#### <u>Flag Pole</u>

Tewin Parish Council would like to apologise for the lack of St Patrick's Day flag recently. This was because the halyard had been unhooked and pulled to the top of the flagpole where it got stuck. We would like to thank the local farmer for taking the time to retrieve the halyard.

#### 388 Bus Route

Herts County Council has advised Tewin Parish Council that the 388 bus will not be able to operate a hail and ride bus stop on Upper Green Road between Harwood and Godfries Close. This is because it is not deemed safe for the bus to stop as the road is bendy and the visibility is impaired for both oncoming traffic and traffic behind the bus.

#### New Police Initiative – Community Drive Safe

Drive Safe is a new initiative on speed monitoring in villages whereby residents are trained in using smiley face speed awareness equipment. #### Superfast Broadband

Herts County Council has received formal confirmation that they have been successful in their funding bid to upgrade the Bulls Green exchange which covers Tewin Wood and Datchworth. More information on the next stage and timescales is expected in May. Tewin Parish Council would like to thank everyone for their support by providing us with your letters and emails, and registrations to support the bid.

#### Tewin Parish Council - Chairman's Report 2013-14

This past year began with success for our long campaign to get Upper Green Road and Orchard Road re-surfaced. We also cleared ditches, which reduced the flooding at Lousehole Bottom on the road to Hertford, but we are still waiting for Highways to finish the job by clearing a road gulley. We re-surfaced Footpath 11 above 100 Year Wood to make it passable in wet weather.

Two disabled parking bays were installed at the car park on Upper Green. The CIC had a successful year in hiring out the Upper Green Pavilion, and arrangements have been made to provide extra storage space.

We have supported a campaign which appears to have achieved the go-ahead for the installation of super fast broadband on the Bull's Green exchange serving Tewin Wood.

Friends of Tewin donated the permanent Christmas tree that we planted on Lower Green.

Hopefully the major building works at Sevenacres, the old Tewin Garage, and Grass Warren will be completed this year, and we can turn our attention to repairing the damaged verges etc. We successfully campaigned for the new section of road at Grass Warren, which we hope will make life easier for the local residents. We are still involved in discussions about the dead conifers, the unsafe wall, and the flooding at the Sevenacres site. We have been successful in getting Section 106 monies from the Sevenacres development allocated to providing a new footway between the village and Upper Green. The downside is that it can only be done as an official Highways project. Thank you to all residents who responded to a recent public consultation on the plans for this project. We are also hoping to get a permanent repair to the kerb along the north side of Lower Green, but we may have to do some temporary work in the meantime.

The hole on the south side of Lower Green also needs a permanent repair and we are waiting on Highways to agree to repair the broken gulley pipe which is the cause of the recurring problem.

Consultation on the draft of the new District Plan is currently underway. There are a number of stages to go through yet, but if there are no upsets, Tewin will become a Group 2 village with the existing village boundary, which basically means that there is much less scope for house building over the life of this plan to 2031.

For 2014-15, the parish precept will be £28000. This is spread over a few more houses this year, with the net result that the parish portion of the Council Tax for a Band D house will be £34.69, an increase of 82 pence, or 2.4%, over the previous year. The precept is our only regular source of income. We are not like a District Council, which can freeze its Council Tax but increase charges elsewhere. We currently receive payments under the New Homes Bonus, but they are not guaranteed.

Finally, thank you to my fellow Parish Councillors, the Parish Clerk, our District Councillors, our new County Councillor and our MP, for their help and support through the year. Also a thank you on behalf of parishioners to all the volunteers who run the various village institutions and societies that help make Tewin a great place to live. Welcome to new residents, and I would encourage everybody to join in with the community. Even with modern busy lives, there are various events in the village where you can help just for a day. You get to meet new people and it is great fun.

### Team Vicar's Letter

By the time you read this I will be hungry. To be honest it is not something I have often been. It is not something I am looking forward to.

I am not great at self-denial. During Lent I have given up alcohol but have noticed that this has been largely replaced by chocolate. I have never managed a diet that has lasted more than three weeks – and even when dieting I have a large supply of tasteless rice cakes, or something of the sort, to keep at bay those hunger pangs.

But at the beginning of May I will spend 5 days with a food budget of just  $\pounds 5$  and I am already anxious.  $\pounds 1$  a day for all food and drink. What would you spend it on?

But across the world 1 billion children live on less than that for all of their needs. UNICEF estimate that during the 5 day period where I may feel hunger 27,500 of those children will die from malnutrition.

So challenged by UNICEF and Christian Aid this is my tiny gesture. By it I hope to raise a bit of sponsor money for Christian Aid and to donate the money I don't spend on food to their work also.

But the gesture is tiny. My family might have to put up with me being a bit grumpy I suppose, but at the end of it I will be able to eat as I wish. I won't die, like many children will. Today.

May  $11^{\text{th}} - 17^{\text{th}}$  is Christian Aid week. If you see an envelope through your door please be generous. Christian Aid works with some of the world's poorest people in some of the world's most difficult places. Not just to provide short-term aid, but predominantly to help people lift themselves out of poverty. Alternatively you can donate on line at www.christianaid.org.uk

### **St Peter's News**

The "old" Parochial Church Council (PCC) met for the last time shortly before the church's Annual General Meeting on 24<sup>th</sup> March. Sadly a number of members have retired from the PCC, amongst them were Mike Kersey and Ted Sharp who have both given dedicated service to the church over many years. Their expertise and advice on church matters will be sorely missed within the PCC but we hope it will still be available on a less formal basis for a long time to come. Business and other commitments have also precluded Mark Swann and Trevor Land offering their services for the coming year but their contribution has also been greatly appreciated.

We are pleased to welcome two new members to the PCC following their election at the AGM. They are Elaine Fowler and Matthew Stallard. Myra Walker is to join the committee later in the year.

At the AGM in the Memorial Hall it was reported that the church's funds are in good shape; however, following the quinquennial inspection by our architect we shall have to give high priority to repair and restoration work on the fabric of the church, as recommended in his report.

You may have learned that during the last year or so the PCC and its Building Committee have spent many hours exploring and discussing how best to provide extra space at the church. Unfortunately no agreement could be reached on what format this should take so it has been agreed to shelve the project for the present time.

The school packed the church before their Easter break with a service also attended by many parents and friends.

It is pleasing to note that the verges on either side of the driveway are starting to recover following the winter rains. It is hoped to undertake some further remedial work during the next few months but we would ask everyone to take particular care should the inclement weather return, and especially in the area towards the gate where the verge slopes most steeply towards the hedge. Finally, as some of you may have noticed, the space available in the churchyard for graves and burials in the memorial garden has become quite limited. We are therefore pleased to report that we are well advanced in securing another section of glebe land from the field alongside the churchyard, which will give us capacity for many years to come. #### CMS Church Mission Society

In March we received a link letter from Dave & Rine Ingleby giving news of their work in Delhi.

The family have moved to a new flat and Joanna, now 5, has started school. Sem has quite a long journey to school each day and must find it very different from the school he attended here for 4 months last year. Dave continues with planning and building houses for slum dwellers and, thanks to a generous donation, 8 houses have been built. Each house has 1 downstairs room and 1 upstairs with a private toilet. These offer so much to the families who move in. Rine's work ,'Sugandh', where she and others work in areas of Livelihoods, Children at Risk, Healthcare, etc, suddenly found that they were to lose their funding. They have until July to find other funding. Rine states that funders are struggling to raise monies due to 3 things: the economic downturn, India's being seen by the West as a growing economic power and it being harder to raise funds for urban India. Funders now wish to focus on rural areas. So, the letter from Dave & Rine was full of concerns for the poor and slum dwellers and for the high infant mortality rate. In Delhi in 2012, 3 million babies died within 28 days of birth as a consequence of slum dwelling.. They also write of the political situation, violence and racist attacks, and the uncertainty for the poor people of India.

As usual, Dave & Rine and the children send us all their good wishes and thank us for our support and prayers. Elizabeth Wilson

#### St Peters Church Harrogate -A Positive Outcome

In February, my wife Anne and myself spent three days in Harrogate, a very pleasant Yorkshire Town famous in the early 20<sup>th</sup> Century for its spa waters attracting aristocracy including the Czar cousin whose daughter was baptized in St Peter's Church Harrogate in 1912.

Passing the Church a few times we decided to go inside. We saw a lovely prayer tree and hope this idea might be taken home to Tewin. There were some ladies at a table, this is called the welcoming team and we got chatting to them. In many ways there are similarities between St Peter's Harrogate and St Peter's Tewin but of course differences in scale.

Though St Peter's Harrogate is a big church, it enjoyed popularity and affluence in the 1910's and 1920's. After the war and into the 60's and 70's its congregation declined and in the late 1970's the congregation was down to 29! Consideration was given to selling the site to Marks and Spencer. This was resisted and the church tried to continue despite soaring costs.

In 1995, the present vicar, Rev Tony Shepherd, (a good name for a vicar) came to the Church and things began to turn around. Letters were sent out to the town and alterations began to take place slowly. Moss gathered, in so much as four years ago a new hall was added, a glassed in area for Sunday school, a Church office, a music room, a lift to the hall and the frontage of the Church completely changed. This  $\pounds 2 \ 1/2$ million project finished last year.

Today St Peter's Harrogate Church flourishes with no less than 6 services on Sunday and numerous meetings in the week. As their Church warden reports in this week's weekly news under

#### Lies damned lies and statistics!

"The Vicar and Wardens have been busy going carefully through registers and lists to answer the questions as accurately as possible to Church House, London. You might be interested to know average Sunday attendance is 421 over the 5 services. Adults who come at least once a month is 560 with over 270 children and young people. In 2013 there were over 40 Baptisms"

Not bad when this Church might have been sold with only 29 members! A positive story .

Visiting St Peter's Harrogate and seeing and hearing their solutions gave Anne and myself heart that there are many things we can achieve in Tewin but on a smaller scale. Have a visit should you ever be in Harrogate. Trevor Land

#### Do you need help with climbing stairs, getting in or out of the bath or accessing your property?

Disabled Facilities Grants are available from East Herts Council to help residents safely access and use the facilities and rooms in their homes. They can include stairlifts, showers, ramps or other adaptations.

Owner occupiers, tenants or landlords on behalf of their tenants can apply. The grants are subject to a means test of the applicant and their partner. The means test is different to others carried out for Benefits or Carer's help and the outcome is often more generous. Even if you have been refused other benefits you may be eligible so it is worth asking for an assessment. There is no means test if the adaptations are for children under 16 or young persons under 20, where Child Benefit is still claimed for them.
