BUS CONSULTATION - MAJOR REDUCTION TO 388 BUS SERVICE THROUGH TEWIN

A new bus consultation started on 19th January 2015 and will be running for 12 weeks until 10th April 2015

The new consultation proposes to remove support for services with a subsidy above £3.50 per passenger journey. The 388 currently has a subsidy of £5.55. Apart from the school runs, the 388 would be replaced by one "shopping" trip per day, probably to Welwyn Garden City (Tues/Thurs/Fri) and Hertford (Mon/Wed/Sat).

If the proposals are agreed the impact on services will commence from September 2015.

So I did a bit of thinking and watching and then decided that, if they are staying, perhaps I should make an effort to be friends. I love friends. They make me excited. And bouncy. Very bouncy. And my owners said 'no; that's not how you should behave'.

So then I thought, if I'm not allowed to play with the kittens, well I'll just look for other benefits about them staying. I spied the new feeding bowls... My owners said 'no; that's not how you should behave'.

So now I am trying it their way and it means doing it less my way. When I want to rush in, I am trying to sit still. When they are being fed, I try very hard to abstain. And now I find the kittens, instead of all that rude hissing are starting to come near me. And if I am very gentle – they even let me sniff their bottoms. I think we will be friends.

So you see this discipline and self-denial it's not just about giving up stuff, it's about cultivating a whole new way of being. It's training; learning patience and self-restraint. That's not easy. But in doing this I am beginning to see new worlds opening; new ways of loving and being loved.

Of course when those kittens finally meet the birds in the garden, I will expect them to do the same.

A message from Tewin Cowper CE School

For the past couple of weeks, all the children have been engaged in Design and Technology projects in the afternoons. We have had an amazing range of skills being used and developed including bread making, designing and making pasties, investigating, designing and making models of playground equipment and designing and making models using cams and followers as the moving mechanism. We have been pleased with our sports achievements this week. In the second round of the Hope Cup we had a football match against Bengeo and what a tense one it was! After 5 minutes, we were 2-0 down. By then we had warmed up and pulled back 3 goals to make it 3-2 at half-time. So the second half began... and the battle for goals! We just could not find the net and somehow Bengeo managed to score 2 more. The following evening, we had a match against Thundridge and this time the result was in our favour -7-0! Meanwhile on the netball court, our team was battling it out against Thundridge netball team and the result was a mind-blowing 16-3 to us! We are now half-way through the academic year and very pleased with the progress the children have made so far; we are looking forward to parent consultations at the end of March, when parents will have the opportunity to discuss their child's progress with their teacher and look proudly at their work. If you intend to come along, either on your own or with a partner, please tell Steve Stott tel: 01438 717680 E-mail: Stephen.stott@which.net In May 1995, to celebrate the fiftieth anniversary of the end of the 1939-1945 Second World War in Europe, an Exhibition was held in the Memorial Hall with Memorabilia and Records of that long conflict from the 3rd September 1939 to the 8th May 1945. (The War in the Far East, however, against Japan did not end until August 1945)

People of Tewin who lived throughout those years were asked to record their Memories and these are some of those comments

"Cream and red coloured "Birch Buses" ran from Welwyn North Station to Bedford via Codicote and Hitchin and were a very convenient way to attend the larger shops and the large Wednesday market at Hitchin".

"Many homes had "Anderson" shelters in their gardens. There was a slit-trench for the children by the side of the school".

"There was a "Lion Head" pump on Lower Green where some people obtained their water supply and children could take a drink whilst playing or watching rounders cricket or football".

"One day five airmen who had landed at Panshanger Aerodrome came to South Lodge where we lived and asked my mother to cook them a roast dinner. They gave her a large joint of beef and vegetables. While they were there they wrote their names in my Bible".

"Arnhem. One day we saw a whole lot of planes going over the village. They were towing gliders. They flew from west to east. The sky was full of them. We watched until they had all gone".

"The Rifle Range at Dawley Wood was used by the Home Guard".

"During the War there were German and Italian prisoners of war working on Mr Barton's farm".

"Newspapers, silver paper and tin were collected and stored in the Summer House at the back of the Memorial Hall".

"A bomb fell in a field at the back of Tewin Garage in 1941. Besides blowing in various windows and doors, it killed Mrs Munn's chickens and goats, and all the sparrows that nested in the nearby hedge.
