Termination of Prescription Service at Tewin Stores

It is no longer possible to pick up prescriptions from Tewin Stores. Bridge Cottage Surgery was advised by the Herts Pharmacy & Medicines Team that the prescriptions service from the shop must stop as the collection of medicines from an unregulated site from unregulated personnel is not acceptable practice nor in accordance with relevant regulations and legislation. They are looking for other solutions.

Repeat prescriptions can be obtained by ringing Bridge Cottage Surgery who will outline the various options available. Home delivery will be agreed on a case by case basis and patients must get agreement from Bridge Cottage Surgery.

This registration helps identify the level of potential demand for improved broadband in your area, therefore proving it is a commercially viable project for suppliers to invest in increasing the broadband speed. There is no obligation to subscribe to the service if it becomes available.

It is probably also beneficial to register an interest at <u>www.bt.com/btinfinity</u> you don't have to be a BT customer to do this but BT is responsible for putting in the appropriate cabling. Enter your phone number to check to see if Infinity is available, and if it reports that it is not currently available to you, there is an option to register an interest.

Team Vicar's Letter

Fallen trees were a common sight last month, when the storm on St. Jude's day, took a good number down. There is a legend about another tree being blown down by a mighty wind. It is the story of St. Boniface, an 8th century English Bishop, who was sent to Germany as a missionary.

The legend tells us that one night he came across a group of people praying to Thor, the Nordic god of thunder and war. They were gathered under an oak tree and seeing within its dead branches Thor's curse upon them, were preparing to feed the oak tree by sacrificing the blood of a child. Boniface intervened, striking at the tree with an axe. A great wind toppled the oak and there, between its roots, stood a small green fir tree.

"From this night", said Boniface "that little tree shall be your holy emblem. It is the wood of peace, for your homes are built of it. It is the sign of eternal life, for its leaves are green. It points to heaven, and so shall be called the tree of the Christ Child" and he proceeded to tell them about the birth of Christ.

This year Datchworth Church is having its very first Christmas tree festival. The church will become a little forest, as trees decorated by local children and organisations will spring up between pew and aisle. St. Nicholas (aka Santa Claus) will move into the vestry and crafts, games, mulled wine and warming food will encourage a festive glow.

Let us in these winter months, as we see these trees spring up in schools, shops, our village green and our homes, look to where they point us – to the ever-green love of God, given in the gift of his Son Jesus Christ. I pray that you will know his peace.

The presentation of the Tewin Society Award will start the evening and this will be followed by the AGM. This will include the Chairman's and Treasurer's report for 2013, the election of the officers and other committee members for 2014 and a preview of events for 2014. Then there will be refreshments (including wine) followed by a talk from a guest speaker.

Our guest speaker is Dr David Butcher and his subject will be *The Art of Monochrome Landscape and City Photography.* His presentation will feature a collection of stunning black and white photographs from around the world to show the more artistic side of landscape and cityscape photography. All of the photographs were taken on film and printed in a traditional darkroom to the highest quality.

David Butcher has been making photographic images since the early 1970s.
