OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD - TEWIN SHOE BOX APPEAL

This is to thank you for your generosity by responding again to this year's Shoe Box appeal. On Friday 25th November 116 boxes were collected from here for very needy children languishing in orphanages and other institutions in Romania. Seven extra boxes were purchased on line making a total of 123. Many boxes were collected from the school as well. Years ago we saw what happened when journalists visited some of these orphanages in Romania where children were tied to their cots and there they remained without any form of stimulation. Hopefully things are very different now but extreme poverty remains in that country. It's good to think that the box you created will bring so much joy to a child's life; a deep sense of joy and hope that we can't possibly imagine. I've been told that if one child has more than another there is a great sense of sharing.

Since 2002 (this does not include the school) we have collected 2673 boxes which is quite an amazing figure and a number Tewin can be really proud of. Imagine taking a photograph of 2673 children all holding their boxes standing together in a playground? That would be some image! So much work has gone into preparing these boxes. It takes considerable time to carefully wrap a box and finding suitable gifts to put in it, that's apart from some people spending hours knitting hats and scarves. Some of you kept arriving here again and again with armfuls of boxes. So thank you again for your kindness which on behalf of Samaritans Purse is very much appreciated.

<u>Consultation on Pre-submission District Plan - Closing Date 15th De-</u> <u>cember 2016</u>

Tewin Parish Council has submitted their comments on the Presubmission District Plan Consultation 2016 and are in support of the proposed plan having found the officers of East Herts Council to be professional and willing to communicate and listen.

Tewin Parish Council concur with the decision to leave the Green Belt boundary around Tewin unchanged from the 2007 Local Plan. Some landowners would no doubt like the Green Belt boundary extended so that they could profit from more house building. Tewin is no exception to this. But the Tewin Green Belt boundary was first defined in the current Plan and any proposals to alter it in this immediate successor Plan, are not consistent with the intended enduring quality of Green Belt boundaries only being altered in exceptional circumstances.

Tewin lies in the Green Belt separating Welwyn Garden City and Hertford; and stands above the Mimram Valley. By being inset from the Green Belt, Tewin represents a hole in that Green Belt; a degradation. Expanding the Tewin Green Belt boundary would increase that degradation, especially since modern developments on the edge of the village would invariably face inwards, thus presenting their bland rear facades to be clearly visible across the large areas of open fields surrounding the village. Modern rear gardens are not big enough to plant any significant screening trees.

Most people live in towns, so when a housing development is placed in a village, and new residents are imported in bulk, then it should be no surprise that many of them "work and socialise elsewhere". If they are from nearby towns looking for a better house, then it is only natural that they will retain their existing friendships and interests. They may buy a few things in a local shop, or there may be a few extra children for the village school, but often they will not assimilate into the village community. This will result in a gradual dilution of the community, until the village is little more than a piece of town dropped into the countryside.

Tewin Parish Council concur with the placement of Tewin in Group 2. The analysis carried out by East Herts Council shows that Tewin is now low on the facilities needed for sustainability. Over the years, Tewin has lost various facilities – doctors surgery, universal local prescription service, mobile library, petrol station, and most of its bus service. The causes are generally external factors in a modern world, and the losses are unlikely to be reversed. No amount of housing is going to bring those back.

Potential house builders have claimed that Tewin needs more houses to support retention of facilities, but more houses have little effect on these external factors. Having an extra 48 houses since 2007 did not prevent most of the bus service being withdrawn in 2015. Where Tewin has control of facilities, they are already prospering.

Annual General Meeting on Monday 16th January 2017

The AGM will be followed by a talk entitled **Manet, Impressionism and the origins of modern art** from our guest speaker Barry Dodge. Barry will look at the reasons why so many art historians, including the great Modernist critic Clement Greenberg, suggest Manet was the first truly Modernist artist. He will show how Manet's painting 'Le Dejeuner sur l'Herbe' may be regarded as, perhaps, the first example of avant-garde Modernist art. He will look at how impressionism develops, in part, through the example of Manet's work, and how the work of Claude Monet, in particular, can be seen as the inspiration for much Modernist avant-garde art in the 20th century, including that of American Abstract Expressionism.

Barry Dodge is no stranger to members of *THACS*, having given a couple of talks to meetings in the past. Those who remember these earlier talks will be looking forward to this one. There is no admission charge for the evening and no booking is necessary. We look forward to seeing you on the night.

Team Vicar's Letter

It's the start of a New Year, and a time when you might be thinking of the possibilities of a new-and-improved you! If 2016 was a year of too much cake, too little exercise, too much nicotine or alcohol, perhaps now is the time you are resolving a lifestyle based on salad, cycling and soft drinks. If so, I wish you well (I just won't be joining you).

The beginning of a year is a good time to think about the lives we are living, the choices we make and what changes may be good for us to take part in. And because of that, I wish to offer you a challenge for a different kind of resolution.

At St Peter's church this coming year we will be reflecting on four words – generosity, joy, imagination and courage. They come from a prayer that has been used by St Albans Diocese for some time now, but I think they are important qualities to mark a 'good' life for all people, not only those of Christian faith. All of us will have these qualities in some measure or other, the challenge is to deliberately grow them further, to open ourselves to living a life that is more generous (in terms of time, wealth or attitudes) more joyful (even in difficult times), more imaginative, and also deeply courageous of the challenges that face us in our loving and speaking.

There are lots of ways that we will be exploring these qualities as a church, including four specific events over the year (A gospel choir for joy, a creative day for imagination, a charitable challenge for generosity and (if I can pull it off) fire-walking for courage (!)).

But my challenge to you is this – in what four ways can you resolve to allow these qualities to form part of your 2017? What resolutions could you make to experience or give joy; to be generous to the point of silliness; to develop imagination that opens up new possibilities; to be courageous, to face that which scares you or step out into the unknown?

If you decide to do it, I'd be thrilled to hear what your resolutions will be. But whether you choose to take this challenge, or instead join a gym, I wish you every blessing in this year that lies ahead.

It's quite easy to sleep out, when you know you'll be going home.

On the 2^{nd} December, Lydia Whiskin, Annabel Underwood, myself and a bunch of others from the Welwyn Team churches joined other church groups for the annual St Albans Sleepout. It is an event that usually raises between $\pounds 40,000 - \pounds 50,000$ for local homeless charities.

The night started a little rainy, but thankfully not enough to get us really wet. We arrived prepared wearing almost everything our wardrobes could provide, along with sleeping bags, mats and cardboard boxes. Finding a space on the grass outside of the main doors of the Cathedral, our backdrop of a lit Abbey and large, twinkling Christmas tree was not a bad view.

The evening started with an invitation to listen to two very different, but interconnected experiences. Laura Neilson is 35. I remember her from when she was part of the youth group I ran for a while in Welwyn. Then she was 17 and I spent my first sleep-out with her and some others. It seems a long time ago. Laura spoke this time about those early experiences, such as that sleep-out we went on, having a life-long impact on her desire to be engaged with issues of social justice. Just after that, when she had completed her A Levels, she went on a two week Christian trip to be part of a summer camp in a very deprived part of Manchester. It changed her life. She left Hertfordshire and moved into that deprived estate and committed herself to working with that community. She got married, trained as a GP and set up a medical clinic on that same estate which focuses on helping the most vulnerable families. The clinic has just won an NHS award and Laura herself an award for her inspirational work.

Mike (not his real name) is in his 40's. He also spoke about a very different life. His life, in his words, is not yet entirely rosy – but he's come a long way from the days of addiction and homelessness that took up a good number of his adult years.

He traced his problems back to an abused childhood. He had memories of stealing from the age of 4, and the 'warm feeling' it would give him inside as he knew it would bring him attention. He was trouble at school. He started experimenting with drugs age 13. He fathered his first child while still a teenager and his life turned into a series of broken relationships and petty crime, including a prison sentence, until, addicted to heroin and alcohol, he lost everything and became a rough sleeper on the streets of Manchester.

But his life changed when he met one woman. She introduced him to a church which served hot meals. She took him to a shop and bought him a tent, new sleeping bag and mat. She found an addiction centre that would take him, but he needed to be 'clean' for two weeks before they were able to start their rehabilitation programme. He said he couldn't do it, so she said she'd meet with him every day for those two weeks to make sure he did. And she did. And he managed it. He attended the clinic, he overcame his addictions and from there started to rebuild his life. It wasn't easy getting employment with his criminal history, but he spoke warmly of the people who had given him a chance – including Laura, who employed him as a nanny for her own children (three boisterous boys).

So after hearing those stories of real suffering and real sacrifice it felt somewhat easy to sleep-out for one night, knowing that in the morning we'd go home, to a warm bath and hot food and families who cared for us.

Thank you to all of you who sponsored us. We've raised around £1,000 which will go to the Haven in Stevenage. A place which also works to listen to people's stories and to give them a helping hand to a better way of living. Because sometimes we can't do it on our own. Susannah
