BUS CONSULTATION - MAJOR REDUCTION TO 388 BUS SERVICE THROUGH TEWIN

The new consultation proposes to remove support for services with a subsidy above £3.50 per passenger journey. HCC has calculated the subsidy for the 388 at £5.55. The 388 would

run as the school bus only (not school holidays). Other buses (202/203, 378/379) run from Tewin in the late morning and provide one "shopping" trip per day, probably to Welwyn Garden City (Tues/Thurs/Fri) and Hertford (Mon/Wed/Fri). There would be <u>no</u> bus service through Tewin on a Saturday and <u>none</u> to Welwyn North.

If the proposals are agreed the impact on services will commence from September 2015. The bus consultation closes on 10th April. Further information and an online response form are available at https://consult.hertsdirect.org/bus-services/

PLEASE SIGN THE "STOP THE 388 BUS SERVICE CUTS" PETITION

The petition is open until 10th April 2015 please sign the <u>e-petition</u> by following the link on the Tewin Village website OR sign the <u>paper petition</u> at Tewin Stores & Tewin Memorial Hall. Both petitions are identical and all signatures collected on both will be submitted except for duplicates. On 23rd February 2015 Tewin Parish Council held a Parish Meeting with a talk given by Tom Hennessey, Business Manager for HCC Transport Access and Safety, Guy Brigden, Team Leader, Transport Network Planning Team Leader (HCC Transport Access & Safety). The meeting was very well attended and there was a strong level of objection to the proposed changes to the 388 bus services. The attendees resolved unanimously to "call upon the Hertfordshire County Council to maintain the present 388 bus service from Hertford to Welwyn Garden City for the benefit and convenience of parishioners and others (for shopping, medical appointments and inter-connections)."

At the Parish Council meeting on 2nd March Tewin Parish Council unanimously agreed to formally respond to Herts County Council concerning the proposed changes to the bus services. The Parish Council agreed to compose a press article, a new poster and if necessary produce a further newsletter for parishioners. They agreed to request Herts County Councillor Ken Crofton to arrange a meeting with relevant members of the Herts County Council and also agreed to obtain an appointment with Sir Oliver Heald QC MP at his Tewin surgery on 21st March. The Parish Council continues to investigate the real level of funding per passenger journey particularly in view of certain discrepancies in the passenger numbers. The Parish Council will be presenting the "Stop the 388 bus service cuts" petition to the Highways and Waste Management Panel on 12th May 2015 at 10am and will address the panel for three minutes on the matter.

DriveSafe



April will see the Herts Police DriveSafe campaign get under way in Tewin. This will use a speed-monitor camera at different locations on certain days to check the speed of cars going through the village. The aim is to improve speed-awareness and safety. A smile from the camera means under 30 mph. Cars which the

camera logs going above the speed limit may receive a written advisory from Herts police (or stronger penalty if persistent speeding).

Cameras do act as an effective deterrent to traffic speeding through villages and the majority of speeders are often local drivers! So, EVERYONE who reads this can help to improve speed-awareness in and through Tewin by :

- always Driving Safely, within the speed limit and with care for other road users, including pedestrians and cyclists

- Volunteering to help with the camera / logging if you can spare an occasional hour.

YEW TREES

ST PETER'S CHURCHYARD

The War Memorial with its design of a Crusader's Sword and Ship is the work of Sir Herbert Baker, known for his work in Delhi and for the India House in London.

The earliest known grave in the churchyard is of Ralph Boteler who died, aged 63, on 31st January 1644. His grave, and three others of the Boteler family, is under the East window of the church. The family lived at Queen Hoo Manor House from 1663-1682 and are related to those whose memorial slabs are in the sanctuary of the church.

The large grave to the West of the South door is that of Mr Alfred Beit. Alfred Beit was a pioneer with Cecil Rhodes in South Africa and Rhodesia. He died in 1906 and under his will the Beit Railway Trust was established to develop transport communications in Northern and Southern Rhodesia (now Zambia and Zimbabwe). It provided funds to build most of the great bridges in Central Africa and also four hundred smaller bridges in rural areas. The Beit Trust still exists and makes grants for social and educational purposes in Zambia, Zimbabwe and Malawi.

Sir Otto Beit, the brother of Alfred Beit, lived at Tewin Water and was responsible for the building of Tewin Memorial Hall on land given by Lord Desborough of Panshanger. His son, Theodore Beit, died during the First World War and there is a tablet to him on the North wall of the church.

By the East wall of the churchyard are tombstones for the Carringtons, Dennes, Feilds, and Hopkyns, all prominent figures in the life of the village, whose deeds are well recorded in parish documents. A little apart to the south are stones to the memory of John Carrington and his wife. For some time he was at Bacon's Farm on the Hertford Road, where he wrote a diary of the day-to-day events of the district, with comments on the local inhabitants of the day. They give a detailed account of parish life during the late 18th and 19th centuries. The Tomb in the churchyard most frequently visited by visitors from all over the world is that of Lady Anne Grimston,widow of Samuel Grimston, who died in November 1713 at Tewin House. This is found within the iron railing at the East of the churchyard and, as noted in St. Peter's News on page 18, has recently had a facelift. A legend has grown around this lady that she was a Sadducean and therefore did not believe in the Resurrection of the Dead.

She was reputed to have said, "If, indeed, there is life hereafter trees will render asunder my tomb." For over 200 years trees have forced their limbs through the tomb to raise their branches in rejoicing. That Lady Anne was not, however, a Sadducean can clearly be seen in her notes of accounts of monies spent in putting up her horses when she drove from her home, Gorhambury, St Albans, to Tewin each Sunday for worship, calling to remembrance that it was on the First Day of the week that her Lord and Master rose from the grave.

John Steal, Curate of Tewin in 1843, deplored the superstition which had arisen around the tomb, and that "those who are led from mere curiosity and pastime be not heedless of those vows which, as professing Christians, they have solemnly made before God 'to renounce the world, the flesh and the Devil', being assured in their Baptism of a Life which brings 'death unto sin and new birth unto righteousness' A sure and certain hope of the resurrection to eternal life," May the visitor say, "Blessed are the dead which die in the Lord, for they rest from their labours."

Team Vicar's Letter

In the last series of the BBC sitcom 'Rev', Adam Smallbone, vicar of St. Saviours in the Marshes, is having a breakdown. His faith, marriage and church are crumbling and it seems as if the world has turned against him. In a profoundly moving scene, Adam is pictured alone carrying the weight of a large wooden cross through the dark streets of London; people stare and spit. At the break of dawn he climbs a grassy hill which overlooks the high-rise towers of the city. It is there he meets Christ.

There is no instant recognition. Christ, shaggy-haired in a shellsuit, can of lager in hand, is perhaps not what Adam was expecting, yet Christ it is. He dances with Adam in Adam's madness. He speaks in riddles which seem to make little wordly sense. Yet Adam remains trapped in his despair. A man who has spent so many years in prayer and learning, does not recognize God when they are face to face.

But finally there is a moment. When Christ touches Adam on the shoulder – and uses his name. 'Adam', he says. It is in that second that Adam knows who he meets.

When Mary Magdalene meets the risen Jesus in the garden, she too fails to recognize him at first. This was the man she loved and followed and yet in her deep despair and grief she is unable to see his presence. She assumes him to be the gardener. Yet Jesus speaks her name 'Mary', he says – and she immediately responds 'Lord'.

For Adam and for Mary, Jesus calling them by name was strange enough. It is as if that one small word, spoken by Christ, shows an understanding of all the grief and sorrow, hopes and desires, ability and fragility of who they are. And through His knowledge of who they are, sparks their knowledge of who He is; deeply loving, determinedly life-giving, the one in whom our true identities are made known.

And so Adam and Mary, through their encounters with the Risen Christ, experience their own resurrections. As the sun begins its slow climb which lightens the sky, so too Adam and Mary begin to move from their night into a new day.

The Risen Christ may not always look as we were expecting, but he calls each one of us by name. In doing so he shows us to be fully known and fully loved. This is where our own resurrections begin, where dawn breaks through and new life emerges.

After several weeks of having builders in and around the church there is now a lull in proceedings. The stonework, mainly around the windows, replacement of roof tiles and internal plastering have been completed. The builders will return to paint when the plaster is dry, rebuild the end pillar of the red brick wall when the frosts are over and to work in the porch, April being the time when least disturbance will be caused to the bats.

The removal of old plaster in the church caused a large amount of dust in spite of the builders' valiant efforts to keep it to a minimum. This makes this year's Annual Spring Clean on Friday evening May 8th and Saturday May 9th all the more important. Please come and help: every contribution, however small, will be much appreciated. There will be a 'Sign up' sheet with more details at the back of the church.

Those familiar with the churchyard may have noticed that Lady Ann Grimston's tomb has received a face lift. This resulted from East Herts District Council advising us that they were going to put the tomb on their Listed Monuments At Risk register. With the backing of English Heritage, we were able to convince them that a 'total restoration' was inappropriate considering the legend that "my tomb will be rent asunder by trees if there is indeed an afterlife". We fervently hope that the tidy up accomplished by our builders will suffice to keep us off EHDC's 'naughty list'!

It is always a pleasure to have the children of Tewin Cowper School in church especially when accompanied by parents and grandparents. On March 13th they came for their Family Service, which was led by the Ladybird class, to celebrate families in general and mothers in particular. We look forward to welcoming them again on the last day of term for their Easter Service and hope that some of them will come to the Easter Activity afternoon on Easter Saturday.

St Peter's Annual Parochial Church Meeting will be held on April 27 in the Memorial Hall. Malcolm and I will not be standing for re-election so I personally would like to take this opportunity to thank the PCC, the congregation of St Peter's and the wider community both in Tewin and surrounding villages for all your help and support over the past eight years. ANOTHER NEW YEAR - SURELY NOT?

Yes, it's another new Tax Year coming up on 6^{th} April. For complicated historical reasons the tax year runs to 5^{th} April, not 31^{st} December. So sooner or later those who have to file tax returns will have the pleasure (?) of once again addressing themselves to that worthy (?) task!

Whilst payment of tax is a real burden for many, it also has advantages for charities like St Peter's. Those who pay tax and Gift Aid their giving to St Peter's make it possible for us to recover the tax paid on the sums donated. For the last few years we were able to recover about £8,000 of tax on such giving, making an invaluable contribution to church funds.

New year resolutions may not be for everyone but the new tax year could be just the time for people to review their level of giving to St Peter's. An increasing number of supporters give through bank standing orders, which are both regular and convenient. However, it is easy to forget how long they have remained at the same level. So if this applies to your giving to St Peter's, perhaps you would make a new (tax) year resolution to review the level and instruct your bank to adjust the payments for the coming year. Operation Gnome - Protecting Gardens and Allotments

As the first signs of spring are starting to appear in gardens and allotments across the county, Hertfordshire Constabulary is launching Operation Gnome, a new initiative to help remind residents to keep their gardens, outbuildings and allotments secure.

Spring is traditionally a time when burglars target sheds, garages and outbuildings, looking for power tools, bikes and other expensive items stored in them. They also look for tools left in gardens such as spades, garden forks and ladders, which can be used to help them break into homes.

These are some of the ways you can make your outbuildings more secure:

- Always lock your shed, preferably with two 'hasp and staple' locks (one near the top and one near the bottom of the door) or use an alarmed padlock
- Secure your rear garden by locking entry gates with a padlock
- Burglars can use garden tools to break in, so make sure you securely lock away any tools after use
- Ensure boundary fences are secure and in good condition. Spiky plants along garden boundaries are good additional deterrents
- Tools and gardening equipment should be visibly marked with your postcode and house number this can deter thieves and help police identify the rightful owner
- Remember to lock your garage door securely. Metal 'up and over' doors can be secured with extra locks fitted either side and/ or a floor-mounted locking 'T' bar with a closed shackle padlock. Wooden garage doors can be secured with two substantial hasps and staple locks and closed shackle padlocks (your local DIY store can advise on the most secure options)
