LOWER MIMRAM VALLEY INITIATIVE



The Parish Council unanimously agreed to adopt both the reports submitted by David Rixson: A Brief Landscape History of the Mimram Valley and The Case for a Local Landscape Designation.

These represent the first stage of the Lower Mimram Valley Initiative (LMVI) conceived in response to significant threats to the vulnerable environment between Welwyn Garden City, Digswell and Tewin Village.

Copies will be sent to relevant contacts, and placed on the Tewin Village Website. Hard copies will be available to view at Tewin Stores.

Stage Two of LMVI will include: participation in the statutory plan making process; preparation of a landscape recovery plan; the set up of a 'Friends of Marden Fields' website and constitution of a community enterprise to implement plans for the benefit of local people.

The Parish Council is very grateful to David Rixson and his team for all their time and effort in producing two very professional and useful documents.



Screen On The Green

On the 21st March we are showing "Apollo 11 (2019)" a documentary film released to celebrate the 50th anniversary of the 1969 Apollo 11 mission, the first space flight from which men walked on the moon.

Edited, produced and directed by Todd Douglas Miller, the film consists entirely of archival footage including 70mm film previously unreleased to the public, and does not feature narration, interviews or modern recreations. Never-before-seen footage and audio recordings take you straight into the heart of NASA's most celebrated mission as astronauts Neil Armstrong, Buzz Aldrin and Michael Collins embark on their historic trip to the moon. The events cover the eleventh hour preparations for the launch to shortly after the safe touchdown of the capsule with its three astronauts back on Earth, an unbelievably impressive achievement in 1969.

Apollo 11 is a beautiful film with stunning visuals and a stirring sound-track by Matt Morton which was created using only instruments and equipment that were available in 1969.

The evening will be run in a similar way as before (government restrictions permitting) but, for the safety of everyone, we would prefer that you are fully vaccinated. Please do not come if you are feeling unwell.

On the Farm

At the end of January I have to put my sprayer through its M.O.T, so I can use the machine on my crops for the coming season. The Examiner has a check list of 50 items to run through, just like a car or van M.O.T. He runs the machine at a higher pressure than normal to see if there are any leaks from joints. If any leaks are found they must be repaired before the sprayer has passed. I am proud of my sprayer and it's kept in Tip Top Order. All nozzles are tested for flow rates, and I run the sprayer at 3 Bar. The rate at which I spray depends on what I am spraying. For example, if I am spraying a residual herbicide for grass weed control I would normally spray at 145 Litres of water per Ha. Another herbicide might require 200 Litres of water per Ha. It's quiet easy to change flow rates.

This week, with spring approaching, we had a walk over all fields with our Agronomist, to see how they have come through the winter. We discussed the autumn residual herbicides, and the late emergence of wheat and how it had worked (very well). We walked the oats in order to make a decision with regard to the necessity of using a herbicide and talked about fertiliser usages for the Spring, mainly for protein enhancement, as we aim for our wheat to be near 13 percent protein. This is the top grade of wheat for bread making, and commands a higher price. We meet our Agronomist every 10 days and he is a very important person in our farm life. He keeps me up to date with crop prices, which change almost daily. Events like a Russian invasion of the Ukraine could cause wheat prices to rocket upwards. We also discussed how to control the costs of our inputs which have almost doubled due to the price of gas and the cost of diesel. All our inputs have gone up. We will have to cut our fertiliser rate by 10 percent or more, as we do not know how the weather might affect our harvest, and we do not know what our crop prices will be next Sept, Oct, and November. It's all quite a worrying time, especially with the Government's Agricultural Policy all over the place, which I am having a job to understand. Ivor Williams.



Ovarian Cancer and Prostate Cancer Awareness

Ovarian Cancer Awareness

Around 7,500 women are diagnosed with ovarian cancer each year in the UK. Knowledge of the symptoms is low but if diagnosed at the earliest stage, 9 in 10 women will survive for at least 5 years. But two thirds of women are diagnosed late, when the cancer is much harder to treat.

If you are experiencing any of the following symptoms regularly, and they are not normal for you, it is important that you see your GP:

- · Persistent bloating not bloating that comes and goes
- · Feeling full quickly and/or loss of appetite
- · Pelvic or abdominal pain (that's your tummy and below)
- · Urinary symptoms (needing to wee more urgently or more often than usual)

It is unlikely that your symptoms are caused by a serious problem, but it is very important to get checked out.

Prostate Cancer Awareness

Prostate cancer is the most common cancer in men and it is thought that here in the UK around 50,000 are diagnosed with this disease each year. The 10 year survival rate is almost 80%.

Symptoms of prostate cancer do not usually appear until the prostate is large enough to affect the tube that carries urine from the bladder out of the penis (urethra).

When this happens, you may notice things like:

- an increased need to pee
- · straining while you pee
- · a feeling that your bladder has not fully emptied

These symptoms should not be ignored, and it is important you see you GP, but they do not mean you have prostate cancer. It's more likely they're caused by something else, such as prostate enlargement.

Team Vicar's Letter

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the season of Lent: 40 days (plus six Sundays) of preparation before we encounter the cross and Resurrection at Easter. It is a day where we find the courage to acknowledge two things 1) we are not perfect, 2) we will all die. This is strangely liberating. In a world in which we are encouraged to never admit weakness and taught to fear death, it is a relief to the soul to be honest about who we are and what we are moving towards.

Remember you are dust and to dust you shall return says the priest as an ash and oil cross is placed upon the people's foreheads. It is this cross that allows us to face sin and death unafraid. God takes even the very dust of the world and transforms it into life. With his grace not even the worst part of our beings is outside of his forgiveness and grace. With his grace not even death will separate us from his love.

You would be most welcome to receive this sign of grace and forgiveness at any of our Ash Wednesday services on 2nd March. 10:30am at St Peter's, Tewin. 9:30am and 8pm at St. Mary's, Welwyn.

The passion flower in the Australian bush needs fire to cleanse and bring about new birth. So too this oil and ash upon your brow takes you to death, you creature of the earth, reminding you of your sure mortal end so in death's embers you will not remain, but Son-kissed by the greeting of a friend, you will arise - a phoenix from the flame.

Remember you are dust and to dust you shall return. These words are life although they sound like death. The potter takes the clay and shapes its form, and you are recreated by God's breath. So shrive and die again into this soil, and grace will germinate through ash and oil. © Susannah Underwood

St Peter's News

A church at the heart of the village, with space for all

February always feels like a dull month, neither winter nor spring; but with the changing seasons, we can already see the fields full of green shoots and the churchyard with snowdrops and aconites. Soon the trees will have new leaves and blossom and spring will be upon us. There is the most enormous pile of leaves in the churchyard as Pete and other helpers have given a hand to gather up the autumn fall. Candlemas is well behind us and during February we have been looking forward to Lent after Ash Wednesday on 2 March. (NB The Ash Wednesday Service at St Peter's will take place at 10.30am). We have also begun Evensong again, as requested by members of the congregation. It will alternate during the year on the third Sunday in the month with Holy Communion, and our choir will sing. This service gives much joy to those who attend.

Throughout the last few months, we have remained careful in church, masked for much of the service, still only taking bread at communion, and carefully sitting at a distance from our neighbours. And then there is a funeral service with many coming to celebrate the life of someone who has lived in the village for many years and is much loved, and we fill the church and accept that it is right to be together and to mourn in this way, albeit masked.

During March we are also beginning again to serve coffee after our morning services. We have missed being able to socialise and chitchat with friends. I know that many folk have missed singing hymns in church but we have been doing that for some months now, with or without masks. We keep ourselves safe for others. A service is still streamed every Sunday from one of the churches in the Welwyn team. As we are trying to get back to more normal routines here, the vicar has asked people to step up to help with a variety of tasks inside and

outside the church. Any support you can give to St Peter's will be much appreciated.

The church is also much appreciated by visitors during the week as a place of contemplation and peace. We know this because many people leave us a message in the Visitors' Book. Often this is the only way some people feel they can be "in church". During the pandemic our lives have changed: we have taken many things for granted before this. Some of us have had time to reflect on the people and things we have lost. For others the world has become a smaller place where they go on fewer outings and see fewer people. The church is there for everyone, whether they wish to attend our regular services or come in to think at other times.

During Lent we shall be holding a weekly study course with a choice of times and venues across the Welwyn Team. Here in Tewin it will start with a soup lunch at 12.30pm on Fridays for six weeks from 4 March. Please let Susannah know if you would like to attend. (The first session will be at the Rectory in Datchworth, thereafter at 30 Godfries Close)

We continue to hold in our prayers all those affected by the pandemic, all those who have died or have been recently bereaved. Our clergy are still in contact with those self-isolating or unable to get out of the house, or with any bereaved families.


