TREE WORKS

The Parish Council has agreed to Ashley Trees undertaking essential works on various trees located in the Parish as identified in the Parish Council annual risk assessment, e.g. alongside Bramfield Road on VG70 and CL148, Queen Hoo Lane on CL148 where it meets Bramfield Road, Queen Hoo Lane on CL149 where it meets Tewin Hill and Margery Lane on CL129. A number of the trees are within reach of the road and have dead wood overhanging the road.

FOOTPATHS

The Parish Council has been, and still is, working very hard to arrange a footpath to be built by HCC Highways between Upper and Lower Green. Work has now been completed on FP11 at the back of Upper Green, heading to the north of the parish, in order to prevent it from becoming muddy in winter.

PLANNING APPLICATION

3/13/0951/FP - Land adjacent to 30 Lower Green, Tewin - Erection of 3 -bedroom dwelling with associated landscaping (revised scheme) - *Tewin Parish Council objected on the basis of an inadequate tree survey, the excessive loss of trees and the inappropriate design which is out of keeping with the surrounding area and detracts from the listed property next door – EHC Granted Permission subject to various conditions.*

SEVEN ACRES

The Site Manager has been made aware of the worsening condition of the fir trees adjacent to the tennis courts and has removed soil banked up nearby. Taylor Wimpey has employed an arboriculturist to assess the trees and provide recommendations.

AUDIT

BDO LLP has completed the audit of Tewin Parish Council accounts and has issued an unqualified audit opinion as they consider the information in the annual return is in accordance with proper practices and no matters have come to their attention giving cause for concern that relevant legislation and regulatory requirements have not been met. The audit form has been displayed on the Parish Council notice board for the statutory 14 days.

RECYCLING

As you may be aware a new wheeled bin with a blue lid will be delivered to every household in October 2013. This bin will be used to recycle cardboard, cans, plastics, glass, cartons and foil. There will be an inner paper box for keeping paper separate and if you would like one of these you must order it by sending an email to recycling@eastherts.gov.uk or tear off the slip on the leaflet delivered to every household in the parish. Otherwise just continue to use the green box for recycling paper.

A Visit from the Ingleby Family

It was with great pleasure that we welcomed Dave and Rine, together with their two children, to the 9.30am Service at St Peter's on Sunday, 28th July. Having written to them and received many 'Link Letters' in return during their two years in Delhi, it was good to meet them again and hear about their life and work in India. Together with the help of photographs we learned about the work Dave, Rine and many volunteers are doing in the poorest areas of Delhi, which amazed us all. The heat (up to 46°C), humidity, dust and dirt, but most of all the devastating poverty with, it seems, no end in sight, was unbelievable. Delhi has a population of 22,000,000 people and as they extend the City further out so the poorest people who camp on the fringe and scrape a living are pushed out again, in terrible poverty, with no education for most children and almost non-existent medical facilities.

Later the family joined about 30 of us for lunch at The Vicarage in Datchworth, thanks to the kindness of Susannah and Bob, their daughter, Annabel, and her friend, who had everything ready for our 'bring and share' lunch. A summer's day, delicious food and lots of talking with so many questions to be asked of our guests, resulted in a very happy and informative time.

Dave and Rine, Sem and Joanna have been thoroughly enjoying their four months in England, especially the cool weather and seeing grandparents. In addition, Sem, aged $5\frac{1}{2}$, has had a term at a 'new school', which he really enjoyed. Whilst here, Dave and Rine have kept in touch with people in Delhi and the various projects that are going on, including the work of the Yamuna Clinic which serves some of the poorest in the Burmese refugee community, where Rine works, and the Habitat Building project with which Dave is involved.

We will continue our support and link with Dave and Rine, and wish them, Sem and Joanna well for their next two years in Delhi. *Elizabeth Wilson*

Banking on your help

Can you add some extra items to your shopping list to help those in need ? The food banks at St Peter's Church and Tewin Stores provide goods for the Stevenage Community Food Bank, which has been set up to provide a safety net for Stevenage residents who find themselves in sudden financial crisis – for example; redundancy, benefit change or delay in benefit award or an unexpected large bill – meaning they are unable to put food on the table. The Food Bank provides nutritious food for a three week period.

The Food Bank is a short term measure to support people in crisis allowing time to organise, adjust or change their circumstances.

A few facts from the organisers

We opened our doors the Friday before Christmas 2012 and saw six families. We now see on average 30 families a week using the food bank.

We have given away just over 1.5 metric tonnes of Pasta since Christmas and enough baked beans to fill the Stevenage swimming pool!

Easter 2013 saw the Food Bank expand to cover Knebworth.

The food bank only exists because of the continued support of the local community making food donations via our network of collection points.

We are presently seeing a high demand for the food bank due to the school holidays and the loss of free school meals.

We are seeing an increase in the "working poor" accessing the service as an unexpected or large utility bill plummets the families into food crisis. Nationally it is expected that food banks will feed 500,000 people in 2013.

Team Vicar's Letter

I met a child this week who was getting prepared for his new school. New shoes, new pencil case, new uniform were all being purchased. "But best of all I get a new teacher!" he told me. Apparently he and his old one didn't see eye to eye. The hope is, that this term, a fresh start may well be all he needs to put things right.

We all need second chances.

In Ian McEwan's book *A tonement*, and in the film of the same name, the grim reality is put that that isn't always possible. The main character, Briony, bears false witness as a young girl which has devastating consequences to her older sister and her sister's young lover. The whole story becomes an attempt to rewrite the past, to change that which has been done, to put things right. And sometimes we can. Sometimes a change of scene, or a simple 'sorry', or some other action can mend that which has been damaged. But sometimes, no matter how much regret we show, what is broken remains so. The driver of the train in Spain last month which killed 79 people will know that only too well.

In *A tonement* there is no God. Religion is a crumbling façade, pictured in the mortar which drops from the folly in Briony's garden. Briony lives in a universe, created by Ian McEwan, which has "nothing but blind pitiless indifference" as Richard Dawkins describes it. There is no atonement that can be made for sin, however much we may desperately desire it. Briony's only way out is, for a lifetime, to hide her sin and eventually to slip into the bliss of dementia where she may finally forget.

But this month I have been reminded of a verse in a hymn I used to sing many years ago which speaks to me of the great hope of Christianity:

So shall the dreadful day / when secrets all are known / be but the turning of a page or sight at last of home / so shall the Father greet the presence of the Son in me / His final charity. (Peter Firth – I Taste the Welcome Love)

From God there may be no secrets, but from God there is also nothing which is beyond his forgiveness. We all need second chances.

We celebrate Harvest Festival on September 15 when the Family Service will be followed by a Ploughman's Lunch in the churchyard. An evening service of Holy Communion will complete the day.

Our grateful thanks go to the Friends of Tewin for funding the installation of specialised stabilising matting on the western verge of the driveway followed by re-seeding. This should prevent the quagmire which has hampered visitors to church and graveyard.

Tewin Village Hall has always been beautiful, now it can compete with commercial venues, thanks to a recent facelift.

The hall now has the high-standard facilities to hold all types of

event .There's a new, modern, kitchen with a range oven, a bar serving area. The toilets have been refurbished and there is disabled access and a hearing loop.

The décor has also been significantly improved and the windows and heating have been upgraded. There's also free Wi-Fi.

Local Efforts

It's all come about thanks to the fundraising efforts of Tewin residents, the volunteers on the Memorial Hall Committee, plus Biffa and National Lottery grants. The work has cost £113,000 but should attract many more people to the hall.

David Laming, chair of the Tewin Memorial Hall Committee, said "We needed to upgrade the hall's facilities to meet the increasing demands of our customers and stay ahead of other event venues in the area. The hall has hosted numerous wedding receptions and parties. It is also used for a bi-annual model railway exhibition, a training venue for local businesses, regular keep-fit sessions, and a pop-up restaurant. Plus it provides many events for the local community such as a regular film night shown in high definition and with surround sound."

Competitive Rates

The hall, which dates back to 1922, stands on the picturesque lower village green in Tewin. It has an imposing main hall with high ceilings and can seat up to 110 people, which makes it the perfect venue for large events such as wedding receptions, parties, business meetings and fairs. Furthermore, the hire rates are extremely competitive – much lower than you might think. To launch the hall as a new venue, a local Tewin business, **FP Mortimore -Website Creation & Development** www.fpmortimore.co.uk dedicated their time free of charge to create a website complete with gallery, hire rates and booking enquiry form.

"I use the hall regularly. It's the location of my children's pre-school and we attend many kids' parties there too. I also take part in Yoga and keep fit classes which run in the hall during weekday evenings. For me the hall is the centre of the community, so when I was approached to help promote the hall as an important local venue I was pleased to get involved." said Frankie Mortimore.

Everything in the garden is lovely

Our **Sensory Garden** is now completed. The weather has been kind providing sun and then some rain just in time for the new plants. We even managed to keep the newly laid turf green and lush!

The garden has been designed and constructed by Chris da Silva. This is his most ambitious scheme to date and one which he can be proud of. The garden is designed to create five separate areas for patients to enjoy, relating to the five different senses – Touch, Taste, Smell, Sight and Sound.

The Taste area incorporates planters for the patients' gardening club to grow their vegetables and herbs. The focus of the Touch area is a cinder block planter providing 'shelves' of plants with varying textures topped by a striking sculptured hand. In the Sound area we have a sheltered central sitting point with an active water feature, wind chimes and surrounded by rustling grasses.

An ornamental bridge (naturally it is wheelchair friendly) leads into the Smell area. Lots of scented plants and lavender- lined pathways. Finally the Sight area surrounds a beautiful spoon sculpture in memory of a patient with a great fondness for spoons – and ice cream! This space also includes a squirrel 'playground' designed and built by a friend of the designer who works at Shepreth Zoo.

This project has been entirely funded by the generous support given to the Friends.
