British Summer Time

British Summer Time (BST) is the practice of advancing the clocks by one hour in the UK during summer in an attempt to make better use of the daylight hours, reduce energy consumption, and improve health and well-being. BST was first introduced by the Summer Time Act 1916, following a campaign by builder William Willett but sadly he died before seeing his idea implemented.

Since 22nd October 1995 BST begins at 1am on the last Sunday of March and ends at 2am on the last Sunday of October, in sync with the EU. During the Second World War, the UK used **British Double Summer Time** (**BDST**), which was two hours ahead of GMT.

Campaigners, including RoSPA (the Royal Society for the Prevention of Accidents) and environmental campaigners, 10:10, have made recommendations that British Summer Time be maintained during the winter months, and that a "double summertime" be applied to the current British Summer Time period, putting the UK one hour ahead of GMT during winter, and two hours ahead during summer. These proposals are opposed by many residents of Scotland and Northern Ireland as it would mean that in northern Britain and Northern Ireland the winter sunrise would not occur until 10am or even later. It would also put Northern and Southern Ireland in different time zones.

Screen On The Green

On Monday 16th October we will be showing "*The Lost King*" (2022). It tells the true story of Philippa Langley, an amateur historian who defies the academic establishments in her efforts to find the remains of King Richard III that were lost for 500 years.

Directed by Stephen Frears with Sally Hawkins in the lead role and Steve Coogan as her estranged husband, it's a fascinating tale that made headline news at the time. There has been controversy over the depiction of the academic archaeologists in the film but it makes for an entertaining story of resilience and faith with some interesting revelations about Richard III.

Royal British Legion Poppy Appeal 2023

Remembrance Sunday this year is on the 12th November, and prior to that volunteers will be out doing house to house collections.

As usual, we will be asking local enterprises to have counter top collections. St Peter's Church and Tewin Cowper School are also involved.

Last year we raised a total of £2,639.

Society is becoming increasingly cashless, which makes life difficult for the traditional collecting tin. The Poppy Appeal has been issuing cashless terminals, but out of over 4,500 issued last year, over 1,000 did not raise enough donations to cover their cost. This year I have only received one cashless terminal, which will make it difficult to share it amongst a dozen collectors. Last year, cash made up 87% of the national total of the Poppy Appeal. It would help if you have some cash handy.

Everything that we collect is delivered to the Royal British Legion. All the local people involved with the appeal are unpaid volunteers.

Team Vicar's Letter

This year I'm growing pumpkins. Giant ones. Purely for pleasure. There is something immensely satisfying about watching the crawling tendrils of the plant extend beyond the veg patch border and lay their strange orange globes along the path and into the flowerbeds. So far the plant has laid three of its fruits — and I have set aside a specific purpose for each. One pumpkin has already been harvested, small and sweet enough to turn it into soup. One will remain to get as big as it possibly can. But the third one will be cut and carved in time for Halloween, to act as a home for the important light that will scare away everything dark and ghoulish.

Christians have often been a bit unsure about Halloween, but I rather like it. In fact I think it has a useful purpose. It's helpful to remember that the name derives from the church calendar — All Hallow's Eve. It is the night before All Hallows, otherwise known as All Saints Day. Therefore it is the last chance, tradition tells us, that evil spirits can come out and cause trouble before the Saints burst in with the morning and darkness is completely blown away.

And although the tradition of trick or treating needs to be managed with consideration for others, allowing children the opportunity to head off into the night and play with the idea of fear and frights is, I think, a useful thing as they learn that there is scary stuff in the world, but that it need not have the final word. In fact in many countries it is an opportunity to taunt and mock the evil, reminding us that it does not have the hold on us that it would desire. Halloween reminds us that evil is fragile and short-lived, the light of the Saints is far more powerful than the darkest thing on this earth.

This year there will be a pumpkin on the Rectory driveway, shining its light into the darkness. Darkness and fear are part of this world and we cannot avoid them but All Hallows and its eve reminds us that whatever we fear, whatever is dark, whatever we'd rather hide from – the glory of God and his Saints overcomes it all.

St Peter's News

The Summer Evensongs during August have been a delight. Our Rector, The Rev'd Dr David Munchin, has led a "scratch" choir at each of the services, as well as at (at least) two of them managing to play the organ too. Parishioners from each of the Welwyn churches have enjoyed gathering together to sing in the choir and be a little stretched musically. It has also been really good to visit each of the churches in turn – they each have their own charm and interest.

And then there have been the pictures and the talks which have been so varied and so interesting. It has been good to welcome some outside speakers as well as some of our own people in the Welwyn team. Tewin staged the last Summer Evensong and welcomed folk afterwards to wine, juice, and nibbles for a convivial chat to finish off what has been a most successful series.

Our last Sunday in August was also the day on which we held our Annual Joint Service with All Saints, Datchworth as part of the Burnham Green Festival. There was a good turnout of Tewin, Datchworth and Burnham Green residents for the service, which was led very amiably by one of our curates in the Welwyn team, The Rev'd Ryan Gilfeather.

Earlier in the month, Susannah led a large party of people, and dogs, on a rather drizzly Poetry Pilgrimage across the fields from Datchworth church to Tewin, via Burnham Green Village Hall. Last year a similar outing was held on a scorching hot day. This year the weather was not bright but nevertheless this was a thoroughly enjoyable event reading the poetry of R S Thomas, with commentaries by Susannah, along the way.

I am pleased to report that our wonky gatepost has been replaced this month and the hole in the middle of the drive by the war memorial has been filled in, in between showers and before the weather gets bad.

Our second Messy Church, in August, was very well attended. The theme was *The Water of Life* and we were pleased to see children and families from all around the Tewin area. May this go from strength to strength. This has replaced our Family Services on the third Sunday in the month which took place in the morning, when so many families are busy encouraging their young folk to take exercise at sports. Messy Church occupies the 3-4.30pm slot in the afternoon when families might find they need to amuse young

folk. The theme for September was a Harvest Celebration. The main service for Harvest was on the last Sunday in September and I shall cover this in the next Churchwarden's news.

During September, Susannah has outlined the shortfall in the church finances. People have many misconceptions about local Parish churches, not least that they are very wealthy. Here at Tewin we do indeed try to manage our affairs within our budgets, and we always reckon to have some savings to cover immediate and urgent expenses. Unlike some parishes elsewhere in Britain, we always pay our share of costs for the Welwyn Team, including those due to the Diocese for clergy and other costs. We have also been very pleased to receive special donations towards the costs of recent repairs and maintenance of our 17th century clock, mostly 17th century bells, and the upgrade to our lighting system. Nonetheless, a combination of much increased running costs and lower income mean a likely loss of around £10,000 this year so we have sent out a special appeal during September to ask that regular donors give a little more and if others feel inclined, even in these difficult times, to give money to the church, it will be much appreciated. We have our Quinquennial Inspection of the church coming up later this year which may find us shelling out for other repairs and maintenance. So, thank you to everybody who has kindly donated to the church as a result of this appeal.

I hope you have had a good summer in reasonable health and maybe with a short break or two. However, if you are ill or in poor spirits or if you are recently bereaved, do get in touch with Susannah or any in the Welwyn team who are always there to give support.

Tewin Life In Tudor And Stuart Times

Have you ever thought how Tewin parishioners lived in the 16th and 17th centuries?

This little book contains wills and inventories of some residents who lived there at that time which give some clues.

When residents died their goods and chattels were valued for probate and these items are listed in inventories.

Details reveal the layout of their houses and contents such as furniture, cooking utensils, clothing, personal possessions and lots more. As a farming community, crops and livestock feature prominently.



How did this come about? In 1983 a group of residents from Tewin and Datchworth met in Datchworth Village Hall to be instructed in the art of reading old handwriting. The leader of these sessions was Lionel Munby, a local historian. He used old Datchworth and Tewin documents as examples and he encouraged interpretation as well.

Photocopies of these documents have been stored in Datchworth Museum for many years. These formed the basis of this publication in collaboration with Datchworth Museum.

Friends of Danesbury and QVM

In our article last month we explained something of the history of the two hospitals we have in our midst and what happens at them. I thought you might like to know a little more. Patients at the Danesbury hospital suffer from a range of neurological conditions, many are young and as I am sure you can imagine, have been devastated by what has happened to them. Although both the hospitals are part of the Herts Community NHS Trust funding is always an issue so during the summer the trustees of the Friends of Danesbury and the QVM Hospital charity have been busy reviewing funding requests from doctors and other clinicians at the hospitals, ensuring that the revenue from our high street shop is used for the benefit of patients. The trustees agreed to fund several computerised GripAble gaming devices which the senior occupational therapist at Danesbury explained could be used independently so therapists could attend to other patients, were fun for patients to use and helped with upper body and mental co-ordination. These cost approximately £3,000 and could not have been funded out of the NHS budget.

Similarly, the lead physiotherapist explained that the Community Neurological team who run out-patient clinics and provide community home visits within North & East Herts have a loan service for standing frames. These help patients with multiple sclerosis who cannot stand independently because of weakness or balance issues and who often develop disabling complications because of immobility. Some of these complications can be prevented, slowed down or even reversed with regular standing facilitated by standing frames. The Community team had run out of stock and wanted to buy two more at a cost of approximately £2,400, a sum which would have wiped out the Team's whole annual budget. The trustees agreed.

In the QVM hospital where patients come for rehabilitation after stays in the Lister and other acute hospitals the trustees have recently agreed to fund individual TVs for all patients including in the new two bedded bariatric ward where they will need to be put on trolleys.

On a lighter note, we were most grateful to Councillor Terry Douris, the chairman of Hertfordshire County Council, who paid the two hospitals a visit in August and was given a guided tour by Tony Stowe. The Chairman met several members of the clinical teams and seemed impressed by the facilities and rehabilitation on offer.

Please note we have our AGM in October on Thurs 19th October at 5:30pm at the Danesbury Neurological Centre. All appropriate notices will be issued soon but please keep the date now — we will be delighted to see you. In the meantime please do continue to support our very worthwhile charity.


