## Lower Green

The Parish Council is aware of widespread concern about the damage to the edge of Lower Green. The last repair was ripped out in a matter of days. Various options and funding for a permanent repair are being investigated. We are also aware of concern about the damage to Upper Green, and again are investigating appropriate options.

### Roadworks

The Orchard Road junction with Harmer Green Lane southwards to the Lower Green junction were closed for approx. 2 days, between 20<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup> March 2013, enabling highway maintenance works to take place.

### Seven Acres Development Update

One property on the site has been sold and is due to complete shortly. Works on the shared ownership units are under way and the demolition of Sevenacres house itself has commenced and is expected to take approx. 4 weeks. Increased traffic may occur, although all contractors are well aware of the restrictions.

### **Riversmead Development Update**

3/12/1150/FP - Garage site to rear of: 17 - 28 Grass Warren, Tewin. Amended Drawings for demolition of garages and clearance of associated land. Erection of 1no 4 bed detached house. 4no 3 bed semi-detached houses and 3no 2 bed bungalows. The main change is to provide access to the new bungalows and the four bed house via a new road between the existing bungalows and to sell the 4 bed house on the open market.

TPC supportive with comments re retention of brick boundary wall, white window frames, bins to be located to the side of the bungalows and preserving the visual character of the area by retaining as many trees and shrubs on the site as possible.

Various details on the plans have been amended as requested, including correct marking of the site boundary and correct marking of trees to be retained in line with the arbori-cultural report. This planning application was granted approval by East Herts Council on 27<sup>th</sup> February 2013.

### In memory of Bertha Banks

'O blest are they, without pain or fretting, In the sun's light that knows no setting' – R.S. Thomas



On Saturday 9<sup>th</sup> March 2013, Bertha Banks passed quietly away in the Isabel Hospice after losing a particularly difficult and painful battle with cancer, which she had borne with extraordinary stoicism and bravery.

When I first met Bertha during the Easter vacation

from university in 1976, I was not yet a bell-ringer myself but had been taken along to the Tewin bell-ringing practice by my then boyfriend (now my husband) Graham, who was already a Tewin ringer. Bertha was clearly one of the cornerstones of the band and had already been ringing at Tewin for about 25 years. She told us that before she started to learn to ring permission had to be sought from her father – how glad we are that he gave it! Apart from anything else, it was a wonderful way for Bertha to express the love that she had for Tewin church and for the village. When she first started ringing she was the only young lady in the band and always thought that the gentlemen spoiled her!

She was born in Tewin on 26<sup>th</sup> May 1935 and, although she moved

out of the village after marrying her beloved husband Alan Banks in 1956, she continued to spend a great deal of time at Tewin, visiting her family, supporting village events and worshipping and ringing at the church. She was elected a member of the Hertfordshire County Association of Change Ringers in 1956 and was elected a Life Member in 2006 in recognition of her 50 years' membership, something of which she was extremely proud. For many years she did not venture beyond ringing some of the simpler methods, although she did like to hear the bells struck perfectly and would wince at the slightest trip or clash. She was eventually persuaded to learn some of the more difficult methods and was delighted to be able to extend her repertoire.

She was always keen to ring for weddings and particularly enjoyed those where there were lots of lovely hats to be admired! She rang in several quarter-peals over the years, some of which are commemorated on boards in the tower, as well as in District and County striking competitions with the Tewin band.

Bertha loved being a part of the close-knit group that is the Tewin ringers and for her, as for all of us, the ringers became an 'extended family', a source of love, support, fellowship and practical help. Characteristically, Bertha was always one of the first to offer help but the last to ask for it. She always contributed wonderful cakes and salads to the many social gatherings, bell-ringers teas, church bazaars and special occasions, when you could guarantee to find her up to her elbows in suds, washing up at the kitchen sink – her favourite job!

When it was the bell-ringers' turn to clean the church she insisted on the job being done very thoroughly indeed as she had been taught to do it by her mother when she was very young – we dare not leave a single cobweb. She had a lovely sense of humour and always enjoyed a giggle. I spent happy days every year in her company, preparing flower arrangements for, and subsequently decorating, the bell-ringers' allocated corner of the church for the Harvest Festival, one of her favourite times of the year.

Bertha had for many years been a real stalwart of the Tewin ringers' band, ringing for every service, every Sunday, and since, last August, when her illness made it impossible for her to continue

## Vicar's letter

As I write I'm watching the inauguration of Pope Francis 1 on the BBC. In two days time Justin Welby takes up his throne as Archbishop of Canterbury. Sandwiched between the two will be the budget. So I'm left reflecting on the relationship between faith and economics. Pope Francis 1 has spoken about his desire for the church to be on the side of the poor. Justin Welby himself was one of many Anglican bishops, including our own, who have spoken out against reforms in this country, which would push more children into poverty.

Of course, the church speaking out about matters of economic policy leaves it open to accusations of meddling and getting involved in that which is none of its business. Yet the Christian faith, along with others, has at its heart an imperative to care for the poor and speak out against injustice. The bible has more than 2,000 references to this.

Christian Aid, Oxfam, UNICEF and many other UK based aid and justice organisations, are asking people to the join the IF campaign which is concerned with global poverty and hunger. Currently, although the world produces enough food for everyone, certain political and economic factors mean one billion people go hungry each day.

The IF campaign has identified 4 factors that contribute to perpetuating world hunger. With this they have four aims;

- which they make large profits
- most desperate peoples
- off their land in order to satisfy the need of big business
- their decisions which impact on the fair distribution of food

In June the leaders of the World's 8 most powerful countries will meet in Britain. If you want to encourage them to put food fairness on the top of their agenda then visit www.enoughfoodIF.org for more details.
