#### County Council Welcomes Critical Report On Great Northern And Thameslink Rail Services

Hertfordshire Council has welcomed the publication of the National Audit Office (NAO) report criticising the Great Northern and Thameslink train services operated by GTR. The report says that these services have been the worst in the country over the last three years.

Cabinet Member for Transport, Derrick Ashley, said: "Thousands of local residents rely on these services to get to work every day. They should not have to suffer regular delays and cancellations. A good train service is a vital part of our transport plans for the county, and will only become more important as we see more homes built in our area."

The NAO report highlights shortcomings in the Government's Department for Transport and Network Rail as well as by the train operator.

Derrick Ashley continued: "I hope that the Department for Transport responds positively to the report and introduces improvements. For example we urgently need the fifth platform at Stevenage station as the train company is about to introduce bus replacement between Hertford North and Stevenage due to the lack of platform capacity. Another quick win would be the introduction of the Oyster card to Hertford North services."

The NAO report comes in advance of major timetable changes which will be introduced from May. Final details of the new timetable will be published by GTR this month.

#### **February Facts**

The months of January and February were added to the Roman calendar by Numa Pompilous when the calendar was increased from 10 to 12 months. The name derives from Februa which means cleansing or purification. The Anglo Saxons called February 'Sol-monath', cake month, because cakes were offered to the gods in that month. It was also known to the Saxons as 'sprout-kale' from the sprouting of cabbages and kale.

In Shakespeare's time, about 400 years ago, the second month was known as 'Feverell'. In Isaac Newton's time, about 100 years later, it had become 'Februeer'. The modern name of February is only about 100 years old.

Shrove Tuesday marks 40 days before Easter. In 2018 this falls on the 13th February.

The flower called Snowdrop first appears in February. The 'drop' refers to eardrop another name for an earring.

#### Tewin Website News February 2018 www.tewinvillage.co.uk

The website group has met five times this year to monitor and review the content of the site. There were 56,437 hits on the website during 2017. This is an increase on the previous year of over 5,000. The average number of visitors to the site each month is 4,703, however in August the number of visits peaked at 7,491, presumably due to the Classic Car Show.

The group saw some personnel changes at the beginning of 2017 but I'm pleased to say that we carry on with the same cheerful spirit as before.

Malcolm Allen convenes the meetings, Anne Hall takes the notes and is the new Tewin Webmaster and Felix Green is our Technical Advisor. Friends of Tewin own the domain name and fund the registration costs every two years.

#### Libraries Consultation: Have your say on how we deliver your services

Hertfordshire residents have the chance to help shape the future of library services in the county by taking part in the Inspiring Libraries consultation. The public consultation is open from 8 January to 18 February 2018 and seeks to find out library users', residents' and other interested parties' views on whether an alternative delivery model approach would work in Hertfordshire.

'Inspiring Libraries – the next phase' was recently agreed by the County Council . Part of the strategy sets out a suggested proposal for delivering the library service in a different way, which could contribute savings to the ongoing pressures on the County Council budget. This idea is supported by national government and similar models are already in place in a number of other local authorities, including Suffolk, Nottinghamshire and Devon.

Terry Douris, Cabinet Member for Libraries, said:

"Ongoing pressure on the County Council budget means that we have to consider how we can continue to save money across all services.

"In order to achieve our ambitions for 'Inspiring Libraries' within a reduced budget and put ourselves in the best position to grasp future opportunities, we need to identify the most appropriate way of managing the library services in the years ahead, and we welcome your views."

Options under consideration include:

- Keeping the service in-house run by the County Council.
- Operating the service through a Local Authority Trading Company.
- Transferring the service to a Public Service Mutual a not for profit organisation, created and commissioned by the County Council to run the service.
- Outsourcing the service to a third party an independent organisation or business.
- Operating the service through a joint venture a partnership between the County Council and a third party organisation.

Reply: Plastic tops from bottles and jar lids should be removed and placed loose into the blue lidded bin.

2. How best to wrap-up paper-shreddings from our shredder ?

Reply: Shredded paper should either be placed loose into your brown bin or can be placed into an envelope and placed into your paper box.

3. Should we put black plastic food-trays into blue recycle or black rubbish bin? Reply: Black plastic food trays are acceptable in your blue lidded bin.
