Two years ago, the day before I was licensed as Team Vicar to these parishes, I went for a walk. But also because walking past roads and doors, businesses and clubs I realised just how many of you I have encountered, just what a privilege it has been to get to share in some very key and poignant moments in your lives and what a joy it is to be part of these communities.
