# LOVE IN A SHOEBOX

Judy Puddefoot collected 131 well-wrapped shoeboxes from here on Monday 27<sup>th</sup> November. They looked so lovely all stacked up together in my hall. THANK YOU very much all those who worked so hard to make this possible. Judy has since told me that over 6,000 boxes were transported from this area and she thinks that Tewin boxes went to Liberia.

I mentioned 'Love in a Shoebox' because there is actually a book of that name which I have read and passed on. This tells the story of two men in Wrexham North Wales, having seen the images of children on TV in orphanages tied to their cots in Romania, took as many gifts and provisions as they could stuff into a hired van and drove across Europe to some of these orphanages because they just wanted to do something to help. They were greeted first with suspicion, but then warmly welcomed because the staff were just as demoralised as the children. This became a regular trip and at Christmas time they got the locals to wrap shoeboxes to take toys, sweets and toiletries etc to some of these orphanages. This is how Operation Christmas Child began. It became a world-wide charity when Samaritans Purse took over the project years later.

I reported last year that since 2002 (this does not include the school) we had collected 2673 boxes so now the total is 2804!

# **Tewin Parish Council**



The Parish Council would like to thank Friends of Tewin for decorating the Christmas tree this year and for helping to organize the carol singing event. They would also like to thank Mr. V. Murray for kindly PAT testing the tree lights.

#### **Precept**

The Council reviewed Estimate to Year End for Financial Year Ending 31.3.2018 and the precept options for the Financial Year Ending 31.3.2019 and in accordance with the Financial Regulations of the Council they unanimously agreed that the precept be increased by 1.69% from £29,500 to £30,000 in line with inflation.

#### Tewin Drivesafe Speed Awareness Group

We are delighted to report that the fixed flashing solar powered speed indication device ("SID") is up and running on the verge on Upper Green. This was arranged following a successful grant application to the Herts Police & Crime Commissioner by the Tewin Drivesafe Speed Awareness Group last December. The SID will show the speed a driver is travelling at and if the vehicle is within the speed limit a green smiley face, if above the speed limit a red frowning face. Data will be collected from it to assess traffic speeds.

Tewin Drivesafe Speed Awareness Group is a dedicated team of volunteers that turns out 2 to 3 times month to speed check vehicles entering or leaving the village. They use a portable speed indicator device ("SID") which highlights each car's speed to help improve all drivers' speed awareness as many people are not aware how fast they are driving on local roads which have a 30mph limit.

Tewin Parish Council are very supportive of the Drivesafe group and are hopeful that their continued operation will encourage motorists to slow down through Tewin. #### Lower Green

The southern point of Lower Green has been damaged by vehicles crossing over it so the Parish Council has agreed to place some granite blocks to deter traffic and protect the green.

#### Parish Paths Partnership (P3) Grant 2017

Unfortunately drainage works on BR4 down to Lousehole Bottom have been delayed due to cost so the Parish Council has agreed to use the 2017 grant to rebuild the steps on FP26 opposite the shop, level FP13 by Muspatt's Farm and replace the handrail and install a new one on the footbridge on FP23. The remaining monies from the P3 grant will go towards gate repairs completed on footpaths: 41,17,13.

#### **Pavilion Extension**

Following requests from users of the Pavilion for a larger hall/meeting room so more people within the community can take part in the numerous activities at this popular public amenity, Tewin Parish Council has obtained planning permission to extend the hall/meeting room and changing rooms.

These works will be financed from funds donated by Tewin Parish Council, Tewin Pavilion Community Interest Company and Friends of Tewin as well as grant funds awarded by National Lottery Awards 4 All, Tarmac Landfill Communities Fund and East Herts Community Grant. The extension works are expected to start in Spring 2018.

# Hertfordshire County Council calls on residents to help reduce loneliness

Hertfordshire County Council is calling on residents to catch-up with older and vulnerable neighbours this winter after a recent survey

revealed that one in four people never speak to their neighbours.

As part of our campaign to reduce loneliness in Hertfordshire and to highlight its effect on the health and wellbeing of people, we asked

residents in a snap twitter poll how often they have conversations with their neighbours.

While over half of those who responded spoke to their neighbours every day or at least once a week, almost half of those who responded never had a conversation or only spoke once a month.

The survey results showed:

- 14 per cent speak to their neighbours every day
- 43 per cent speak to their neighbours once a week
- 16 per cent speak to their neighbours once a month
- 27 per cent never speak to their neighbours

The Campaign to End Loneliness has released a study that shows one million older people in the UK suffer chronic loneliness.

Loneliness can be felt by people of all ages, although older people and those with physical and learning disabilities are particularly vulnerable.

Colette Wyatt-Lowe, Cabinet Member for Adult Care and Health, said: "Loneliness can have an awful effect on the health and wellbeing of older and vulnerable people but it is something we can all play our part in reducing.

"People can feel particularly lonely at this festive time of year, so why not pop in and say hello to your neighbours, invite them in for a cuppa, or find out if there are any jobs or tasks that you could help out with. One small gesture could make a real difference to somebody."

The impact of social isolation can be significant; research suggests being lonely can be as bad for your health as smoking 15 cigarettes a day and can be far worse than obesity and physical inactivity. So, getting to know and spending time with your neighbours has a positive effect on your health and wellbeing.
