PROPOSED HIGHWAYS FOOTPATH ALONG UPPER GREEN ROAD

The Parish Council has agreed that Hertfordshire Highways should proceed with a detailed design based on their latest plan. This will basically complete a footpath from Godfries Close all the way up to the entrance to the Upper Green car park. The plan still includes a narrow footpath with a

lowered curb in front of 76/78 Upper Green Road, but this has passed two separate safety audits. During the discussions about this footpath, the Parish Council has become aware that pedestrians adopt a number of different policies as to the best place to cross the road, and this will no doubt continue to be true.

It is still proposed to remove the multi-trunked ash tree on the verge opposite Tewin Hill. Professional opinion is that the multiple stems are not a natural configuration for an ash tree and are not conducive to its long term health. Removal of other trees has been minimised and replacement trees will be planted.

This footpath will be largely funded by Section 106 monies arising from the development of Sevenacres. Implementation is expected in 2015/16. Highways decided not to make greater use of the verge along the western side of Upper Green Road because it meant that all the driveways would have to be rebuilt to conform to modern standards for the maximum lateral slope of a footpath. There was also opposition from East Herts Council to any proposal to culvert the ditch. The Parish Council will continue to consider its options for the future of the ditch.

BONFIRES

Bonfires can be a nuisance - the smoke and smells can ruin residents' enjoyment of their property, preventing them from opening windows, hanging washing out and can prevent them from enjoying being in their own garden. They can also have damaging health effects, particularly in susceptible people- such as children, asthmatics and those with heart and chest problems.

<u>Please be considerate of your neighbours and aware of weather conditions</u> <u>when lighting a bonfire.</u> If the air is still the smoke may linger and if it is too windy, smoke may blow into neighbouring properties causing nuisance or across roads causing danger.

If someone is causing you a nuisance by lighting a bonfire at an inconvenient time you should first try to talk to them, it is likely that they may not have realised that their activities could be causing a nuisance and disturbing others. If there is a persistent nuisance that you are unable to resolve informally, it would be worth keeping a record of time/duration of incidents and then you can contact Environmental Health on (01279) 655261 and explain the problem to them.

Instead of having a bonfire, there are other, far less environmentally damaging methods of disposal such as composting, using the brown bin, shredding or taking your garden waste to the Household Waste Recycling Centres (the dump).

BEWARE OF OPPORTUNIST THIEVES

Please be on your guard. A resident recently cutting his hedge, just went inside for a couple of minutes, and came out to find his hedge cutter had been stolen.

Team Vicar's Letter

There is a lot of fun you can have with children and the story of Jonah. At preschool and in Story Club we have enjoyed Jonah the Moaner and imagined what it was like to be gobbled up by a whale. The best bit is always practising our acting skills as we vomit Jonah on to the beach – a good excuse for all sorts of sound effects.

The story of Jonah is a story of a man who doesn't want to think about people who are not like him. God wants him to tell the people of Ninevah to stop doing wrong and start doing good, but Jonah cannot imagine why God should be bothered with that city of people. He has no interest in them himself – and so he turns in the opposite direction. The large fish swallowing him whole is God's rather creative way of putting Jonah in his place (literally and metaphorically) as he spits him out on the shore-line where he wants him to be.

It is a quirky tale. Yet the story took on a new significance during a prayer vigil recently at St Michael's Church in Woolmer Green. Ninevah, now known as Mosul, sits in modern day Iraq and we had gathered for three hours one evening to pray for the people there who have fled their homes after the arrival of ISIL. "All shall turn from their evil ways and the violence in their hands" says the King of Ninevah in Jonah's time and this three thousand year old desire became our prayer too.

Earlier this year we were privileged in Datchworth to meet with Sarjon Toma, an Iraqi Christian who was visiting the UK to speak about the work of Christian Aid.

In August this year we were sent a message from him which spoke of the death of several of his relatives who lived around Mosul. It made a story which seems very far away seem much closer to home.

On the evening of November 22nd at Welwyn St. Mary's School Hall the Welwyn Team of churches will be holding an Auction of Promises. All money raised will go to help displaced people in Iraq through the Foundation of Relief and Reconciliation in the Middle East. There are two things you can do to support this event 1) think if you have a skill or talent we could auction that evening (cake baking, sewing, painting, gardening, car-washing etc) 2) come and bid on the evening itself. Looking back to September, there was the usual spectacular Harvest-time display of flowers and plants in the church, plus lots of other gifts of various kinds. At the Sunday service John Mead from the Stevenage Food Bank described their valuable work in the district and suitable items were sent to them. The Harvest collection of £228 at the morning service has gone to "Embrace the Middle East" to benefit their Olive Tree Project. This helps local farmers in Palestine replace their valuable olive trees which have been wiped out during many years of occupation and conflict.

After the Harvest service 28 of us, seated in the chancel and tower, enjoyed a lovely buffet lunch organized by Pauline Brown and Nicky Hadley. Many thanks to them for all their efforts.

On 13th September sponsored cyclists and walkers from around the district visited St Peter's as part of the annual Bike & Hike in aid of the Beds & Herts Historic Churches Trust.

50% of funds raised support the Trust's work; the rest goes to the participator's church.

As autumn moves into winter we are going to have the10 yew trees round the war memorial and west door of the tower trimmed back. It is over 10 years since they were last done and they badly need a good haircut.

The project to enlarge the churchyard is moving forward despite being dogged by expensive and time-consuming new procedures and red tape; but, when finished, it will be a valuable extension which will serve the local community for several decades to come.

Ahead of us we have a special memorial service on 2^{nd} November when there will be an opportunity to remember loved ones who have died; the annual Remembrance service on 9^{th} and then the Christmas Market in Tewin Memorial Hall on 29^{th} Please make a note in your diaries NOW! Bike 'N Hike 2014

The annual sponsored Bike 'N Hike in aid of the Beds and Herts Historic Churches Trust took place on Saturday 13th September. The amount raised has not yet been finalised but it is likely to be in the region of £700, half of which will go to St Peter's and half to the Trust. Thanks as always go to those who cycled and to those who helped with the check-in desk or baked cakes for visiting cyclists. The following is an account by Joanne and Malcolm Allen of their trip around the churches which will hopefully inspire others to actively participate next year.

'The weather was great; ideal cycling conditions really - no rain, not too hot, and a light wind which was behind us on the home stretch. We met our target of visiting 20 churches and covered 43 miles in the process (taking account of a quarter mile returning home to collect the water bottles we left in the 'fridge). We left at 10.00 am and our first stop was Datchworth. We went on to Aston and the Bennington. In each case we chatted with the lady signing us in and spent time in the church learning some of the local history. Leaving Bennington at 11.30 we realised that we needed to up the pace if we were to be home before dark. In Walkern we were greeted by friends (who lined the streets!) and checked off two churches. We pressed on to Ardley and then Cottered (only just squeezing past some roadworks which threatened to derail our journey). After three churches in Buntingford we moved on to Aspenden and Westmill. Lunch at Westmill Tea Room and then back home via Great Munden, Sacombe, Watton at Stone (two churches), Stapleford, Waterford and Bramfield. We arrived at St Peter's as the clock was striking six and the Churchwarden was locking up.

It was a lovely day. We looked in all the churches that were open and were particularly struck by the Buntingford United Reformed Church (in the style of St. Martin's in the Field), St. Peter's Church, Bennington, and St. Mary's Church at Aspenden where there are some beautiful coloured brass carvings. However, we could see that much needs to be done to preserve these beautiful buildings and we were pleased to mobilise support for this good cause. On the positive side we were pleased to see some restoration which has taken place aided by money from this charity. It was also a wonderful way to celebrate the 42nd anniversary of our first date!'

The Autumn Jumble Sale proved to be another winner with record takings of $\pounds4,100.92$, with extra monies still to be added (we don't count the money until it is in our Treasurer's hands). There will be some deductions for advertising, catering and hire of the marquees, but we have well exceeded previous takings. It's worth noting that in 2007, for example, our Autumn Jumble Sale takings were £1,682, and the figure has grown ever since, until we have reached this year's magnificent sum.

The Memorial Hall Committee therefore thank everyone who contributed in any way. We had a record number of donations, for which we are very grateful, and an amazing amount of help from members of the community, especially our regular 'Jumblers' who started setting out tables, collecting large items, and sorting on Friday afternoon and evening, then again on the Saturday morning, continuing right through to closure on the Saturday. This resulted in a very successful day, when we were blessed with dry weather and many visitors. In fact one gentleman told us he had started queueing before 11.30am and the numbers grew steadily until the doors opened at 2pm. Visitors were again able to enjoy some refreshment, including hotdogs, bacon rolls etc. and this, together with the tremendous variety of goods on sale, made for a very happy event. In addition, we were pleased to be able to donate many of the unsold items to local charity shops. Our sincere thanks go to everyone who made this sale such a success. As well as the people who made donations, we particularly wish to thank all those who worked so hard - far too many to mention by name but our grateful thanks go to them all. It's worth recording that one lady who came along to donate remarked that Tewin has such a happy atmosphere. Most people would agree with her sentiments and it is particularly evident at events such as the Jumble Sale with its wonderful community spirit, so we look forward to the next one on 14th March, when we hope to repeat our Autumn success.
