Plant Exchange on Saturday 7th May

The Plant Exchange stall will be by the well head on Lower Green and open between 10am and 4pm. Please bring along any spare plants you are able to donate. Visit to Painshill on Monday 11th July 2022

Our summer outing this year will be a day visit by coach to Painshill, which are beautiful award-winning 18th century landscape gardens in Cobham, Surrey. Do check out the website www.painshill.co.uk to see what it has to offer.

Ours will be a self-led visit with a 30-minute introductory talk to include tea, coffee and biscuits. Guide books will be provided and then you will be able to explore at your own pace. The cost for the trip will be $\pounds 25$ for THACS members and $\pounds 30$ for non-members.

There is also the option of a 90-minute walking tour with an experienced guide, which will enable you to learn about the gardens' history. This will cost an additional £2.50 pp (and is subject to a minimum group size of 10 people).

Alternatively, you may prefer an hour's guided tour on a five-seater buggy for the same additional cost of $\pounds 2.50$ pp. This will be especially useful if you would like to explore further into the grounds but feel the walking would be too much. There are accessible routes around the gardens and wheelchair hire is available on request.

The coach will leave Tewin (bus stop opposite the Rose and Crown) at 9am and will leave Painshill for the return journey at 3.30pm. Journey time is approximately 90 minutes.

As part of Tewin's village Jubilee celebrations, a thanksgiving service for the Queen's Platinum Jubilee will take place at 12 Noon on Sunday 5th June at Upper Green, Tewin. All welcome.

On the Farm

Farmers look forward to spring on the farm, when you leave those dark winter nights and head to the time of year when daylight changes and we have more hours of light than we have of dark. That means our crops start waking up due to the daylight hours. The soil temperatures are most important at this time of year as it's no good sowing in cold, wet soil. The seed will sit tight and won't move. With a warm, moist seedbed the seed will burst into life. Nature is wonderful. We take tissue tests on our growing crops every month. Nitrogen is our key nutrient in growing our wheat crops. We also check the levels of Manganese, Sulphur, Boron, Zinc, and Potassium. All these trace elements are needed in a healthy growing crop of wheat, oats, barley, peas etc. With the huge increases in the costs involved in growing our crops, this spring we will only apply what a crop needs. The war in Ukraine is of great concern to our everyday life. I'm proud to fly the Ukrainian flag at my farm gateway to show support for the Ukrainian farmers trying to sow their spring crops in a battle zone, with fields riddled with bomb craters and the aftermath of battle. This war affects our everyday farm inputs like fertiliser, diesel, gas, electric, and many other items. Our wheat price in store has rocketed. That sounds good but we need the increase to pay for the increase in our inputs. Just an update from Lloyd Harrison, who is running the Tewin Greens organic garden. He tells me sowing and transplanting is in full swing, onion sets have been planted out. As our weather is very unpredictable, all seedlings have been covered by a horticultural fleece to give them warmth. His tomatoes and peppers are growing nicely in his polytunnel as are lots of other vegetables.

Meningitis – Adults Get It Too

Meningitis is often thought of as a disease that only affects babies and young children. But the truth is that meningitis can affect anyone of any age, with the risk increasing in older adults as our immune systems weaken as we get older.

Meningitis is the inflammation of the membranes that surround the brain and spinal cord. The most common causes of meningitis are bacteria and viruses. **Bacterial meningitis** can be fatal and needs rapid admission to hospital and urgent medical treatment. Whilst most adults will make a good recovery, around 10% will die and some will be left with lifelong disabilities. Some bacteria that cause meningitis can also cause septicaemia (blood poisoning). **Viral meningitis** is very rarely life-threatening, but can still make people very unwell. Most people will make a good recovery, but recovery can be slow.

Common Signs and symptoms of meningitis and septicaemia in adults:

- · Fever, cold hands and feet
- · Vomiting
- · Drowsy, difficult to wake
- · Confusion and irritability
- · Severe muscle pain
- · Pale, blotchy skin. Spots/rash
- · Severe headache
- · Stiff neck
- Dislike of bright lights

Someone with meningitis or septicaemia can get a lot worse very quickly. Keep checking them.

Trust your instincts – get medical help immediately.

But we too have left our mark – or rather my husband, Bob, has. Summerhouse, smokehouse, chicken palace, beach huts and the invitation to quench your thirst on Two Bob beer – all of which we hope will detract a little from the less-than-perfect flower beds and tell a story that the Rectory is inhabited not just by a vicar, but by a furniture maker cum brewer.

Exactly what her legacy will be is yet to be written by the historians of the future but her steadfast commitment to our country, commonwealth and the Christian faith is hard to dispute. So we have a wonderful time ahead of Jubilee celebrations. You too can take part. Make a royal scarecrow. Come and wave your flags to the sound of Land of Hope and Glory at our special celebration service for the Queen at Noon on Upper Green on 5th June, just before the street party celebrations. Get involved with village life and leave your small legacy of friendship and community spirit in this village that is ours to tend while we are here.

St Peter's News

A church at the heart of the village, with space for all

It was a beautiful spring day, albeit quite cold, on Mothering Sunday. It is always a charming service, with the giving of posies to people who mean so much to us in our lives, as well as taking them to those who cannot attend church at this time. It was particularly poignant this year as we remembered those fleeing Ukraine, especially the mothers and grandmothers we could see on the news caring for young children in very difficult circumstances. The church continues to hold Ukrainians and all those who are refugees across the world in our prayers.

In earlier bulletins at the beginning of March, I meant to mention the World Day of Prayer which was led this year in the Welwyn team by the Rev'd Liz Lavelle. This year the service was designed by people here in the UK which was a bit of a change as often the services bring us a better understanding of life somewhere in, for example, islands in the South Pacific. The same service is sent to worshippers across the world and is carried out over the whole 24-hour period of the World Day of Prayer, in sequence, reminding us that we are all world citizens, caring for each other.

The Lent courses across the Welwyn team have been well attended and provoked much discussion about Bishop Graham James' book *A Place for God.* Bishop Graham has included a short chapter for each day of Lent about one of the places he visited during his long career, including as Chaplain at Lambeth Palace to first Archbishop Robert Runcie and then Archbishop George Carey. He went all over the world and the UK, and we have enjoyed reading about his observations of the places seen and the ways in which they brought him some meaning or enlightenment.

There have been few weddings in the church for a couple of years now due to the Covid restrictions, but we are looking forward to several taking place at St Peter's this summer. The banns were read for <u>four</u> couples in the first three weeks of April. As Easter is later this year, I will leave writing about that until next month, together with a report back from the Church's **Annual Parochial Church Meeting which** will take place at 10.45am after church on Sunday 1st May.

We are continuing to enjoy the blossom on the trees in the churchyard, with tulips now taking over from daffodils and snowdrops. It is always a lovely time of year with the first green shoots emerging in the hedgerows. The tree which was blown down in the gales has been removed and shredded and Pete has had a bonfire when the wind has been in the right direction. So many people walk through the churchyard each day, sit, and drink a flask of coffee or simply enjoy the peace and tranquillity.

The church will be participating in the village Jubilee events with an **Open-Air Service on Upper Green on Sunday 5th June at noon**, which will precede the fun and games afternoon for children and families that day. The **SAVoce choir** will be holding another **concert at 3pm on Sunday 12th June in the church**, followed by tea and cake. Free entry but with a retiring collection in aid of the church and the Ukrainian appeal.

Covid is still around us with several members of the congregation finding they have tested positive for the virus. So please take care and look after yourselves. Our clergy continue to support those with Long Covid, or who are self-isolating, and any families who are bereaved or in poor spirits. If you need to, please get in touch with

It was good to have a Spring Show again, after a three-year gap. The display of show exhibits was delightful and clearly demonstrated the skill and enthusiasm of the exhibitors and their wide range of interests. I hope that you came along to see it all and to enjoy the refreshments on offer. The Main Hall housed the exhibits of flower arranging, horticulture and culinary, together with a selection of arts & craft exhibits. The Parish Room housed the photography, painting, calligraphy and prose exhibits, with more children's art exhibits displayed in the corridor.

In the Flower Arranging class, there was a tie for first place between Mavis Haggar and Sue Whitbourn. The other class winners were Marie St Pier for Horticulture, Terry Brand for Arts & Crafts, Janet Gordon for Photography and Linda Gilley for Culinary. The Tewin Cowper School Award goes to the child with the highest number of points in the children's classes for horticulture, arts & crafts and culinary. Erin Murray won convincingly by being first in her age group in all three of these classes (just as her sister, Lauren, did in the last Spring Show in 2019). The success of these two sisters extended to the photography, where Erin and Lauren Murray were joint winners of the Les Borg Cup for Children's Photography.

Following a long enforced break due to the Pandemic and rules concerning infection control and passenger safety, Saturday trips to WGC have recommenced.

In these difficult times it is essential for isolated, elderly and vulnerable residents to be able to get out in a social and supportive group. This is possible thanks to the special Minibus hired from HCC whose drivers are particularly kind and helpful we are very pleased to report.

At present we are just visiting WGC but where there is demand other locations can be included such as Welwyn North Station, Hertford, Stevenage and occasional Special Outings to for example St Albans Market or Garden Centres which have been particularly popular.

There is capacity now for extra passengers who pay £5 for a Return Trip. This is a subsidised "Fare" made possible by continuing grants and donations from Tewin Parish Council, Friends of Tewin and East Herts Council to whom we are all extremely grateful.
