PROOF OF ADDRESS REQUIRED AT HERTS RECYCLING CENTRES

Going forward Hertfordshire and Essex residents only will be able to use recycling centres in Hertfordshire thanks to a reciprocal agreement with Essex County Council. Residents wishing to use recycling centres

will need to bring proof of address such as driving licence, Council tax bill or utility bill which shows they live in Hertfordshire or Essex. There will be a grace period of several weeks,

Are you a Landowner/Organisation who is looking to help tackle the climate crisis and improve nature through tree and hedgerow planting ?

Herts County Council has been awarded £150,000 from the Government's Woodland Creation Accelerator Fund, and as a result now have two dedicated Woodland Creation Officers. These Officers can help with all aspects of tree and hedgerow planting including advice and guidance on planning, applying for grant funding and managing and supporting planting projects.

Herts County Council's <u>ambition is to establish 1.8m trees across Hert-fordshire by 2030</u>, as well as <u>enhancing nature on their own land by 20%</u> by 2030.

Our Farming Life

After a long winter, farmers look forward to the Spring Equinox at the end of March when we have equal hours of day and night. From then on the crops seem to wake up as we have more daylight than darkness, the soil temperatures pick up, and the crops seem to start growing. We have had almost 3 wet weeks, during March, which has curtailed certain jobs to do on the fields, which are now very wet.

Luckily over the Easter weekend, the soil dried out enough to put the Unipress over the pea fields. The soil crumbled down, perfect for sowing the peas, which took place on Saturday the 8th of April, as rain was forecast for the Monday. I will now have to spray the soil with a pea herbicide to control weeds, we do not want weeds to choke the peas.

Our Winter Wheat is going through its growth stages. It has now had its 1st Fungicide Spray, at growth stage 30, for Septoria control (very important) and a growth regulator to strengthen the stem.

We are planning to sow a few acres of wild bird mix, and nectar mix on some field edges, also some maize for the shoot, and 5 acres of Sunflowers during the next month.

The last of our 2022 Harvest is about to leave our store having been sold to a Farm Trading Company called North Herts Farmers Grain. Other Grain Trading companies I trade with are Frederic Smart,

Viterra and G B Seeds, the company we grow crops like my naked oats and peas for on contract. Growing on contract means that we then know we have a guaranteed buyer.

I hope the rain will soon stop and I can get on with my land work.

Wow, another incredible season!

Once again our two teams entered in the St Albans, Hatfield and Welwyn Table Tennis League have enjoyed a very successful season so far and with perhaps more success to follow before the season comes to a close.

Screen On The Green

On the 15th May we will be showing "*Little Women*", a modern version from 2019 written and directed by Greta Gerwig. It is the seventh film adaptation of the famous novel by Louisa May Alcott and follows the lives of the March sisters, Meg, Jo, Beth and Amy in 19th century America. It's a contemporary take on a beloved classic bringing a different perspective without losing the magic of the original novel.

With an ensemble cast including Saoirse Ronan, Emma Watson, Florence Pugh, Timothee Chalamet, Meryl Streep and James Norton the film received critical acclaim collecting six Oscar nominations, five British Film Academy nominations and two Golden Globe nominations.

Of particular note are the award winning costume designs by Jacqueline Durran, the film requiring roughly seventy five period costumes each taking about forty hours to create. French composer Alexandre Duplat composed the musical score saying that he had been asked by the director to provide music that was "*a mix of Mozart meeting Bowie*".

OPEN DAY FOR ST PETER'S NEW MEETING ROOM

The church held a second consultation day on 1^{st} April to share with the village some initial ideas about our new meeting room. The posters we had shown in November were displayed yet again and we gave two very well attended presentations each followed by a Q & A session.

Linda Gilley, one of the Churchwardens, showed how the church has undergone many changes over the past thousand years that it has stood on a hill above the River Mimram near Tewin Bury. At first the wooden church was a small chancel and nave, rebuilt in stone by the Normans. In the medieval period the South Aisle was added with three pillars. The clock tower was constructed in the 17th century and the clock, and five bells added after that. At the end of the 19th century we had new pews, pulpit, candelabra, and boiler installed. There was no electricity until 1953 and no WC or water taps inside the church until the 1980s. At that time the congregation began to think about building a new meeting room for the church and since then the matter has already been considered twice more.

Our vicar, the Rev'd Susannah Underwood, then spoke about the needs for the church now. We want to bring it into the 21^{st} century and provide a safe space for people of all ages with plenty of storage, an accessible space for those with mobility problems and for baby changing, a welcoming space for visitors and congregation alike, and an inspiring space for all who come to worship or to celebrate a life, a wedding, a new-born. Yasmin Shariff, our architect took us through the initial ideas that her team have put together. We were able to see a model of the proposals and a video which allowed us to walk around the space. The proposal is for us to have a meeting room 10 x 10m, with a kitchen close by on the Southwest corner of the church, with a separate toilet block situated on the other side of the South Porch. The meeting room would be large enough to seat about forty people. To demonstrate the size of the proposed room and to compare it with other church rooms we have visited recently, we laid tapes across the floor showing the relative sizes. All the churches we have seen have regretted making their rooms too small.

Questions ranged over the possible costs of building (which it is impossible to estimate until we have a definite design), the size of the room proposed, possible security issues and vandalism, and the position of the room in relation to the existing church. Refreshments were served throughout the day by our bell ringers who had some interesting comments to make as they visit a lot of other churches.

Everyone was then invited to give their comments on Post-it notes and to attach them to a flip chart. We were keen to show that nothing was yet agreed. This is a starting point to help us reach a final design, and we really valued the comments we received.

Overall, the response was very positive from both members of the congregation and others who love the church but are not churchgoers. The Steering Group will now work with the Diocesan Advisory Committee, and our architect, taking into account the comments from the village and the Parochial Church Council, to come up with a design that we are happy with and will be acceptable to most people. We will then hold another Open Day to consult once again with the village. Linda Gilley

Team Vicar's Letter

May Day is the ancient festival celebrated the start of summer which is often celebrated with the crowning of a May Queen. The children from our school will be marking it again with their maypole dancing – but this year May will have the added celebration of the coronation of King Charles III and the Queen Consort Camilla on the slightly later date of the 6^{th} May.

This coronation is the first opportunity for many of us to witness this ancient ceremony. Using the oil of Chrism pressed from Olives from the Mount of Olives in Jerusalem, the Archbishop of Canterbury will perform the anointing, a duty which has been undertaken by the post since 1066. It seems fitting that the new King will be anointed with fruits of the earth he has been campaigning to protect for over 50 years. We shall then become a nation of pomp and parties with bunting, plonk and cake aplenty.

On Sunday 7th May there will be two special church services to mark the occasion of the coronation. 9:30am at St Peter's will be a celebratory Eucharist followed by fizz and cake. At noon, the village celebrations on Lower Green, organised by the fabulous Friends of Tewin, will begin with a less formal, flag waving outdoor service, in which we are hoped to be joined by children of Tewin Cowper who will sing the specially commissioned Coronation song.

King Charles is also encouraging neighbours to get together that weekend, and particularly think of the Bank Holiday Monday as a day to offer in service of another.

A prayer for the King

Almighty God, the fountain of all goodness, bless our Sovereign Lord, King Charles, and all who are in authority under him; that they may order all things in wisdom and equity, righteousness and peace, to the honour of your name, and the good of your Church and people; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

St Peter's News

A church at the heart of the village, with space for all

Easter is one of the most important dates in the Christian calendar. This year it coincided with celebrations for the Jewish Passover and Muslim Ramadan, and this was no more obvious this year than in Jerusalem where all three Abrahamic faiths have sacred places. Here in Tewin, life was quieter with a moving service on Palm Sunday where we began our worship outside, with a blessing of the Palm Crosses. Later, members of the congregation enacted the Passion according to St Matthew.

Over Easter itself, we were pleased to welcome folk from Datchworth and Welwyn churches, as well as our own congregation, to The Stations of the Cross service at noon on Good Friday. This is an opportunity for quiet contemplation and reflection. In complete contrast, on Saturday the churchyard and church were full of lively children making our Easter garden, colouring in panels for a stained glass window, and hunting for Easter eggs. Thank goodness we had some good weather for once. Easter Sunday was well attended with Susannah leading our celebrations. Thank you to our wonderful flower arrangers for the amazing display of flowers in the church over Easter.

On 16th April members of our choir joined those from other churches in the Welwyn team at the evening service to sing **Don Gilthorpe's Jazz Mass Brevis at St Mary's Welwyn.** This was something that the Rector and Susannah had wanted to do for some time since they attended the Hertford Choral Society's (HCS) performance of this last summer. Thank you to Sabine Stanley from the SAVoce choir, who rehearse at St Peter's, and who sings with Tewin church choir. She helped with all the arrangements for what was a wonderful experience.

We held a second consultation with the village for our proposed new meeting room at St Peter's on 1^{st} April. This was very well attended and there were many comments about the initial design. A full report about this is elsewhere in the magazine and on the village website.

Here is a further reminder that the church is undergoing its first great **Spring Clean** for three years on **Friday 12th and Saturday 13th May**. We need as many strong folk as can come along for just an hour or two on **Friday evening at 6.30pm to move furniture and at 12.30 on Saturday to put it back.** We need men and women to lend a hand at **dusting, scrubbing, and polishing the church on Saturday from 9.am** please. Please sign the sheet at the back of the church or just turn up. Your help will be very much appreciated.

Also in May, our bellringers will be ringing the bells for **the Coronation**. We shall be flying our new Union Jack flag. On **Sunday** 7th **May** there will be a normal Holy Communion service at 9.30am, followed by a short **Open Air service of Thanksgiving for the Coronation at 12 noon** on Lower Green, before the fun afternoon planned by the Friends of Tewin begins.

On Sunday 14th May we shall hold the Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM) for the church at 10.45am, after our 9.30am Service of Holy Communion. This is a brief meeting which all are welcome to attend.

Tewin Tennis Club



Well, the construction of the new tennis playing surface all went rather well and despite some disruption from rain, our contractors managed to finish up within two weeks. By Good Friday the first

players were down there finding out just what we'd bought into.

I think I am right in saying that Bert and Cheryl Robinson must have been the first to set foot on our Tiger Turf, and they reported most positively about the experience. Since then the courts have been buzzing. The surfaces will take time to play in, and for now there is an excess of sand which will work its way into the fabric and largely disappear.

We ask that you wear proper *clean* tennis shoes - dirt is the enemy of the Turf. We've also placed the excess Tiger Turf at the back of the practice court with the hope we might be able to join it up to make a new surface there too.

To celebrate, the Tennis Club is having an Open Day on Sunday 30 April for everyone in the village, not just members. There will be tea and cakes, sessions for adults to dip into from 1pm until 5pm, and from 3pm coach Josh will be giving some taster lessons for juniors. Please do come down, meet the players and the committee and hit some balls. Tewin Tennis Club is for local people, and within that constraint we are keen to broaden our membership as widely as possible.

If you want more than just a friendly game, competitive team tennis has already started for the season. In mid-April the Datchworth league kicked off very enjoyable Monday evening matches against village clubs throughout Hertfordshire.

Our Summer Alphabet ABC-League starts on 19th May. It will run on Friday evenings, 7pm from early May through the end of July and we hope, as always, to see wide participation. We have reduced the number of teams to 4 this year, added some 'spare' weeks to assist with rearrangements and also introduced a few more mixed games.
