Why Does the Date of Easter Change?

Easter is what is known as a 'moveable feast' because the date depends on the moon. Easter Sunday falls on the first Sunday after the first full moon of the Spring Equinox. But what is an Equinox? Equinox translates from Latin as 'equal night'. This is the time of year when the sun is closest to the Equator which results in equal days and nights all over the world. This happens twice a year in March and September. At other times of the year the tilt of the Earth brings the land above the Equator, the Northern Hemisphere, closer to the sun which results in longer Summer days whilst the Southern Hemisphere is tilted further away giving shorter, Winter days. When this is reversed, the Northern hemisphere has shorter days whilst the Southern hemisphere has longer days.

Team Vicar's Letter

Every other year on Easter morning, a motley bunch gather on a hillside in Datchworth while it is still dark. Slipping out of our houses, some of us still in our pyjamas (ok, usually that's just the vicar) we creep out while others are sleeping and wait for the dawn. It's a physical, tangible reminder of a deeper spiritual mystery – that belief that light will conquer all darkness, shown through the deathshattering resurrection of Jesus Christ.

We light a fire. We sing songs. We listen with glee as the sky lightens and larks rise from the fields singing in return above our heads. We shout like lunatics 'Christ has risen!' and then we go back to the church hall for a hearty breakfast.

This year Hollywood has released another biblical blockbuster. It's the story of Mary Magdalene, that friend and follower of Jesus who came 'while it was still dark' to the tomb to anoint his body and yet found it empty and, whilst blinded by tears of grief, was awakened by his light as she heard him call her name once more.

I wonder what it was like for her as she approached the tomb? I wonder if Mary could see the sky begin to lighten, or if she was aware of stirring birds fluffing their feathers and stretching their throats ready to sing?

The story tells us that although Jesus is raised it isn't until he calls her name that she recognizes him. After that Mary runs off, the first witness to the resurrection, and tells his disciples, who don't believe her as she is only a woman. But it was she who God entrusted with this message of unstoppable life. The 'apostle to the apostles' is the title given to her. Mary, having stayed to witness the darkness of the cross, is the first to see the light of the risen Son.

So set your alarms, draw open your curtains, stand in the garden or indeed join us on the hillside and watch for the dawn. See the light conquer the darkness. Scare those dawn birds silly by shouting 'Christ is risen!' like an utter lunatic. And, like Mary, be unafraid to live life knowing that is true, even when others mock, because he too calls you by name.

I wish you all a very happy Easter.

You may even have taken pride in telling others of your heroic intended abstinence, hardly the idea of it all. The question during Lent never asked is "how is your abstinence going?" perhaps for fear that it might be asked of you in return.

It is traditionally a season of fasting and self-examination. If, as is often the case, you have given up chocolate or puddings or alcohol with your gaze fixed partly on physical wellbeing rather than spiritual, then your self-examination may have been confined to frequent use of the bathroom scales. Your reward may be here but not perhaps in heaven. I have to admit that I gave up nothing this year. My experience of Lenten abstinence in the past has put it frequently in the same category as New
