#### Tewin Cricket Club Net Proposal

Tewin Cricket Club have requested permission to put new permanent practice nets on Upper Green. The proposed site is marked out on Upper Green with white lines and the Parish Council have put up an

explanation board. Parishioners have provided feedback and the Parish Council agreed that it has always tried to support the success of the Cricket Club, but the Upper Green is primarily a registered Village Green rather than a dedicated sports field.

It is in this context, that the Parish Council feels unable to support the proposals, primarily because of their size, bulk, permanence and general visual intrusion on to the open space.

Other secondary considerations that have also been taken in to account are as follows in no specific order of significance:

- · legal need to provide open access to the whole green
- · replacement of a significant area of grass with an artificial surface
- · excavations to level the green
- · overlap of area traditionally used for a football pitch
- significant development for the benefit of a relatively small group of users
- · likely to encourage car parking on the green
- even though the proposal will not block access at the top of the green, there is still the sense that walkers etc will have to "get round" the "obstruction", for evermore.

# Plant Exchange on Saturday 7th May

The purpose of the plant exchange was to stimulate local interest and participation in horticulture. Based on the number of plants that changed hands, I think that the event was very successful.

People were very generous with donations of plants for the stall and this got the event off to a good start. As the day unfolded, numerous plants found new owners and several people went away with plants that they will grow at home for the first time. Visitors were encouraged to take any plant they liked, even if they did not have any plants to swap in exchange. They were invited to leave cash in the collection box in aid of Tewin Stores and they did so with great generosity: - we raised about £150. The best of the left-over plants were given to Tewin Stores, for them to sell and so encourage more local horticulture and raise a little more money. *THACS* has given further support to Tewin Stores by brightening up the courtyard with some cheerful plants for summer colour. There was insufficient space for the traditional hanging baskets, so we used two fence-post planters instead. These are fixed to two of the fence posts and have been planted with petunias and lobelia to give extra floral appeal throughout the summer.

#### Hot Dry Land on the Farm

Mid May, and into June, a lot of time is spent in my farm office, and not outside where I want to be. My BP5 Application Form was submitted by my Agent on the 12th of May. This informs the Rural Payments Agency, which is part of DEFRA, of all my crops growing this year. Every field, even to the exact sowing area, and all changes from the year before, and there are many, have to be submitted.

Today in my farm post, is my June returns, another Survey of Agriculture and Horticulture, also for DEFRA. It amounts to about 96 questions about my farm, like how much land do I own, how much do I rent, how much wood is on the farm, my area of wheat, barley, oats and potatoes, do I grow Miscanthus, how many pigs do I have, poultry, sheep and lambs, how many people work for me?

Then today, the 14th of June, another form from DEFRA, about Plant Protection Products (PPPs), which I use because I am a spray operator for my farm and I store and use certain products on my farm throughout the year. More form filling.

Then on the 21st of June, I have my Grain Audit. It's an inspection of my grain barn, spray store, sprayer, all drilling dates, fertiliser spreading dates and grain store cleaning dates. I must show the inspector my Integrated Pest Management Plan, also My Environmental Risk Assessment & Site Survey, and Health and Safety Records.

This is just to get a passport sticker, which goes out with every load of grain which leaves our farm. And all I want to do is sit on my tractor, and farm crops for hungry people.

More food has to be produced locally to limit our country's vulnerability to food shortages now that our Government has a National Food Strategy! Has the war in Ukraine, woken up our Government? The tree planting, the rewilding of our countryside, and sowing large areas for bird food will now have to give ground for food production. Ivor Williams

The writer, Maureen Nicol, was flooded with responses and the National Women's Register (NWR) was born. We are now a national organisation with over 300 groups nationwide. Times have changed, but NWR still provides a much-needed network for women to meet others, form friendships, have varied discussions and try new activities.

The closest group to Tewin is in Hertford/Ware, with a new group starting in the Welwyn Village area. Would you like to meet new people in a relaxed and informal way? Or do you know someone who would? Please do get in touch, new members are always welcome. Each NWR group creates its own programme of meetings and activities to ensure members get to talk about what interests them. Meetings consist of a pre-arranged discussion topic which can range from lighthearted to serious topics, subjects that need research or the recollection of anecdotes or personal experiences. Each group plans its own programme to reflect the interests of its members.

As a member of NWR you will be part of a national organisation and network of women across the country. You can attend national and regional events and quality online talks. # A church at the heart of the village, with space for all

By all accounts the Jubilee weekend is one to remember here in the UK. Unfortunately, I was not here, having inadvertently booked my husband and me on to a trip to Iceland over the same period. Iceland is beautiful and we were very lucky with the weather. It was great to hear that the Tewin special events went so well with some marvellously clever scarecrows, a fun day on Upper Green organised by Friends of Tewin and preceded by an Open-Air Church service to celebrate the life of the Queen. I understand there were about eighty plus folk there for the service with Susannah, to lustily sing out the National Anthem and other jolly songs.

During June we had a delightful concert at the church on Sunday afternoon 12 June given by the SAVoce choir, followed by tea and cakes. The acoustics in St Peter's lend themselves beautifully to such a choir and the effect is simply joyful. The choir is available for weddings and other special events. There was a retiring collection amounting to more than £200 which is being split between the church funds and the Ukrainian appeal. The following Sunday the church was full of furry friends as we celebrated our Pet Service. In the evening we held our bi-monthly sung Evensong. This is a lovely service led by our own choir using the Book of Common Prayer and readings from the King James' Bible which makes a change from our regular form of worship. Do look out for the Summer Evensongs across the Welwyn Team which take place throughout August.

We have begun to take wine from the chalice again which is yet another small step back to our normal ways of worship.

Work has continued to be done in the churchyard preparing for the laying of new gravestone slabs in the Memorial Garden. We are still planning a survey of the trees in the churchyard to remove broken and fallen branches. A horologist has inspected the church clock. It is many years since any repairs were carried out. This is now necessary and will be done some time this year depending on when the company can fit us in.

Our bellringers have been busy during May and June. As well as ringing for services and weddings, they have won two ringing competitions for striking (ringing the bells at the correct spacing and in the correct order). Six of the Tewin team won the Boden Shield which is the district competition and five of the band were part of the 8-bell team which won the county Coburn Trophy at Broxbourne. They also joined the bellringing initiative across the country in celebrating the Queen's Platinum Jubilee by ringing Tewin bells on Friday 3rd June for the service of thanksgiving.

This month we have collected more bikes for The Bike Project where volunteers refurbish donated bikes which are then given to refugees to help them find and get to work. So far, in thirteen years they have given away over 9,500 bikes in this way. Thank you to everyone who contributed to this appeal which continues the Church in Action work begun last year. We have also collected bedding, towels, tinned food, and kitchen equipment for the Sisters of Mercy at St Saviour's Priory in Haggerston, near Hackney to give to homeless people or people who have recently been rehoused. So, many thanks to all who have sent goods for that appeal also. They are both good causes and I know that people are so happy to know their things have another life after them which is much appreciated.

I am holding a tea party in aid of the Trussell Trust on Saturday 2 July from 2.30pm at my house 30 Godfries Close. The Trussell Trust provide emergency food parcels for people across the country. A few years ago, they gave 46,000 parcels out in one year. In the past year that number has risen to 2.1 million. Do come for tea, cake, and a chat and leave a donation please.

Susannah has had a week's holiday in June from which, by the time you read this, we hope she will have returned refreshed. She and all the clergy in the Welwyn team are ever available to support those who are ill, in poor spirits, or bereaved. If you need to, please get in touch with

The charity shop in Welwyn was also decorated in Jubilee regalia. Tesco's on the High St. held a Jubilee raffle with proceeds benefiting our charity, The Friends of Danesbury & QVM. Thank you to all who supported us by purchasing tickets for the raffle and to all who came into our shop to make a purchase or donate items to us. We are so pleased that we are still in a position where we are able to keep the shop open: many retails shops were not as fortunate after Covid. This is only possible because of our hard-working Trustees, volunteers and you the public who give so generously. The trust and all those involved work tirelessly to help raise funds for Danesbury & QVM hospitals as well as other units throughout Hertfordshire. The money raised goes to supporting these units where the NHS is not able to help- be it purchasing magazines and daily newspapers for the patients, monthly fish & chips suppers, refurbishing the rehabilitation kitchens for use by the patients to buying specialised wheelchairs and vehicles to transport patients.
