OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD

Sue grew up in war-torn Bosnia. Bombing and shooting were part of her everyday life. Food was in very short supply but she found hope in an extraordinary gift when she received a decorated shoebox during the winter of 1993-94. A little girl named Jenny sent a shoebox to Sue containing a doll, a skipping rope, a few toiletries, pencils and paper, a pink and purple hat, gloves, scarf and some sweets. A simple Christmas Shoebox is a "treasure chest" for a child who has never received a gift before. It is a powerful symbol of hope that someone, somewhere cared enough to pack a box just for them. In 2015 you were part of an operation that delivered 900,008 shoeboxes to children across 14 different countries. Globally II million suffering children were reached. You can donate and gift aid securely on line and also order gift wrapped shoeboxes to be delivered to children on your behalf. Joyce Turner (17/07/1939 - 01/09/2016)

Will you join with me in thanking God for the life of Joyce Turner of Punchetts, West Riding.

Joyce Turner was born on 17th July 1939 in Barnet and died on 1st Sept this year. She and her husband Ray with their small children moved to Godfries Close in 1972 and later they went to live in West Riding.

Joyce was a lovely Christian lady who wanted to share her "Good News" with everyone she met. She held Coffee Mornings with Christian speakers in her home for over thirty years. She also started Bible Studies with groups of people. None of these studies were threatening in any way and a group is still in place today. If anyone Joyce knew had a bereavement in the family or some such sadness she would be the first to go round with flowers and a card together with words of comfort. Joyce would follow up her visits and do everything she could to help in whatever way possible. All this was apart from her considerable work with teenagers at the Baptist Church in Hertford. Joyce unfortunately had to give up her Christian work reluctantly as the effects of Alzheimers disease took hold. She and her husband Ray struggled to cope for years and bore the illness with such grace as Joyce gradually lost her grip on life. You will have seen the devotion Ray had to his wife as he pushed her in a wheelchair from West Riding to Tebbutts shop to collect the paper daily.

Joyce will be sadly missed by many people in the village and I would like you to join with me in extending our deepest sympathy to Ray, Jonathan, Kevin, Susannah and family in their very great loss. Jackie Beadle

External Audit

BDO LLP has completed the audit of Tewin Parish Council's financial accounts. They have issued an unqualified audit opinion as they consider the information in

the annual return is in accordance with proper practices and no matters have come to their attention giving cause for concern that relevant legislation and regulatory requirements have not been met. The audit form will be displayed on the Parish Council notice board for the statutory 14 days and is also available to view on the Tewin Village website.

May Pond Green Trees

Herts Highways have advised that they are in contact with the contractor about the death of one of the new trees they planted on May Pond Green last year as part of the footpath works.

Fly tipping

If you hire someone to dispose of waste, check that they have a licence to carry it – if your waste is dumped illegally, you face prosecution and a fine of up to $\pounds 5,000$. This includes scrap dealers. You should:

- Ask to see their waste carrier licence registration certificate
- Ask for a receipt detailing where the waste is going, vehicle details and carrier's authorisation number
- Phone 08708 506 506 and ask for a waste carrier validation check. Or check at www.gov.uk/access-the-public-register-for-environmental-information.

Fly-tipping offenders can, and will, be prosecuted. Anyone found guilty at court faces a fine of up to \pounds 50,000 and/or 12 months in prison.

Found a fly tip?

Please call the council on 01279 655261 and ask for Environmental Services or email operations.admin@eastherts.gov.uk. Please take photos but don't touch the fly tip or remove any evidence. If you see fly tipping actually taking place call the police on 999.

TRANSPORT STEERING GROUP

There are frequent APPEALS FOR HELP in the village and this is no exception. Tewin has a newly formed Transport Steering Committee which will be Chaired by Tim Hayward-Smith, Community Development Action (CDA). CDA is an organisation which offers support in relation to core rural issues and community need.

The cuts to the 388 bus service have been drastic. The revised time table offers a weekday shopping trip and term time school bus. It fails to take into consideration how people who depend upon the bus service can continue to link up with key services in the local towns. There are costs to running a bus service but there are also hidden benefits. September 2014, Greener Journeys analysis was that for every £1 spent on concessionary travel at least $\pounds 2.87$ was generated in benefits, not only for the passenger but the wider community. If one thinks of traffic congestion, parking problems, missed hospital and GP appointments; and town centre regeneration, it brings an alternative view to the costs involved.

An offer of a 10 seater mini-bus with one wheelchair space and a driver has been made by Hertfordshire County Council Community Transport Team to provide a Saturday service. This would cost in the region of £6,000 per annum to operate for return trips between Hertford and Welwyn Garden City for up to seven hours.

A sharp focus on the problem is needed before any change can happen. If you could make any contribution, whether by way of expertise, ideas about commercial sponsorship, publicity, marketing, or fund raising opportunities, the Transport Steering Committee is waiting to hear from you. We rang 1260 changes of 10 different Doubles methods on Tewin's six bells in about 40 minutes. The ringers were: David Dalton, David Hall, Julie Grimwade, Mark Hall, Graham Lay and Jonti Rudd.

Bellringing is not just pulling on a rope! Once the handling is mastered, we learn patterns called 'methods', to know which order to ring the bells in, as well as listening to strike the bell in the right place so that the ringing sounds even. There is always some challenge (including remembering the names when you're ringing 10 different methods!).
