#### <u>Consultation on Pre-submission District Plan - Closing Date 15th</u> <u>December 2016</u>

There are currently no proposals for new housing developments in this Consultation so the Parish Council agreed not to hold a public meeting but instead make a printed copy of the plan available in Tewin Stores and have arranged for a newsletter with all the details of this Consultation to be distributed to every household in the parish.

Full details of the Pre-Submission District Plan, how it was developed and how to comment are available at www.eastherts.gov.uk/districtplan. You can follow links through to the Consultation Portal where the online version of the plan is available to read and comment.

The website has a link to "Online Mapping". To find a map of Tewin, click the "Navigate" button and select "Tewin" from the drop down list. You need to click "Navigate" again to get the drop down list to disappear! The map shows the Green Belt and the inset area separated by the Village Boundary. It also shows the Conservation Area outlined in red. More recently constructed houses are not shown. This website can be slow.

Some printed information will be available at libraries (Hertford, Knebworth etc but not Welwyn Garden City) and council offices (Wallfields, Hertford Castle etc).

After the current consultation, the District Plan will be submitted to the Planning Inspector at a Public Inquiry.

The current consultation is important to Tewin. Please take the time to look at the Pre-Submission District Plan and comment if you think necessary.

The second opportunity is for members of the Tewin Tennis Club, who simply need to register, at no cost, with the LTA on www.lta.org.uk/member. You then become a BTM member, and are entered into another ballot for tickets.

Sadly, it's not all good news. You still have to pay for the tickets, even if you win! They range from £56 to £190 each for seats, though ground admission is available for £20 to £25, which is a lot of fun in the first week where there is fabulous play to be seen on the outside courts.

#### Christmas at St Peter's

This year, Christmas will be a little different at St Peter's.

Our Carol Service will be an all-age morning affair on Sunday 18<sup>th</sup> December at 11:15am. We hope that this will allow those people who are less happy to come out in the dark, old and young, to experience the joy of carol singing.

The change also allows us to be part of the 'Tewin Nativity' that afternoon– an exciting all-age adventure. We will gather outside St. Peter's at 4:30pm to witness Mary receive the news of Jesus from Gabriel, we meet the shepherds, see the wisemen studying the sky and then, with a lantern procession, we follow Mary, Joseph (and donkey!) to Muspatts farm where the story continues in the barn. Do note, to help with refreshments, and to make sure we can keep everyone safe, you will need a ticket to come to this event.

Instead of Christmas crafts at the church, there will be a workshop on Saturday 10<sup>th</sup> December at Tewin Cowper school for children and adults to make lanterns for our Nativity procession (child and barn friendly battery operated – no live flames!), with a small fee to cover cost of materials.

Christmas Eve will see our popular Crib service at 5pm, followed by the wonder of Midnight Mass at 11:30pm. Christmas morning there will be a service of Holy Communion at 9:30am.

But whatever the differences in our worship this year – the message remains the same; God, in his love, takes on human-form and is made known among us. His glory is found in the poverty of a stable. His love revealed in the frailty of a child. Emmanuel – God with us. God with you. God with me. And because of him, we have hope.

I wish you a most holy and blessed Christmas, when it comes. And be assured, that you are all in my prayers.
