Our Farming Life

It seems as if I have to spend more and more time in the Farm Office than ever before, paper work and more paper work. Thank goodness for my Ipad and e-mails.

I want to be out in my fields and not in the office.

By the time you read these notes it will be July and Harvest will be getting near. I have a lady to do the grain audit. Appointed by the Red Tractor to maintain farming standards, she needs to see the paper work and records when each field is sown and fertiliser applied. She also needs to see my spray reports which state the weather of the day, temperature, wind direction and whether the field is near a water course. The grain barn is inspected also. All this needs to be done in order for me to get the yellow stickers which leave with every lorry of grain. The mills or docks or end users will not accept the load without it. Now today another e-mail, from DEFRA asking how much grain have I got left in my store.

Harvest prospects look quite good at the moment, but out in my sprayer this morning at 6am to beat the heat I have noticed the gravel parts of fields showing serious signs of drought stress. Not Good! As a result of 5 very dry weeks without rain at the most important time of the year for growing crops.

Common sense has prevailed with regard to my Dog Walkies Field off Churchfield Road and we have got planning permission for the site to continue.

We have also got planning permission for a new farm barn, to be built in the 7 acre field we bought 2 years ago, opposite the entrance to Muspatts Farm.

Your Tree Our Future Returns For a Second Year

Hertfordshire's free tree giveaway is back for 2023, after over 4,000 residents claimed 46,000 trees in the first year of the scheme.

You can now apply for up to five free trees on the Your Tree Our Future webpage. https://tinyurl.com/Your-Tree-Our-Future

Like last year, you can choose from up to eight different species of trees, specially selected to suit Hertfordshire's geography and climate, or a hedgerow pack, made up of a mixture of species. There are a limited number of each species and they are given away on a first-comefirst-served basis, so act quickly if you have specific trees in mind.

Once you've applied, you'll receive an email confirmation of your order within a day or two, although this may take slightly longer if you apply over the weekend

Team Vicar's Letter

This time last year the Welwyn Team of churches welcomed our BO-GOF (Buy One Get One Free) curates, The Rev'ds Christie and Ryan Gilfeather. Having been ordained as deacon last year, this year they will be ordained priest by the Bishop of Hertford at a special service 10am 2nd July at St Mary's Welwyn. All are welcome to attend this service – especially as there will be no services at Tewin and Datchworth that Sunday.

Once priested Ryan and Christie will be able to offer to people those things the church refers to as sacraments. Sacraments are specific gifts of God's grace, made tangible. They will be able to offer absolution, the confirmation of God's forgiveness for those weighed down with guilt and shame. They will be able to conduct baptisms, where through water and the Holy Spirit people of all ages begin a new journey with Christ. They will be able conduct weddings and celebrate with couples whose love for each other has the potential to mirror something of the love God has for each one of us. They will be able to bless people, to give them assurance of God's favour and presence. They will be able to preside at the altar where the words of Jesus are recalled as bread is blessed and broken, and the spiritually hungry are fed.

As Michael Ramsay, a past Archbishop phrased it, priesthood is being with God for the people, and being with the people for God.

But the words of the service for the ordination service also express the role of the priest as this:

With all God's people, they are to tell the story of God's love. And as that expresses, that is a task common to all Christians in everything we do – in our words, actions and relationships – to tell the story of God's love. Because in the end, that is the only thing that makes the church worth serving. It is love that draws us into church and love that sends us out.

St Peter's News

A church at the heart of the village, with space for all

How wonderful to see some flaming sun in flaming June; the winter was so long and the weather so cold and wet. It is lovely to see old friends returning to regular church services now the weather is warmer. The weddings held at St Peter's in May and June have been blessed with lovely weather. We wish all our newly married couples much luck and happiness in their new lives together.

Earlier this year the clock was removed for repair and, when it was restored, we had a new auto winder fitted to the clock. This means that, in time, we will not require David Hall, the Captain of the Bell tower to climb up and wind the clock each week. However, for the time being he has had to continue to do so as we have been waiting for a pendulum regulator to also be fitted to ensure the clock keeps good time. This has now been done. Hallelujah! Nothing we do in the church is done in an instant. Thank you to David for his stalwart work on winding the clock for so many years.

You may have heard the bells ringing recently at times when you don't expect to hear them and sometimes a little inexpertly! This is because our bellringers have recently been training new ringers here at Tewin. The country is short of bellringers, and they often have to rush from church to church to ring for services, so please bear with them as they increase the trained bellringers in the population.

In June we held our last Family Service for the time being, with Choral Evensong in the evening. In July we are changing our pattern of services for the 3rd Sunday in the month. As a pilot for six months, instead of Family Service at 11.15am, we will have Morning Prayers at 9.30am and in the afternoon at 3 – 4.30pm we are starting Messy Church for young people of all ages. There will be a programme of arts and crafts, finding nature in the church yard sometimes, followed by a short bible story and a bite to eat. We hope

parents and children might find this enjoyable and easier to attend, given that so many play sport on a Sunday morning. The Service in the evening of the 3rd Sunday will alternate between Holy Communion and Evensong.

On 25th June we celebrated Petertide with a Holy Communion service that was streamed. We are still streaming a service from one of the Welwyn Team churches every week – see the Welwyn team website for details of this. www.welwyn.org.uk/onlinechurch.

The church will be open on the 1st and 2nd July for the exhibition of The Knitted Bible, thirty-five bible story scenes which we hope you will come along to see. There will be no service at St Peter's that weekend as we shall be supporting our curates, Ryan, and Christie Gilfeather, who are being priested at St Mary's Welwyn at 10am on 2nd July.

Later in the month **Summer Evensong** will take place at one church in the Welwyn team each Sunday until the end of August.

Do you know what happens at Danesbury Neurological Centre and the Queen Victoria Memorial Hospital, School Lane?

Both are well known in the local and wider community but what services do they offer?

Danesbury Neurological Centre was originally called The Danesbury Home. Originally it provided a home for residents of all ages who needed full time care. In 1993 a Danesbury appeal was launched in Welwyn to provide funding for the current building in School Lane, Welwyn. Today the centre caters for both in-patients and out-patients who have a range of neurological problems. The medical team include Physiotherapists, Psychologists, Speech Therapists, Dieticians, Occupational therapists and Specialist Parkinson's and MS nurses.

Built in 1902 QVM hospital was a community hospital serving Welwyn, Codicote and Digswell. Now it cares for patients who need rehabilitation following a stay in an acute hospital, particularly Lister Hospital, Stevenage.

Both hospitals are part of the of the Herts Community NHS Trust who are responsible for much of the county and in today's financial climate is obliged to juggle its resources between various sites.

The Trustees consider everything that can impact both our in-patients and out-patients well-being and how we can benefit them with the charitable funds, and we have to ensure that they are used properly to support the patients.

With our supporters' help the Friends are privileged to be able to fund some of this wonderful care provided by both hospitals.
