#### ELECTION OF CHAIRMAN AND VICE CHAIRMAN FOR TEWIN PARISH COUNCIL

At the Annual Parish Council meeting on May 11<sup>th</sup> 2015 Cllr Keith St Pier and Cllr Adrian Hill were elected as Chairman and Vice Chairman respectively with the unanimous support of the Councillors.

### UPDATE ON 388 BUS CUTS

Hertfordshire County Council (HCC) have decided to adopt the bus cuts detailed in the recent consultation. This would mean that apart from the two school buses, Tewin would only have one "shopping" trip per day, with no Saturday (or Sunday) service. Indications are that these changes will occur in September. Notice has already been given to Centrebus that the 388 contract is being cancelled.

The decision was effectively taken by the 11 members of the Highways and Waste Management Cabinet Panel, but was ratified by the full council, voting on purely party political lines.

When the recent consultation was instigated, one of the proposals was that the subsidy per journey would be capped at £3.50. The original subsidy for the 388 was quoted as £5.55, but we have since managed to get HCC to revise this down to £3.69.

However, we have now been told that the 388 is being cut because it has failed on a previously unmentioned scoring scheme.

When the consultation was published, the subsidy cut had become just one of a list of Value for Money criteria. At this stage, we can only assume that the scoring scheme is based on the total list of criteria. But the scoring for individual bus services was not published in the consultation, so nobody had any opportunity to comment on any assumptions being made by HCC about the 388.

We are currently pushing HCC for details of this secret scoring scheme, and we are still fighting for retention of the 388.

Thank you to everyone who signed the petition and responded to the consultation and also those who took part in the three bus days.

### **UPDATE ON HIGHWAYS WORKS**

Highways have recently completed a periodic cleaning of the roadside gullies. This only cleans the silt out of the chambers immediately beneath the grills. Please let us know of any gullies which overflow when it rains, because with the chambers clear, this would indicate a deeper problem.

Highways have repaired the gulley pipe below Lower Green, and we are expecting them to come back and re-instate the surface when any settling has finished.

We are also expecting Highways to come back and complete the kerbing along the north side of Lower Green – they started but then realised that they had not ordered the conservation grade kerbing that they should be using in a conservation area.

Our contractor returned to fix some problems with the cobbling at the point of Lower Green. Unfortunately, it is still not right, and the contractor will be back.

### Summer Campaign Focuses on Working Children

Hertfordshire County Council is launching its annual summer awareness campaign to highlight the law regarding young people working during term time or school holidays.

Young people aged 13 -16 (born after 31 August 1999) need to have a work permit if they wish to undertake paid work and there are a number of restrictions on the type of jobs they can do and the hours they can work. For example, working in an office, a hair salon or delivering newspapers are all permitted but they would not be allowed to work in a cinema, a nightclub or a commercial kitchen. There are also limits on the number of hours that can be worked.

School pupils who are volunteering as part of the Duke of Edinburgh's award scheme; on 'work experience' arranged by their school or who do babysitting do not need a work permit.

### **The Road Safety Show**

On Tuesday 9 June Welwyn Garden City's town centre was taken over by a range of organisations from the Hertfordshire Road Safety Partnership, including the Fire Service, the Police, and the Highways Agency. As part of the roadshow a version of the DVSA's Hazard Perception Test was playing inside the Fire Service's Fire Investigation Unit. The test consisted of 10 clips, each containing a major hazard. Participants were scored on the speed and accuracy of their response to this hazard, and other possible ones, as they emerged. Shockingly 40% of those who took the test would have failed. 'The official DVSA guide to hazard perception' is a training DVD-ROM for Microsoft Windows and Mac OS X and is available from most high street book shops.

### Are Hertfordshire's Children Ready For A Record Breaking Summer?

Children will get to learn about weird and wonderful records from around the world when they take part in this year's Record Breakers Summer Reading Challenge at Hertfordshire County Council's libraries.

The challenge, which begins on Saturday 11 July and is free to enter, will encourage children to read six books from the library over the summer, collecting stickers as they go. This year, the young readers taking part will get the chance to learn about different world records.

The challenge is open to children of all ages and reading abilities. They can choose any books they like from our libraries, be it fiction, non-fiction, or even audio or e-books. Very young children can have books read to them; it still counts and is a great way to introduce them to books and the library.

Children who have completed the challenge will be invited to a special awards ceremony, where they will receive a certificate and a medal. They will also be entered into a prize draw with the chance to win a 'Golden Ticket' for an exclusive author event.

Record Breakers packs will be available in all Hertfordshire Libraries, including mobile libraries, from **Saturday 11 July until Saturday 5 September 2015**, while stocks last. A special launch event will be held at Welwyn Garden City library on Saturday 11 July, where there will be lots of free activities to join in with. Children can also visit **www.recordbreakers.org.uk** for more fun and games, and make links with authors and other children taking part across the country. Hertfordshire Libraries are also inviting **11-18 year olds** to get creative with their reading this summer by taking part in 'ImagiNation' – a free reading and arts project designed with the help of young people. Using library books as their inspiration, young people can create comic strips, write reviews, make movie trailers, even perform dance routines, and share their artwork and ideas with others via the ImagiNation blog. The good weather helped, so did the marvellous Dragon Castle for the children. We were surprised and delighted that the young man who looked after the castle also did magic tricks in between sessions, which kept everyone entertained when they weren't on court.

In other news, the Men's and Ladies Doubles tournaments were run in mid-June. Winners of the men's event was the partnership of Keith Duerden and Steve Adamthwaite, while ladies' champions were Roe Hill & Eileen Doyle. Congratulations to all of you.

### Tewin Orchard and Hopkyns Wood

Tewin Orchard represents an almost extinct feature of the English countryside: that of a small village orchard with varied and often local fruit trees. Today not only is the orchard good for apples and pears but many forms of wildlife. In autumn and winter the apples attract large numbers of redwings, fieldfares and blackbirds. Other birds using the orchard include yellowhammers, greenfinches, linnets and goldfinches. In contrast, Hopkyns Wood is a shady oak and hornbeam wood with ground flora dominated by bluebells and garlic-smelling ransoms in springtime.

The Orchard was created in 1931 when William Stenning Hopkyns, on his return from working for the Civil Service in India, had 5,000 apple and pear trees planted on land purchased from his uncle. The Hopkyns family had owned land in Tewin from the Victorian era. The Orchard was subsequently cared for by his daughter, Molly Hopkyns. In the 1950's the Orchard became a 'community' orchard where villagers 'bought' a tree for a year and cared for and picked the fruit from their own trees. The land became open for all to enjoy, with the chance to picnic and explore. The cessation of management, however, led to scrub encroachment and the neglect of the fruit trees over much of the site, although some regular customers pruned their own trees. Part of the current site, Hopkyns Wood, was gifted to The Wildlife Trust in 1972 by Dr John Hopkyns, Molly's cousin in Canada, to be maintained as a nature reserve. On her death in 1982 Molly gifted the Orchard to the RSPB for future generations and wildlife.

For over forty years Michael Clark has been the volunteer warden at the Orchard. With his wife Anna, and many other volunteers, the 82 year old fruit trees and adjoining woodland have been maintained for both wildlife and the preservation of one of the last village orchards in the county. The reserve has a hide to watch wild mammals at dusk, and is managed by the Hertfordshire & Middlesex Wildlife Trust. There is also a heritage collection of regional apple types, representative of the East of England, established next to the pear collection. The rescue of the Hitchin Pippin is told in Michael's latest book 'Apples - a field guide' on sale in Tewin Stores. The work of maintaining the Orchard depends almost entirely on unpaid volunteers who, under the direction of the Wildlife Trust Reserves Officer, Paul Thrush, keep the trees protected from rabbits and competition from the ground flora whilst also ensuring ample wilderness and food for the wildlife throughout the seasons. It is known that a single pair of Great Tits will feed over 10,000 insects to their young during the nesting season, and this natural control of species that may otherwise damage the fruit crops, is relied on in place of chemicals, none of which are used on the reserve.

## **Team Vicar's Letter**

London's Southbank is hosting an exhibition this summer by the Belgium artist, Carsten Holler. Viewer beware - this is not your usual gentle amble through a gallery, pondering paintings at a distance. Rather Holler wants his audience to become part of the exhibits. Called 'Decision' there are many ways the visitors will be invited to interact with his creations. You could soar in a flying machine, lie in bed whilst it roams around the galleries on robotic legs or fly down the three-story helter-skelter which will bring you back out to the street. You are even invited to take an unknown pill, if you dare. Holler sees interaction as the heart of his work. That whatever he creates, beautiful or bizarre, it is incomplete without the interaction of the visitor.

I guess it's the same with our church buildings. They remain often the oldest and most beautiful part of a local community. Yet if they are preserved only to be viewed from afar or appreciated as a museum or gallery then their true richness is lost and our experience is far less.

Churches are designed for interaction. Whether that is kneeling on the hassocks, or singing with the organ, thumbing through the bible, being soaked by the font or tasting bread and wine. The beauty of the windows, showing us the lives of the saints or characters from the bible, invite us to look upon them and see not just the two dimensional picture but also to reflect on the fullness of our life: how do we shine light? Where are we in God's story? And as we learn to interact with the building, we then find enjoyment in others who engage with it in the same way.

So this summer maybe visit the Southbank, but certainly visit your church. Join with others who have found the delight that lies within those large stone walls, if only you dare to engage. After all, interaction is God's way; it's why he sent Jesus.

<u>Historic Archives Inspire Second Threads Of Time Project</u> From 9 June to 11 July, Hertfordshire Archives and Local Studies will host the 'Threads of Time 2' exhibition, featuring the work of local textile artists.

Over the past six months, nearly 50 local artists have been involved in the second Threads of Time project, producing new work inspired by material in the papers of the Delmé-Radcliffe family of Hitchin Priory.

The aim of the project has been to introduce a new and diverse audience to the archives by demonstrating a fresh way of using the wealth of archive material available.

The work produced reflects the Delmé-Radcliffe family's interests in trade, architecture, landscaping, fashion and beyond. The archive has inspired embroidery, patchwork, tapestry, lacework and weaving, with creations ranging from a convent garden to a camel, laden with treasures from the East. Teresa Heritage, Cabinet Member for Public Health, Localism and Libraries, said: "The second Threads of Time project has proved to be fascinating. Yet again, it has demonstrated that the archives not only hold a treasure trove of information which can help family and local historians, but it can also be a major source of inspiration for the creative arts."

Many of the artists had not visited the archives before and the project has opened a new world for them:

Jojo Taylor said: "Hertfordshire's archives are a real treasure chest of information, stories, objects, photographs, maps and history, just waiting to be brought back to life. And with a project like Threads of Time you get to work with the expert archivists and staff to research documents and help turn your ideas into art."

Felicity Marpole said: "It's sometimes difficult to repeat a success but this latest Threads of Time project has proved even more inspirational than the first. I have really enjoyed the group meetings, especially following the development of each creation. My project has proved challenging but I am pleased with the result. It is very satisfying when a tentative idea becomes an actual reality."
