Drivesafe

Tewin Parish Council continue to support the Drivesafe group, who are still able to find too many drivers exceeding the speed limit throughout the village. We are hopeful

Lower Green Kerbing

The Parish Council has submitted a works application and a temporary traffic regulation order to Herts Highways in order to close the road to enable the replacment kerbing works on Lower Green. Once approval and advertising has been completed a start date will be confirmed and a start date of 15th August is anticipated but yet to be confirmed.

Upper Green Parking

Following incidents of hazardous parking on May Pond Green and Upper Green and complaints from parishioners the Parish Council is in the process of getting quotes to put an earth bund along May Pond Green to deter parking and approaching Greene King about any options to extend their car park.

Upper Green Road Ditch

The Parish Council has obtained three quotes for excavating the ditch to below the level of the pipe work and for the soil taken away to be used to build an earth bund on May Pond Green to deter parking. The Parish Council has arranged a site visit with Herts Highways to discuss a contribution to the works to alleviate the blocked ditch.

New detached dwelling - The appeal for this planning application was dismissed based on the basis of the harm to the character, appearance and living conditions and the overall design, height, bulk and siting of the proposed development.

Team Vicar's Letter

The sound of bells ringing is deeply rooted in British culture. Almost everyone in Britain lives within hearing range of bells. They provide the grand soundtrack to our historic moments, call out for our celebrations and toll sadly in empathy with our grief.

The bitter-sweet sound of just one bell or the majesty of a whole peal, has become part of the English heritage and much of the country's history can be traced through the history of its bells.

They call us to wake, to pray, to work, to arms, to feast and, in times of crisis, to come together. Bells sound for personal joy in marriage, for national celebration such as the 2012 Olympics and the Queen's most recent birthday, and also have been the marker of freedom as in World War II they hung silently until the day they could ring in the peace.

Bellringers have not always had the best reputation. In the 1700's rural bell ringers were renowned for moving directly from church to the local tavern, and are recorded as lay-abouts and drunks. I wouldn't dare comment, but certainly I have seen whiskey in the bell tower on many a Christmas Eve. But bellringing has many personal advantages. Gentle exercise for young and old, it tones muscles, improves co-ordination, agility and reaction times. It stimulates the mind and memory. It encourages teamwork. It encourages friendship across all ages.

I had lunch yesterday with a young man who started bell-ringing for his Duke of Edinburgh award. That was seven years ago, and he hasn't looked back. When I asked him why he loved it, he thought for a while. "I just love the sound of bells" he said, "there is no sound like it". The danger is of course, that a lack of bell ringers means that one day, maybe, the bells will fall silent and Britain's landscape will be deafened by their absence. So why not come and ring some of our nations largest and oldest musical instruments for yourself? Our bellringing teams in Tewin and Datchworth will always be pleased to simply let you have a go and gently 'put you through the ropes'.

Thank you to everyone who helped us to run our Open Church Sunday on 26th June, which was a celebration of Petertide. The Church was decorated with some very beautiful flower arrangements and we were able to offer our visitors refreshments. The donated cakes were very much appreciated.

A reminder to you all that St Peter's will host one of the Team Summer Evensong services on Sunday 7th August at 6.30 p.m. Everyone is welcome, so do come along and share this service with us. Refreshment will be served afterwards, hopefully outside in the sunshine. These events take place across the team from 24th July to 28th August. If you are unable to make it to Tewin, then you may wish to go along to one of the other Team Churches. Details are in the pew slips and in the centre of this magazine.

Our Church shared with most of Tewin village, the very heavy downpour of rain on Thursday 23rd June. At the time, a wedding rehearsal was underway inside the Church. The skies were black and suddenly a variety of dripping and gushing noises were heard - from the South Porch, the vestry and the bell tower. Leaving the Church was difficult, with frogs and slugs in abundance and the need to remove shoes and socks. Fortunately, everything was under control in time for the Saturday wedding and we are now just about fully dried out.

A small group of volunteers from St Peter's has continued to work with pupils at Tewin School as part of 'Story Club' which is held on Friday afternoons. In July the DriveSafe Team reported the surprising and disappointing news that a significant number of cars were exceeding the speed limit through the village. On one occasion almost 50% were travelling in excess of the 30mph limit

From installing community alarms and telecare on behalf of Herts Careline, providing nutritional advice and advocacy support, running fun-clubs for people living with dementia, providing transport to services across the county, and much more, HILS wants to make a positive difference to people's lives in Hertfordshire.

Inns, Pubs and Alehouses

Pubs do not seem to have played a significant part in Tewin's history, but probably no less than any other village not on a major coaching route and later bypassed by the railway. The two pubs in the village today have both been here for centuries and are much the same size as they were when they were built perhaps 500 years ago.

The Rose and Crown, as we know it today, is thought to have been built in about 1650 on the front of an older building that stood on the site and which now forms part of the present kitchen.

One of the first times it is mentioned is in an agreement of sale in 1730 when it was sold by one Samuel Pryor of Nast Hyde to Richard Warren of Marden for £500. This is the same Richard Warren who later was to assist John Carrington to take on the tenancy of Bacon's Farm. In 1791 Carrington's son, Jack, took the tenancy of *The Rose and Crown* and was there until 1833. Carrington tells frequently in his diaries of visiting 'son Jack's' and of the many meals eaten there. The current tenant is

Very little is known of the origins of *The Plume of Feathers* but it is probable that it was first built in about 1500 or even earlier. It is reputed to be a former hunting lodge used by Queen Elizabeth I, to have a resident ghost and to be connected to Queen Hoo Hall by underground tunnel. However, like *The Rose and Crown*, it features often in Carrington's Diary. He tells us that the landlord at that time was Joseph Whittenbury, one of the Whittenburys of Queen Hoo Hall, another of whom had been involved in the killing of the footpad, Walter Clibbon, in 1782.

The pub is currently owned by Greene King and managed by Nigel and Gill Walker.

Also on the Upper Green at one time was Brown's Ale House, but where it was is impossible to tell. The only reference is again from Carrington dated 14th April 1766.
