### NEW BENCH FOR MAY POND GREEN

A replacement bench will soon be installed on May Pond Green adjacent to the new footpath and the plaque from the previous bench will be reinstated

### **NEW LITTER BIN FOR GRASS WARREN**

A new litter bin will soon be installed at the entrance to Grass Warren to provide a place for walkers to put their litter and bagged dog mess.

### **UPPER GREEN ROAD FOOTPATH WORKS**

The majority of the footpath from Upper Green down to 43 Upper Green Road has been completed. Herts Highways contractor will be back to complete the final part in due course. The return date is dependent upon coordination of the works with the Taylor Wimpey development opposite and also with Herts County Council's Network Management team.

### KERBSIDE RECYCLING

Did you know that more than half of all recyclable materials taken to Hertfordshire's Household Waste and Recycling Centres (HWRC's – more commonly known as tips) could have been recycled kerbside? "Wherever possible, try to make regular use of your kerbside recycling rather than going to the HWRC" says Councillor Richard Thake, Cabinet Member for Waste Management, "Not only can this help save your own time and money, but this also helps cut down on queuing times at the centres, making our service more efficient and cost effective".

Are you one of the many Hertfordshire residents who visit the HWRC out of convenience, or because you don't want items hanging around the house? There are so many alternative ways you can recycle goods, such as charities, free recycling services and bottle and recycling banks at supermarkets and leisure centres.

Your local district or borough council is responsible for collecting waste and recycling from outside your house, and what can and can't be recycled kerbside varies from district to district. Check your district council website for more information:

### The Snow Code

Despite the mild November, winter is on the way so be prepared. Clearing snow and ice from the pavement outside your home or public spaces can help prevent slips and falls.

Don't be put off clearing paths because you're afraid someone will get injured. Remember, people walking on snow and ice have a responsibility to be careful themselves.

Follow the advice below to make sure you clear the pathway safely and effectively. And don't believe the myths - it's unlikely you'll be sued or held legally responsible for any injuries if you have cleared the path carefully.

### Clear the snow and ice early in the day

It's easier to move fresh, loose snow rather than hard snow that has packed together from people walking on it. So if possible, start removing the snow and ice in the morning. If you remove the top layer of snow in the morning, any sunshine during the day will help melt any ice beneath. You can then cover the path with salt before nightfall to stop it refreezing overnight.

### **Preventing slips**

• Pay extra attention to clearing snow and ice from steps and steep pathways - you might need to use more salt on these areas

• Use salt or sand - **not water** 

• Don't make the pathways more dangerous by causing them to refreeze. If you use water to melt the snow, it may refreeze and turn to black ice. Black ice increases the risk of injuries as it is invisible and very slippery.

• You can melt snow or prevent black ice by spreading some salt on the area you have cleared. You can use ordinary table or dishwasher salt - a tablespoon for each square metre you clear should work. Don't use the salt found in salting bins - this will be needed to keep the roads clear unless your council advises otherwise. Please contact your local council for more advice.

• Be careful not to spread salt on plants or grass as it may damage them. If you don't have enough salt, you can also use sand or ash. These won't stop the path icing over as effectively as salt, but will provide good grip underfoot.

### Take care where you move the snow

When you're shovelling snow, take care where you put it so it doesn't block people's paths or drains. Make sure you make a path down the middle of the area to be cleared first, so you have a clear surface to walk on. Then shovel the snow from the centre of the path to the sides.

If your neighbour will have difficulty getting in and out of their home, offer to clear snow and ice around their property as well. Check that any elderly or disabled neighbours are alright in the cold weather.

St. Albans Abbey. There is stillness in the lady chapel. I am sitting in a corner when a small child and her grandfather move down the aisle. She, I suspect not yet two, holds tightly on to his finger. He walks slowly, at her pace, with great care to keep her steady.

It was good to see a large number of children at that gathering and indeed Tewin Cowper School held their own service in Church on 11<sup>th</sup> November, led by Chestnut Tree class who read poems and prayers and sang beautifully.

All our helpers were busy during the month gathering together toys, gifts, decorations, raffle prizes and all the other items needed for the Christmas Market, which took place on  $28^{\text{th}}$  November.
