#### **Our Farming Life**

As I write these notes in mid May, the crops are racing through their growth stages and the forward wheat crops are showing the Flag Leaf, which is the major leaf on a stem of wheat. We have to keep it clean and healthy from any major diseases as it feeds the ear which is growing through the stem. Our peas have chitted and are now showing in rows and growing well. Now we just have to keep the pigeons & rooks away as they love the young leaves.

We have a deadline of the 15th of May every year, to make our farming returns to the Rural Payments Agency or DEFRA, a Government Department which wants to know everything about my farm in order for me to claim a subsidy payment. Every field is digitally mapped and the exact size expressed in Hectares, and numbered. We also have to provide details of what crop is growing in each field. I employ an agent to work with me to do the returns as it seems to get more complicated, and I get less payments each year. My farm has a holding number, also an SBI number, or a Single Business Identifier. Last autumn we took on some land at Cole Green. It's been a major problem to get the land transferred, to me and the Entitlements by the 15th of May deadline ... a big headache for me and my agent.

It was lovely to see the bunting up on the Village Green, for the Coronation, and what a lovely 'Picnic on the Green'. I've never seen so many families enjoying themselves.

As you know I talk a lot about the weather, too dry, too wet, too hot, too cold, but those thunderstorms of the 9th of May were unreal. I have never seen such a downpour of rain, flooding and waterlogged fields and roads. And how strange that by the next day the water had drained away. If it was not for the grit and stones on the roads no-one would have known we had it.





#### **Team Vicar's Letter**

A few years ago, a past churchwarden of St Peter's Tewin attempted to teach me how to knit. Her patience proved to be saintly, and as a result I produced with a childlike pride some rather wonky bunting, a blanket that falls apart from time to time and a snood where I have learned to hide the mistakes in the pattern at the back of my neck.

Knitting, crochet, cross-stitch – all of these are ancient crafts which even in the era of YouTube tutorials are skills often best transferred from one generation to another or in the social space of groups such as Knit and Natter (or Stitch and Bitch which met for a while in the shop). In recent years Guerilla knitting has really taken off. Described as 'Damage-free graffiti for a softer and more cuddly urban environment', neighbourhoods find themselves transformed overnight with railings, post boxes and trees covered in creative crochet or knitted wonders. Datchworth WI turned guerrilla last year as the old telephone box was transformed for the Jubilee. And it's been good to hear of further plans in this village to bring life and joy to our surroundings with some new creatives coming together.

A special exhibition is coming early next month to St Peter's Tewin. The Knitted Bible was created in a Hartlepool church some years ago, when a bunch of knitters got carried away and couldn't stop. As well as the usual knitted nativity scene, they created over thirty knitted biblical scenes from Adam and Eve, to Jonah and the Whale, the feeding of the five thousand to the crucifixion and resurrection.

It is amazing, and travels all over the country and we are fortunate enough that it will be displayed at St Peter's on Saturday 1<sup>st</sup> and Sunday 2<sup>nd</sup> July. Other people nifty with a needle connected with our churches are also being celebrated. This time it is those who created the beautiful kneelers inside St Peter's Church. Following a short BBC documentary in 2019, their work is now being displayed in a new book 'Kneelers: The unsung folk art of England and Wales' by Elizabeth Bingham. You can look at the book (and indeed the kneelers) in St Peter's.

'You knit me together in my mother's womb' says Psalm 139. I love this tender picture of the work of God creating us with patience and skill. Stitch by stitch. It is a task, I think, that is never finished but rather one where God is continuously picking up the rogue threads that we drop and creating new patterns in our lives, so that which seems dark and not of our choosing is woven into something where in time we can see beauty. God the divine knitter.

'I thank you for I am beautifully and wonderfully made. Marvellous are your works, my soul knows well' Psalm 139:14.
