography. It has been selected for preservation in the US National Film Registry as being "culturally, historically or aesthetically significant" and the American Film Institute named it one of the ten best mystery films of all time.

#### **Team Vicar's Letter**

In the last series of the BBC sitcom 'Rev', Adam Smallbone, vicar of St. Saviours in the Marshes, is having a breakdown. His faith, marriage and church are crumbling and it seems as if the world has turned against him. In a profoundly moving scene, Adam is pictured alone carrying the weight of a large wooden cross through the dark streets of London; people stare and spit. At the break of dawn he climbs a grassy hill which overlooks the highrise towers of the city. It is there he meets Christ.

There is no instant recognition. Christ, shaggy-haired in a shellsuit, can of lager in hand, is perhaps not what Adam was expecting, yet Christ it is. He dances with Adam in Adam's madness. He speaks in riddles which seem to make little wordly sense. Yet Adam remains trapped in his despair. A man who has spent so many years in prayer and learning, does not recognize God when they are face to face.

But finally there is a moment. When Christ touches Adam on the shoulder – and uses his name 'Adam' he says. It is in that second, that Adam knows who he meets.

When Mary Magdalene meets the risen Jesus in the garden, she too fails to recognize him at first. This was the man she loved and followed and yet in her deep despair and grief she is unable to see his presence. She assumes him to be the gardener. Yet Jesus speaks her name 'Mary', he says – and she immediately responds 'Lord'.

For Adam and for Mary, Jesus' calling them by name was strange enough. It is as if that one small word, spoken by Christ, shows an understanding of all the grief and sorrow, hopes and desires, ability and fragility of who they are. And through His knowledge of who they are, sparks their knowledge of who He is; deeply loving, determinedly life-giving, the one in whom our true identities are made known.

And so Adam and Mary, through their encounters with the Risen Christ, experience their own resurrections. As the sun begins its slow climb which lightens the sky, so too Adam and Mary begin to move from their night into a new day.

The Risen Christ may not always look as we were expecting, but he calls each one of us by name. In doing so he shows us to be fully known and fully loved. This is where our own resurrections begin, where dawn breaks through and new life emerges.

We have had three very cold months to start this year, but at least we have been blessed with the usual sight of snowdrops in the churchyard and drive. If you are reading this before the end of March, I hope you will have time to come to the church Open Day on 1<sup>st</sup> April between 10am and 4pm at Tewin Memorial Hall to view the initial plans for our new meeting room. This will be a single storey annexe on the south side of the church, with space for forty people to sit comfortably, a kitchen, two lavatories, including one for wheelchair users and baby changing facilities, plus extra essential storage. We need somewhere warm and comfortable for Sunday School, after church coffee, and to meet and greet visitors to baptisms, weddings, and funerals, who often drive long distances for such special events. During March we have been enjoying the brightness in the church from our new LED lighting. Apart from being able to read the hymns and service sheets better, the whole place seems to sparkle. And this is before we do the great Spring Clean which is happening on Friday 12th and Saturday 13th May. We need as many folk as can come along for just an hour or two on Friday evening to move furniture, and to lend a hand at dusting, scrubbing, and polishing the church on Saturday please. Please sign the sheet at the back of the church or just turn up. It is a convivial experience, and you will be doing your good deed for the day!

Our Lent course this year has focused on the Psalms which celebrate the stories of creation, the flight of the Israelites from Egypt through the desert to the promised land, and the city of Jerusalem. Sharing soup and a roll with friends once a week to discuss these joyful words has been illuminating and jolly. Thank you to Edward and Mick for leading these sessions. Thank you also to those who put together the posies for our lovely Mothering Sunday service, always well attended and much appreciated. Susannah has been away for a couple of weeks this month partly on retreat, to give her a chance to recharge her batteries. Many people have stressful lives and occupations, and our clergy are definitely included in that group.

Now we look forward to Easter, one of the most important times in the Christian calendar, beginning with **Palm Sunday on 2<sup>nd</sup> April at 9.30am**, when we shall start our service outside with the reading of Jesus' entry into Jerusalem. Later during Holy week at St Peter's, there will be a special service on **Good Friday at Noon** with the Stations of the Cross, and on **Easter Day** we are invited to a **Family Communion service at 9.30am**.

On Easter Saturday our usual Easter Crafts and Egg Hunt will be taking place at the church from 2 – 4pm. Our young folk have always enjoyed this in the past. It has been so good to get back to doing things we enjoyed before Covid and this month also we have noticed friends coming back to church who have been shielding for many months but now feel able to return to worship with us. Welcome back!!

Mid-month on Sunday 16<sup>th</sup> April, there will be no Evening Service at St Peter's. Instead, our choristers will be participating in Don Gilthorpe's Jazz Mass Brevis at St Mary's Welwyn at 6.30pm. This will be preceded by a practice session in the afternoon from 3pm and anyone who would like to sing is welcome to come along. Singers will be charged £10 to help cover the cost of the professional singers and musicians accompanying the sessions. There are no tickets for the service, but people will be invited to make a donation to charity at the end.

#### **Tewin Tennis Club**



I have just watched Jack Draper beating Andy Murray at Indian Wells. This tournament is, according to Netflix at least, a major

precursor of the season, so wins here, no matter how hard fought, really mean something.

Draper is just 21 but plays like a future star, and may well challenge Cameron Norrie for the top spot in British tennis. It would be nice to think we will get more players his age playing at Tewin Tennis Club. Maybe we will, for our new courts are about to be laid and, with a minimum of rain and a following wind, we could be in action by Easter.

The courts, in case you have been on the moon and missed the earlier news, are Tiger Turf, a type of artificial grass. Putting this down is straightforward. We will have some small cement edges built around the courts, then the turf is dropped straight onto the existing Tarmac following a pressure wash.

The project is taking place a year or two earlier than if we had simply renewed the Tarmac, the advantage being the surface is still sound enough to take the Tiger Turf without any significant repair.

The lines are actually more Tiger Turf, only white and cut into the court surface. Sand is then brushed over to stabilise and weigh the material down. We are told for a few weeks it may feel a bit sandy underfoot, but this will quickly reduce, unlike the old-school artificial grass.

We are cautiously optimistic we will be ready for the Datchworth League tennis tournament which starts on April 17. Tewin enters either three or four teams, each comprising two men and a lady, for these friendly Monday night matches. There's a rota system that ensures everyone who wants to play competitive tennis gets a few matches through the season. Do drop along to the courts on a Monday evening from 6.30pm, have a chat and watch some tennis.

Finally, apologies to those affected by possible disruption around the new courts being laid, even though we are assured the main issue seems to be that car park space will be compromised for around ten days. We hope it isn't too serious a problem.

#### **Integrated Care Strategy**

A new plan to create a healthier Hertfordshire and West Essex has been launched with a new explanatory video and user-friendly online booklet.

The NHS, councils, the police and the many groups and charities serving 1.6 million people in our area are working together to create healthier communities where everyone can thrive, and the plan was formally agreed in December by the board of the new Integrated Care Partnership.

There's a fantastic three-minute animation, as well as a booklet explaining how voluntary and community groups, councils, the police, Healthwatch, social care providers and NHS organisations plan to work together to make Hertfordshire and West Essex a healthier place to live and work.

- $\cdot$  improve our residents' mental health and outcomes for those with learning disabilities and autism.
