**Fundraising For Isabel Hospice In Memory of Carolyn King.** Carolyn lived in the village, initially in Godfries Close and, after a few years away, she returned in 1999 and lived in Lower Green until she died of cancer last year.

During her last 2 years when she had a terminal diagnosis she was looked after by the Isabel Hospice but carried on life as normal with just occasional support. Medication stopped working in May 2016 and she was passed on from the NHS and, from then on, the hospice nurses were always on hand to get the medications right and for moral support. The physiotherapy team came round and helped her to walk again. This carried on until October when she died peacefully at home.

Hospices give vital support to terminally ill people and their families but receive less than a third of their funds from the NHS. The rest is raised by many methods including sponsorship.

On the 29<sup>th</sup> April I will be abseiling off of the Arcelor Mittall Orbit tower in the Olympic Park with my daughter and would welcome sponsorship from local people. #### Tewin Drivesafe Speed Awareness Group

A grant application for a fixed flashing solar powered speed indication device to be located in Tewin was submitted to the Herts Police & Crime Commissioner on 23rd December 2016 and

has passed the initial sifting. A final response is expected in early April 2017.

Tewin Drivesafe Speed Awareness Group is a dedicated team of volunteers that turns out 2 to 3 times month to speed check vehicles entering or leaving the village. They use a speed indicator device ("SID") which highlights each car's speed to help improve all drivers' speed awareness as many people are not aware of how fast they are driving on local roads which have a 30mph limit.

Tewin Parish Council continue to support the Drivesafe group and are hopeful that their continued operation will encourage motorists to slow down through Tewin.

<u>Would you be able to spare a couple of hours a month ?</u> The Drivesafe team are actively looking for new members to help man the speed indicator device, "SID", and monitor traffic. If you would like to find out more please email Gerry at <u>drivesafe.tewin@gmail.com</u>

#### Bridge Cottage Patient Participation Group.

Patient Participation Groups (PPGs) are now an established part of the interaction between GP surgeries and their patients. As of 2016 establishing a PPG has become part of the contract between NHS England and GP surgeries.

At the end of 2015 the Welwyn Parish Plan Group approached the Bridge Cottage Practice with a proposal to set up a PPG and in March 2016 the Bridge Cottage PPG was launched by 11 local volunteers.

The role of a PPG is to act as a "critical friend" of the practice. As this description implies it is designed to strengthen local health provision through an open and frank relationship with a Practice, raising questions on organisational matters, finding solutions to justifiable concerns and helping the Practice to introduce and publicise Health Service improvements. It is a two-way conduit of information, from patients to Practice and vice versa.

Typical examples of PPG involvement are, promoting healthy living advice, health walks, publicising and supporting campaigns such as obesity control, diabetes prevention and treatment, encouraging the uptake of health checks and flu jabs, publicising support advice for carers and gathering reports of hospital and post-hospital experiences. It is, however, most important to emphasise that the PPG cannot and will not make reference to any individual clinical or personal health matter nor can the PPG be used to obtain any personal advantage for clinical treatment.

Members of the Bridge Cottage PPG meet at the surgery every two months to review progress and agree future work. However, in order to become really effective we must reach a wider spectrum of the patient population. We are therefore creating a larger "virtual PPG" of patients willing to receive information online, to spread the message and report responses. This is already happening and if you would like to join this PPG you can sign up on line. Go to **www.bridgecottagesurgery.nhs.uk** and click on Get Involved. You may also get a letter from the surgery inviting you to join.

The PPG has a Notice Board in the surgery, where you queue for reception. Up to date information is posted on this. We have just had our first AGM and a report of that will be on the board.

#### **Recollections of an Evacuee (Noreen Knights (née Parry))**

On Sunday 21<sup>st</sup> July 1940, with several children from St. Andrews Primary School, I was taken by bus to Hastings railway station destined for Tewin in Hertfordshire. We arrived at this village primary school overlooking a green. There were several adults present ready to pick up their evacuees. It had been arranged that I should be billeted with my mother's friend's daughter who was nine years old, two years younger than me. We were taken by a young woman up a hill to be delivered to our billet. The house was on a lovely estate, big houses, with gardens that wrapped around the houses. For the next two months my friend and I shared a single bed in a small room. Our days were taken up with walking down to the school each day, no lessons but playing games on the green or playing in the school.

We were given our breakfast in the kitchen by the daily help, given a sandwich each for the "dinner break" and walked back to the house after school to be given a high tea by the daily help. We never did see the dining room or the sitting room, only through the windows! During the evenings we were allowed in the garden to play with the dog or water the garden with the man of the house, which we found was great fun. So we really didn't see much of the village.

However, in September, I was informed that I, with another girl, would be transferred to Ware because we had passed the eleven plus exams for Hastings High School. The school had evacuated to Ware and was sharing the premises with Ware Grammar School. We were billeted in a nice house, and the lady was really kind as was her 18 year old daughter. Norah Avery and I stayed there for two years but, whilst on a short break to Hastings, we were surprised to find that we had been moved to a council estate to be with a lady who had three small daughters aged 3, 6, and 9 years old. This time, though, we shared a double bed!

Luckily Norah's parents had moved to Tewin that year, her mother to be the house keeper to an elderly gentleman. I believe it was a council house. He invited Norah and me over every other weekend. We explored this small village, got to know where the best mushrooms grew in the surrounding fields and how to flirt with the 16yr old lad in the local garage on the left hand side of the hill I used to walk every day. Why? Because he used to save batteries for our torch to read under the bedclothes in Ware. Norah's Dad used to take us out around the fields to teach us about nature, and her mother took us up to London occasionally. We walked across fields to catch the workman's return train, had lunch in the British Restaurant (no coupons needed) queue up for cream cakes, then to a show. On the way back across the fields Norah and I would sing the songs we had heard in the shows to her Mum's cry of ENOUGH!

In 1944 the High School was allowed to return to Hastings. Norah and I transferred to Ware Grammar and stayed in the billet. By this time Norah's mother had started work in the orchard which was situated up the hill on the right hand side. We stayed with her during the 6 weeks summer holiday, and, as she was then manager of the orchard, got Norah and me a job for the holidays. We picked apples, learned how to cut cordons back and earned a weekly wage. I wanted to pay for my keep but was firmly told no, but to buy my Ware Grammar school uniform for the coming year.

Tewin was, during our time there, one road into the village, two lanes out and one very infrequent bus from Hertford. Apart from the houses, garage and orchard situated on one lane the rest was fields -what bliss.

### **Team Vicar's Letter**

#### Easter Birth

We like Christmas. It is about birth, babies, angels, stars, cute shepherds and shiny kings.

Easter, however, is less useful for entertaining proud Granny at a school production. Betrayal, torture, the cross, a cold tomb, grief and loss all have to come before, frankly, a rather unspectacular resurrection. We can understand why Easter is not such a popular production by the Under 5's.

So Easter we have to make more palatable by chocolate, bunnies and daffodils. We prefer birth to death.

Only, if we look closer, then they are the same. Both the Christmas and Easter stories happen in the dark. In both, Jesus is homeless, in a borrowed space – a stone stable for his birth, a stone-cold tomb for his resurrection.

There is no Herod who is looking to kill him this time round, as the powers think they've already managed that rather well. But there are kings bringing gifts: not exotic Magi, but rather a caravan of weeping women, crowned with love, who with tears of gold fill the tomb with the smell of myrrh and holy incense.

There are angels. Yet this time they are even closer than before. Not caught up in the clouds but sitting comfortably on the side of the tomb.

There is birth, in abundance. The tomb, like the womb, is left empty. It is a different Mary that sees Jesus after a long night of pain. Mary Magdalene meets him in the garden and her grief is turned to joy. Another birth.

There are sheep, and shepherds. As the resurrected Jesus meets Peter on the shore, showing him the life-giving power of love, he says to this rejected man 'Do you love me?' and each time Peter says 'you know I love you'. Jesus commands him to care for his lambs. Forgiveness and a new life lie before Peter. A man is reborn. Another birth.

Easter, like Christmas, is a story of birth. Only this time not just of one small child, but life that comes to us over and over again – in forgiveness, in fresh starts, in life appearing when we could see only death.

So wrap up the presents, pile into church, feast with those you love, tell the good news to children – ' Easter is like Christmas, but a thousand times better!'
