A BRIEF HISTORY OF HUNDRED YEAR WOOD

In 1993 Tewin Society raised the idea of creating a new area of woodland in the Parish and approached Tewin Parish Council for assistance.

Tewin Parish Council successfully received a grant of £3,000 from East Herts Council's Environment Initiative Scheme for the purpose of purchasing some land which would be planted up to create an amenity woodland for the village, ramblers and a refuge for wildlife.

The piece of land purchased from John Barton formed the corner of a field (formerly known as Little Brown Field) near Upper Green and covered an area of approx 1.1 acres.

Jack Bird drew up a planting plan with mainly native broadleaf tree species with oak and hornbeam predominating.

A new footpath was created to improve access to the site.

A Forestry Commission Woodland Grant was obtained to cover the costs of the trees and associated materials.

The woodland was planted in November 1994 by local volunteers and the pupils of Tewin Cowper Endowed School with assistance from the Countryside Management Service.

Tewin Parish Council decided to name the new plantation "Hundred Year Wood" in commemoration of the centenary of the existence of Tewin Parish Council.

On The Farm

We started sowing our wheat fields on the 1st of October but before this a lot of land work takes place. Seed has to be dressed and cleaned, meaning all small seed has to be taken out. One of my many jobs after harvest is to take a sample to a laboratory near Cambridge to get the wheat seed tested for germination. My sample came back at 98% germination, great! It's also all about 1,000 grain weight (the weight of a sample) which is different every year. We buy a couple of tons of special seed for multiplication the following year. We need about 25 tons of dressed seed for the current year to get next year's harvest. We aim to sow between 200 to 220 seeds per sq meter.

The weather has been very unsettled of late and particularly since the start of sowing, not what we want. I live in fear of a wet Autumn so it's been a stop/go affair. By Monday the 16th of October we still had 100 acres to sow. The weather forecasters said Storm Babet will hit us on Wednesday with heavy rain and wind, so on Monday the Naked Oats were sown. On Tuesday we finished sowing the wheat, most of the land was rolled, and sprayed with a herbicide to control weeds and on Wednesday at mid day Storm Babet hit us with heavy rain. Luckily for us the rain moved further north but, unfortunately, flooded large areas of farmland in Lincolnshire.

With the wet weather our wild bird cover crops, sown on margins around woods and odd areas of fields, have looked fantastic. I have never known so many pheasants and wildlife around these areas, and those parakeets - where on earth did they come from?

Bowls Club News

Well that's another summer season gone and with it the difficulties of maintaining the green during the periods of very hot weather we experienced this year.

But we succeeded, with a number of clubs and the County Bowling Association congratulating us on how well the green bowled.

In mid September the Club's Finals Day was held, and you will be pleased to hear that a number of the Trophies were won by members from the village. Well done to them and the other winners.

At the beginning of October the Autumn renovations were carried out and the green put to bed for the winter. That does not mean that work stops on it. It will still need mowing once a fortnight although it is not cut as short as in the playing season. It will be spiked at least once a month to help with drainage and to allow air in to the sub soil to encourage microscopic bacterial growth. This will break down some of the waste products in the soil which in turn feed the grass roots.

A close eye will be kept on the green for signs of fungal infection as the green is susceptible to Fusarium. Should this rear its ugly head, it will need to be sprayed before it gets out of control.

With the green closed for the winter the Club House now comes into its own with

Team Vicar's Letter

Last month, a now former Home Secretary described those living in tents on the streets of our towns and cities as making a lifestyle choice. The next day Matt, the cartoonist for the Telegraph, posted an image of two men in a printer's workshop proofreading a newly printed Christmas card. One is saying to the other: 'The message in Suella Braverman's Christmas card says "Being born in a stable is a lifestyle choice". This, of course, is most certainly true.

The backdrop to the Nativity, that we read in Luke's gospel, is very much a global stage of politics and power. "In those days a decree went out from Emperor Augustus that all the world should be registered. This was the first registration and was taken while Quirinius was governor of Syria." the story begins. This is the setting we are given to the entry of Christ into the world. However, as the wisemen find out, the King of Kings is not born into a palace, rather he is born amongst the dirt and draughts of a stable to a young vulnerable woman who that night has nowhere else to lay her head. Not a plan that many humans would think sensible but, for God in Jesus coming to live alongside his people, being born in a stable was very much a lifestyle choice.

Christ sheds his power and glory to become a small child, born to an ordinary Palestinian-Jewish couple, who flee across the border to Egypt to escape a wrathful ruler. For centuries his followers have understood this lifestyle choice to be a sign that God has a special concern for the poor and dispossessed. If we close our hearts to those on the margins of our society, then we fail to welcome Him.

I pray that our hearts would be widened this Christmas, so we might be a blessing to others, just as we have been blessed.

It is an unusually sunny day today, early November, after the dreadful wet weather we have had for weeks. I have already planted my tulip bulbs even though Monty Don said not to start until the beginning of November but dodging the showers to get wallflowers and bulbs out in the pots and the ground has not been easy. Thank you to Elaine Wulko for helping to plant the beds by the West Door of the church, and to the team of leaf gatherers – David Rawlins, Mark Lee, David Hatt and Gerry Murphy, and to Stuart Kirkham for cutting the grass in the churchyard. Pete Johnson, our Verger, is out there most days keeping the place tidy and the extra help is much appreciated.

At the beginning of November our service on All Saints Day was tinged with sadness as our Reader Mick Simmons has decided to retire after 21 years. He preached a brilliant final sermon focussed on "Saints", funnily enough, reminding us all that we are none of us saints, but we can all play our part in helping others along the way. I was tempted to applaud, as were others, I later found, but I contented myself with saying "Amen" at the end. Susannah made a jolly speech about Mick with many anecdotes and presented him and Queenie with a picture of the church, a bunch of flowers and a card and cheque from the congregation. We are going to miss him as our Reader, but they will continue to worship at St Peter's, so we are not losing them altogether.

Messy Church in October was a very well attended affair with the children carving pumpkins for Halloween and later toasting marshmallows over a fire pit. See the pictures on St Peter's Facebook page. In November we had the added joy of a baptism during Messy Church.

You may have noticed that the church clock stopped for a short while early in the month. The new Pendulum regulator was trying to deal with the hour change at the end of October and got a bit stuck. Hopefully the horologist has sorted it out now. In any case, we had a very good turnout for the Remembrance Sunday service on Sunday 12th; despite rather damp weather. Thank you to Gerry Roberts for once again playing the Last Post and the Reveille.

In the summer we had a machine installed in the church to enable people to give to the church using credit and debit cards. This cost quite a lot of money up front but has already paid for itself bringing in much needed revenue for the church.

By the time you receive this we shall have had the Church Christmas Bazaar in the Memorial Hall. This is our main fund raising event in the year and this year also it has been an opportunity to see a model of our proposed new meeting room and the latest plans. If you have missed this, the plans and the model will be on show throughout December in the church so do pop in and see them. People are often surprised to find that the church is open during the week. The sign on the door gives service times for each week and particularly says that the church is open from about 9am to about 6pm, or whenever dusk is at this time of year.

In December we begin Advent on 3rd and the following **Sunday 10th** we shall be staging our **Annual Tewin Nativity at 4pm outside the church**. This is a wonderful event, acted by teenagers and adults, with real sheep, donkey or pony, and a real baby, and ending at Churchfield Farm next door for hot refreshments.

Our Annual Carol Service is on 17th December at 6.30pm when the church will be candle lit, but now we have the new LED lights we shall actually be able to dim them so that people can still see the hymns!! Susannah will lead a Crib Service on Christmas Eve at 3pm which will be followed by candlelit Midnight Mass at 11.30pm, led for the first time by our curate, Christie Gilfeather.

Christmas is a busy time for many of us. It can be a lonely one for some and, for those who have little in their piggy banks, it can be very hard. If you can spare something for the Food Bank this Christmas, please leave it at Tewin Stores or in the box at the church. We are all very conscious of the hardship caused by conflicts in the Middle East and Ukraine. Thank you to everyone who has contributed to the Samaritan Christmas Boxes this year.

Finally, if you are ill or in poor spirits or if you are recently bereaved, do get in touch with Susannah or any in the Welwyn team who are always there to give support.
