A Stop And Go Harvest

At this date, the 14th of August, we have not quite finished harvesting but will update you all in next month's news. This month's news is what happened on just one day.

Harvest is the most dominant feature of my year, the culmination of a year's work, and this is my 65th Harvest. Unbelievable!

So this is what happened on Saturday 29th of July 2023.

Meet Martyn in our yard and discuss the day's weather forecast, which is always on our mind. We have weather Apps on our phones, which text us when rain or showers are about to hit us. Today's forecast is that a heavy shower will hit us about 12 o'clock. We have about 12 acres of peas left to combine or harvest. Some are in the Churchfield and 5 acres are in the small field by the Old Fish Farm. The peas are damp from the rain the night before. They will have to be dried over the drying floor in the Grain Barn. We just finish them as the heavens open and another heavy shower falls. Not what we wanted. Packed up all the equipment - combine, header, tractors and trailers, and moved back to Muspatts Farm. Linda brought us lunch, which we ate in the yard. The rain stopped soon after. Our peas now are all harvested and on the drying floor. Then the sun came out! Now to get the combine ready for the wheat. We will have to take off the side knives, change the knife, change belt speeds and make other alterations on the harvester to get it ready for 350 acres of wheat. Finished our jobs by 5pm then decided to look at the 50 acres of Skyfall wheat on Upper Prairie Field, by Dawley Wood. Could not believe the crop was dry and the rain earlier in the day had not reached that field. Started harvesting the wheat with the moisture at 15% / 16%, just perfect. I dragged my brother, Vaughan, to the corn cart as we need 2 tractors and trailers to keep the combine flowing. The field looks full of wheat and what a lovely evening it was, one of those rare ones when it did not get damp and there was no dew. The crop just flowed through the combine. Martyn, operating the combine, said 'I want to work late tonight!'. Brother Vaughan carting to the store, Ivor as yard man, tipping the trailers and pushing up the wheat to the level required.

A huge cloud of dust followed the combine. We just kept going as we were all hyped up and by 3am we had finished the 50 acres and had approximately 200 tons of dry wheat in the barn. What a day. Ivor Williams.

Herts and Middlesex Wildlife Trust: Archers Green Nature Reserve Update

A big thank you to everyone who came along to the Archers Green Information Evening on 10^{th} June at Tewin Memorial Hall.

You may have noticed that the Trust's contractors have been busy installing new livestock fencing at the Poplars Green end of the new nature reserve. This piece of work has been made possible by a grant from Affinity Water which is ring-fenced for a programme of practical work to replace and establish vital infrastructure at the site.

Cattle grazing will be key to the conservation management of the grassland habitat and the new fencing will enable the Trust to get cattle on site in the coming weeks.

The Trust has also been able to create a new footpath route around the edge of the meadow which allows safer access for walkers, linking the track over the bridge through to the B1000 (coming out near to Mimram Kennels). You can find out more about this wonderful new nature reserve and what

Newly Upgraded Section Of A602 Between Watton-At-Stone And Tonwell Now Open

The newly upgraded section of the A602 between Watton-at-Stone and Tonwell was opened to traffic on Monday 7 August, bringing this important link between the A1(M) at Stevenage and the A10 at Ware up to modern highway standards, reducing delays and improving journey times.

The new section of road, which replaces the previous A602 carriageway, has been realigned to smooth out sharp bends, improve visibility, and create right-turn lanes at junctions to reduce delays caused by vehicles turning off the road.

A new bridge has also been constructed at the Sacombe Pound junction with a new cycleway to allow cyclists and pedestrians to cross safely under the A602.

This is the final stage of improvements on the A602 between Ware and Stevenage, following previously completed works to improve the roundabouts at the A119 and A10 junctions, and the junctions with Anchor Lane, Westmill Road and Hertford Road.

Landscaping work is continuing along the route and the new cycle track between Sacombe Pound and Stoney Hills, which is being constructed as part of the improvement project, is due to open next month.

The A602 Improvements have been funded by a £20m Local Growth Fund investment from Hertfordshire LEP and funding from Hertfordshire County Council.

The A602 improvements have been delivered by construction contractor, Tilbury Douglas.

Team Vicar's Letter

There are some special places dotted around the UK that cater for care of the soul. Christian retreat houses come in various shapes and sizes. Some are run by religious communities – monks and nuns who invite you in for tender care, prayer and then roll up their sleeves and cook you dinner. Some are run by chaplains and professional catering teams. Some are in large ramshackle buildings with acres of gardens to explore. Some are tucked into the centre of our cities, tiny havens for the spirit to rest from the world outside. They are places that run programmes you can join in – worship, teaching, often art and creative days and weekends. But they are also places which you can go to simply 'be' and there is no pressure to do a thing. Retreat houses often offer spiritual guidance for people seeking that, or will leave you in silence if you prefer. They are, in my experience, small pockets of heaven.

You don't need to be a practising Christian to go to one. In fact my atheist friend goes away to a retreat house every year for space to complete some of her academic work – and comes back renewed and refreshed by its atmosphere of quietness and kindness.

If you'd like to explore this more then retreats.org.uk is a good place to start – or indeed come away to the warm and beautiful retreat house in Pleshey Essex, Tue 24th-Thur 26th of October, with a bunch of us from the Welwyn Team of churches. Our curate Christie Gilfeather will be leading worship and short reflections each day. There will be time for company and chat, but also opportunities for quiet and rest if you'd like. £224 per person full board in an ensuite room. St Peter's News

A church at the heart of the village, with space for all

We do not seem to have had much of a summer here in the UK, whilst it has been extremely hot elsewhere in the world. I guess we should count ourselves lucky that our houses are not burnt to a cinder and our countryside and animals are not at risk. It is sad for people who have looked forward to a holiday in a warm place only to find it is spoilt by the extreme weather conditions. By the time you read this I shall be off on a caravan trip to the Cotswolds where I expect it will rain as it has done for much of July and August, but at least it will be a break. We began Messy Church at St Peter's in July and are continuing to do so from 3pm every third Sunday afternoon in the month until Christmas. It is an opportunity for all the family and all ages to do church in a different way and is becoming popular in many other places of worship. We were pleased to welcome several families in July who enjoyed watching out for the insects and birds around the churchyard and to be told about the bats and owls who live there. The theme for the first session was "Creation" and the children helped with a banner which was put up behind the Altar and a prayer tree on the South Altar. After all the excitement outside, they listened to the dramatised parable of the sower and shared fruit kebabs.

The theme for August was "The Water of Life" and those for the rest of the year will be "Harvest Celebration " on 17th September, "The Light of the World" on 15th October and "Remember Me" on 19th November. Our Summer Evensongs have continued throughout August at each of the churches in the Welwyn team in turn, with Tewin being last on 27th August. This is a good way of seeing all the other churches which all have their own characteristics and interesting artifacts. This year the theme has been *Masterpieces of Religious Art* and we have been delighted to welcome several outside speakers as well as some of our own members of the team to preach on some important works of art. At the time of writing, we have so far heard about how St Francis of Assisi came to found his order of Franciscan Friars after he came upon a ruined church containing the San Damiano Cross and we have looked in detail at the statue of Mary seated with the body of her Son, as sculpted by Michelangelo in his *Pieta*. Other topics have included *The Prodigal Son* by Rembrandt, Stanley Spencer's picture of *The Resurrection at Cookham, The Annunciation* by Fra Angelico and *The Supper at Emmaus* by Caravaggio. It is always so exciting to get a different perspective on a work of art which may or not be familiar to oneself. Singers from across the Welwyn team have also enjoyed forming scratch choirs for the Summer Evensongs, led by the Rector David Munchin.

Imagine our amazement to find that many of the Tewin kneelers have featured in a Sunday Times review of a new book about the tradition of English and Welsh Hassocks entitled "*Kneelers : The Unsung Folk Art of England and Wales*". A copy of the article is in the church as is a copy of the book. The article has resulted in regular visitors to the churchyard actually entering the church to see the kneelers! Plus, members of the congregation, including me, receiving emails from friends across the world getting in touch. Tewin is famous! Well, we knew that didn't we?

In September we shall be celebrating Harvest at the church on Sunday 24th September at 9.30am, not on Lower Green as we have done in recent years. We look forward to the church being beautifully decorated with flowers. If you would like to bring tinned or dried goods to the church, these will be taken to the local food bank.


