The Road Safety Roadshow Comes to Welwyn Garden City

Failing to look properly has been the cause of almost half of the road accidents in Hertfordshire over the last five years.

In order to help drivers stay focused on the task at hand Hertfordshire firefighters are coming to Welwyn Garden City town centre on Tuesday 9th June, giving people the chance to test their skills at spotting danger on the road and offering free advice.

The Roadshow will become the town's centrepiece for the day, with a fire engine – which children can pretend to drive, a Peg Car (to demonstrate the process of how a fire crew gains access into a crashed car to save people's lives), a fire bike, a police crash car and the Fire Information Unit – displaying road safety messages and housing an area where people can test their perception skills.

Cllr Bernard Sarson, Welwyn Hatfield's Executive Member for Business and Partnerships, added: "We hope many people will come along and learn vital information about road safety. This advice could be the difference between life and death."

Beware of EuroMillions Scam

Hertfordshire County Council is asking residents to be on the alert for a lottery scam operating in the county.

The council's Trading Standards team is currently receiving reports of letters arriving out of the blue telling people they have won £725,000 in the EuroMillions FIFA World Cup Super Lottery. These letters, apparently sent from 39 St James Street London and from an address in Zurich, Switzerland, go on to say that in order to claim the cash prize the recipient must telephone the number on the letter. On doing so they are told that they must first pay a 1% processing fee and provide their bank details.

Roy Wilsher, Director of Community Protection, said: "These letters are a scam. You cannot win a prize in a lottery that you have not entered and genuine lottery operators will not ask you to send them money before releasing winnings. I would urge anyone receiving one of these letters to simply bin it."

If you have responded to this scam or if scam mail is causing you or someone you know distress, report it to Hertfordshire County Council's Trading Standards team via the Citizens Advice Consumer Service on 03454 040506.

DriveSafe Campaign

As mentioned in the April magazine a vehicle speed monitoring exercise has now started in Tewin under the auspices of the Herts Police DriveSafe campaign. Vehicles recorded as driving over the speed limit will receive warning letters from Herts Police and persistent offenders will face formal sanctions.

The main objective of the campaign is to reduce traffic speeds through the village. Please remember that the 30 mph limit is a maximum and not a minimum so don't be embarrassed to drive below 30mph. Many believe that the "20 is Plenty" campaign in built up areas should be universally applied.

Early results from the monitoring already show some alarming speeds, almost 50 mph in some cases. Far too many cars are well above 30 mph. We live in a village where the roads are shared with horses, pedestrians and cyclists. Perhaps most importantly, children using them can do unexpected things. In Tewin as elsewhere, public footpaths exit onto roads on blind bends.

Let's use the campaign as a topic for discussion around the village. We all want a safe environment and we all have a role to play in achieving it.

DOG FOULING ON UPPER GREEN

Tewin Parish Council has received complaints about dog fouling on Upper Green and would be grateful if everyone would be a responsible dog owner and clear up after their dog. Bagged dog mess can be disposed of in any litter bins and

there are currently two on Upper Green in the car park and adjacent to the playground .

Please bear in mind that the green is regularly used by children and for sports and report irresponsible dog owners to the East Herts Council Animal Warden 01279 655261with as much information as possible about the dog, dog owner, times and locations the owner walks the dog.

LITTER BINS

In theory, you should take all your rubbish home with you, but litter bins are for everybody's convenience to dispose of a multitude of small pieces of rubbish. This includes dog poo bags, and we thank all those dog owners who take the trouble to use the litter bins. Two examples of what litter bins should not be used for are (a) the family that took their new Crazy Catch Wild Child Rebound Net to Upper Green, unpacked it, and then folded the cardboard box up and filled a litter bin with it; and (b) the young party goers who tried to cover their activities by heaping all their empty bottles and cans in three litter bins in the Lower Green area.

The litter bins are emptied on Mondays. When litter bins are filled inappropriately, their useful convenience is denied to others, especially over the weekend. Basically, if what you are thinking of putting into a litter bin will fill it up, then you should take it away instead. We are gradually renewing all the old litter bins. The next two to go are the one opposite the Rose & Crown, and the one at the end of Cannons Meadow. We are looking at providing a new litter bin at the entrance to Grass Warren.

SUPERFAST BROADBAND - Bulls Green - Update

As you may recall funding was won from the Government for the Connected Counties Programme to extend the fibre network infrastructure to the Bulls Green cabinet (which serves the Bulls Green/Tewin Wood area) and power it. Copper cable will remain in place between your house and the cabinet and superfast broadband can be delivered over the remaining copper provided it is no longer than 1km between the house and the cabinet.

Surveys started in January 2015 and BT Openreach are aiming to complete the work by the end of March 2016 providing there aren't any unforeseen technical or physical delays. Once the work is complete, Bulls Green/Tewin Wood residents will be able to ask their internet service provider ("ISP") for a fibre broadband service. These estimated forecasts are all subject to change given the complexity of such a large engineering project.

Team Vicar's Letter

A conversation as described by a clergy friend of mine:

So I'm looking after a parishioner's 8 year old and we're waiting for my two to come home from school and I'm in my study and she sidles up to me and looks around...

Her: Yeah, I think I could do your job. Is being a vicar hard? Me: Sometimes. But it's lots of fun too.

Her: Yeah. I could do it. I do believe in God you know.

Me: Well, that's a start. And I am sure God is pleased to know that.

Her: Yeah... I pray too.

Me: That's great - keep that up...

Her: Yeah... I know about God. Do you know that when you die you go to heaven where you become God's slave?

It's funny the pictures we come up with of God. For most of us they start to develop in childhood. Snippets from stories and bits of conversations with adults begin to be pieced together, and images of God are formed.

We often like to think in pictures and the bible gives us a multitude of images to choose from. God is compared to a king, shepherd, rock, potter, friend, fortress, mother hen, fire and water. But of course these are metaphors. None of them tell the complete story.

But the danger of beginning to develop images of God in childhood is that as we grow older we may not encourage our images to mature with us. We can remain stunted as if the 'old man on a cloud' is what faith is about. I often wonder why we leave it like that? Many of us may have learned how to play 'Chopsticks' on the piano as children, or learned to draw stick figures. Perhaps we have never progressed much further than that. But imagine if we then dismiss all music and art as if the childhood tune and pictures are all there is to explore. There are all manner of breath-taking symphonies of God and glorious grandmasters, if only we would look again with adult ears and eyes.

As Giles Fraser, the columnist and priest, said in regard to Stephen Fry's remark that he couldn't believe in a distant God who cared nothing for human suffering – "I don't believe in the God Stephen Fry doesn't believe in either". This is not the image of God that the Christian faith roots itself in. There is one picture of God though that says it all. "Anyone who has seen me, has seen the Father", says Jesus (John 14:9). The Christian faith says to us "God has come near. God has been seen". And so, if you haven't for a while, or perhaps ever in your life, pick up a bible today and read a gospel. Look afresh with adult eyes at Jesus. And afterwards you can say "now I have seen God."

Tewin Cowper School

At the very end of April, we received a long-awaited phone call to say that an Ofsted Inspector would be with us the next day to carry out a full inspection for two days. So over the Wednesday and Thursday, there was lots of information gathering, lesson/work observations and discussions with pupils, staff, parents and governors by the inspector, who drew all her findings together in a mass of paperwork to give a grading and make a full report of our provision here. We are really looking forward to sharing the final report as soon as it is published; it will be uploaded on to our website as well as the official Ofsted website. The Inspector left on the Thursday afternoon and our May Day celebrations on Lower Green the following morning were a wonderful finale to the week; it was lovely to see so many people enjoying the Maypole Dancing and sharing in the festivities. A special 'thank you' to Friends of Tewin for organising it and making it so special and to Mrs Wright and Miss Tebbutt for all their hard work in training the dancers.

We also had our official assessment week during May, when the Year 2 and Year 6 children did their SATs tests and the rest of the school were engaged in summative testing activities which we use to inform the ongoing teacher assessments. Well done to all our children for their hard work and motivation. The Year 6 children celebrated the end of the tests with lunch in the garden at the Plume of Feathers. So now we are in the final half term of the year. We are hoping for some great weather as our swimming pool is open for our curriculum swimming lessons. Our Year 3s are off to Cuffley Camp for three days in the middle of the month; then at the end of the month our Year 6s have their journey to the Isle of Wight for five days.

As we approach the end of another school year, we look ahead to the changes that will come about in September so that we can make plans. As is often the case, this brings mixed feelings, particularly when we have to say 'goodbye' to people who have been an important part of Tewin for many years. After ten years of teaching at Tewin Cowper, we will be very sad to say 'goodbye' to Mrs Wright our deputy headteacher. We are delighted for her as she will be Head of Juniors at St Christopher School in Letchworth from September. This is a great step for her and we are proud of all she has achieved; we will have many happy memories of all she has given to Tewin and the difference she has made to the lives of so many children. We also have some very exciting news: one of our teaching assistants, Mrs Morris, is expecting twins in October.

However difficult we find change, it is important that we look forward and embrace new opportunities and experiences. We have launched our school motto: 'small school BIG dreams'. One of those dreams is to be a Forest School and so two of our teachers have had training so that we can take the next steps to making our outdoor environment even more impactful on the children's learning and development. Lower Green , Tewin

Lower Green has a mix of houses built over the last four centuries, the oldest of which are now numbers 8 & 9. No. 8 was used as the Post Office at one time with the Post Mistress being in charge of routeing telephone calls to and from the village as well as the postal services. The cottages were part of the Panshanger Estate until the Estate was sold in 1953.

The Panshanger Estate built a number of cottages in the nineteenth century for their workers. These Cowper Cottages are familiar sights across this part of Hertfordshire, built in local yellow (cream) brick.

The last forge in Tewin, adjacent to Forge Cottage, was in use until the end of World War II. A pair of semi-detached cottages was built on the site after the forge was demolished. Bob Digby was the last blacksmith to work the forge.

Forge Cottage and the adjacent Yew Tree Cottage were probably built in the mid to late 18th century for the Panshanger Estate. Water for these cottages was originally supplied from a well at the rear of Forge Cottage. Next to these cottages is Vine Cottage built in 1652.

The two cottages next to the current Tewin Stores, numbers 16 and 18 Hertford Road, are thought to have been constructed around 1700. Number 16 was the bakery and had ovens in the cellar, but in 1975, when both cottages were sold, number 18 was designated 'The Old Bakery'.

The Old School House was built in the 18th century at the same time, and by the same hand, as the Rose & Crown Public House. Across the Green from the Old School House is the Victorian School house built by the Cowpers in 1840 to educate the children of Tewin and surrounding farmworkers' families.

In 1968, fifteen houses were built on the site of the Old Rectory on Lower Green. The development, designed by Adams Huntley Associates, won an architectural award and was mentioned in 'The Buildings of Hertfordshire' by Nikolaus Pevsner (Second Edition 1977).

Today development continues with two houses being built to the rear of Lime Cottage, one house between Vine Cottage and the Adams Huntley houses and one next to the Rose & Crown.
