# Tewin Parish Council - Election of Chairman and Vice Chairman

At the Annual Parish Council meeting on 9th May 2016 Cllr Keith St Pier and Cllr Adrian Hill were elected as Chairman and Vice Chairman respectively with the unanimous support of the Councillors.

#### **Road Signage**

East Herts Council has ordered new road signage to show where Cannons Meadow ends and Grass Warren starts in order to avoid confusion.

#### Parish Paths Partnership P3 Grant

The Parish Council has been awarded a P3 grant of £1000 to improve the surface of Footpath 30 which runs fromTewin Close past the Caravan site as it is almost impassable with deep waterlogged mud.

#### **Tewin Hill Potholes**

These have been reported to Herts Highways and referred to Herts County Councillor Ken Crofton as the road had become impassable to all traffic. The road has been repaired under a category 1 defect and a category 2 defect will be raised to investigate the flooding issue. This work will be placed into Highways planned programme of maintenance, subject to network priorities.

#### **Tennis Court Fencing**

The remainder of the tennis court fencing is due to be replaced shortly so there may be some disruption while the works are being completed.

#### **Pavilion Extension Proposal**

The Parish Council has submitted a planning application to East Herts Council for a single storey front extension of the existing lounge and changing rooms. Insertion of single external door to rear and conversion of cupboard to toilet and new window in kitchen to front. The plans are available for viewing at www.eastherts.gov.uk using planning reference 3/16/0957/FUL.

#### **Classic Car Show**

The Parish Council unanimously agreed to accept a quote to arrange car marshalling for the Classic Car and Craft Show on Upper Green on 21st August 2016.

#### Common Ragwort (Senecio Jacobaea)

This is a common weed found throughout the British Isles. However it is very toxic to horses and other livestock and can have potentially fatal consequences if ingested either in its green or dried state.

Under the Weeds Act 1959 the Secretary of State may serve an enforcement notice on the occupier of land on which injurious weeds are growing, requiring the occupier to take action to prevent the spread of injurious weeds. The Weeds Act specifies **five** injurious weeds: Common Ragwort, Spear Thistle, Creeping or Field Thistle, Broad Leaved Dock and Curled Dock.

By promoting good practice and good neighbourliness it is hoped that this weed can be controlled.

If you find you have it in your garden please put rubber gloves on and remove the plant and place it in the <u>black bin</u> to prevent livestock eating it. Fragments of root will remain in the ground so new growth will have to be monitored and removed year after year.
