SEVENACRES DEVELOPMENT

Wall: - Taylor Wimpey has put steel sheeting down the side of the boundary wall on their side, has stitched the cracks and the temporary wall reinforcement has now been removed.

Trees: - East Herts Council has received a Landscape proposal, completed a site visit and is in the process of making a decision

on the way forward. There will be no further opportunity for local input.

<u>COMMUNITY DRIVE SAFE</u> - New Police Initiative

Drive Safe is a new initiative on speed monitoring in villages whereby residents are trained in using smiley face speed awareness equipment. Tewin Parish Council is very grateful to the two lead volunteers who have come forward to run this project and to the further 9 people who have signed the petition which has been sent to the Hertfordshire Police and Crime Commissioner for approval.

EAST HERTS DISTRICT PLAN CONSULTATION

The consultation period has now closed. The draft plan proposes that Tewin would become a Group 2 village with only infilling within the existing development boundary. There have been several objections to the draft plan, arguing that Tewin should remain a Group 1 village, and the boundary should be expanded to create space for more houses.

COMMON RAGWORT (Senecio Jacobaea)

This is a common weed found throughout the British Isles. However, it is very toxic to horses and other livestock and can have potentially fatal consequences if ingested either in its green or dried state.

Under the Weeds Act 1959 the Secretary of State may serve an enforcement notice on the occupier of land on which injurious weeds are growing, requiring the occupier to take action to prevent the spread of injurious weeds. The Weeds Act specifies **five** injurious weeds: Common Ragwort, Spear Thistle, Creeping of Field Thistle, Broad Leaved Dock and Curled Dock.

By promoting good practice and good neighbourliness it is hoped that this weed can be controlled.

If you find you have it in your garden please put rubber gloves on and remove the plant and either place it in the <u>black bin</u> or burn it to prevent livestock eating it. Fragments of root will remain in the ground so new growth will have to be monitored and removed year after year.

PLANNING APPLICATIONS

With regard to the planning application for conversion of an agricultural building into a 5 bedroomed dwelling on land to the rear of Upper Green, Tewin, Tewin Parish Council agreed to strongly support all parishioners' comments and whatever East Herts Council can do to oppose the approval of the application. They also pointed out that in the Supporting Document paragraph 1.1 there are two sentences referring to Upper Green:

- It is situated in open land to the west of Upper Green from which access will be gained.

- Pedestrian and vehicular access way will be via the new residential road from Upper Green commencing to the east of the Applicant's dwelling.

Since there is a village green called Upper Green and a highway called Upper Green, this can cause confusion. If EHC is mindful to approve this application, the Parish Council would like the approval notice to clearly state that vehicular access to the applicant's site must only be via the new road named Sevenacres adjacent to 56 Upper Green.

Screen On The Green

As part of the weekend of commemorative events for the start of World War One we will be showing the musical film made by Richard Attenborough of Joan Littlewood's Stratford East Theatre production of **"Oh What a Lovely War".** This is 2hrs 24 mins long with an amazing cast of Lawrence Olivier, Vanessa and Corin Redgrave, Maggie Smith, Dirk Bogarde and John Mills.

The film will be shown on Friday 1st August at the Memorial Hall.

As usual tickets, priced £4, will be on sale in advance at Tewin Stores, and **doors open at 7pm** for complimentary tea and coffee. You can also buy snacks at the bar and even bring your own refreshments (try doing that at the Odeon). The film starts at 7.45pm. We look forward to seeing you there.

<u>Tewin Memorial Hall</u>

Last month we heard how Tewin Memorial Hall was built with funds from Sir Otto Beit on land gifted by Lord Desborough in commemoration of those villagers who gave their lives in World War I.

Tewin was a very much smaller village then, with very little entertainment. The numerous public houses, where many still brewed their own ale, were the only outlets. No cinemas or television and with very few radios, the lack of bus services confined them to their locality. There were a few proud owners of "wireless sets" that received programmes via an aerial strung between two high posts in their back gardens but many still twiddled a "cat's whisker" on their "crystal sets" to obtain a faint sound.

Originally, there was a wall, level with the present large stage, and a door to the right led to "The Ladies Room" where there was a large kitchen and ladies only meeting area with a restroom to the right. A further door led from this area to the hallway.

The small "Kimberley Room" reminds us of the association of Sir Otto Beit with his diamond mines in South Africa and which provided him with a vast fortune.

The "Parish Room" was specially built for the use of the Rector of the Parish of Tewin. The whole building was managed by a Committee of an elected Chairman and Secretary, and one Member from each of the organisations using the Hall;- Football, Cricket, Horticulture, Bowls, Girl Guides, Boy Scouts, Mothers Union, Women's Institute and others.

In the Main Hall were darts boards, a billiard table and a radiogram for dancing and most evenings of the week there would be about 30 people using the facilities with up to 80 or 90 at weekends.

Old photographs show the huge hanging gas lamps, an open fireplace at each end of the main hall, a piano, games tables and folding wooden chairs.

It is recorded that some 90% of villagers belonged and paid an annual membership fee of five shillings per year. The Football Club ran a dance six times each year and other organisations two or three so that there was at least one dance each month. Crowds of up to 170 were quite usual with the entrance fee of 1/6d or 2/-(7.5 or 10p) and live bands played on Friday nights from 8pm until after midnight.

Friends of Danesbury & Queen Victoria Memorial Hospital

The Friends are often asked about the services now provided at Danesbury Neurological Centre and Queen Victoria Memorial Hospital. Both have played a big role in the community for years – in the case of QVM Hospital since 1902! – and many of us have good reason to be grateful for their help. However the nature of their work is constantly evolving according to the needs of the patients in their care.

For many years QVM Hospital was a 'Community' hospital for Welwyn, Codicote and Digswell. Now, as part of the Hertfordshire Community NHS Trust's Intermediate Care Team, it caters for patients who need rehabilitation following a stay in an acute hospital such as QE 2 or Lister. Patients have had a stroke, medical, surgical or orthopaedic condition and usually stay up to six weeks. During this period staff strive to help patients reach their potential and maximise their independence.

Danesbury was built in 1993 and is now a Neurological Centre. The main work of the centre is now to provide a variety of treatment options for adults with neurological problems. Patients referred to Danesbury may have conditions such a Stroke, Multiple Sclerosis, Parkinson's Disease, Motor Neurone Disease, Acquired Brain Injury (ABI), neurosurgery following brain tumours and many other related conditions. Joining the nursing team there are Physiotherapists, Occupation Therapists, Dieticians, Psychologists, and Specialist Parkinson's and MS nurses. There are facilities for both in-patients and out-patients.
