#### **Councillors Agree Plans For Future Of Hertfordshire Libraries**

Councillors have recommended a new approach for providing library services in Hertfordshire. A Public Service Mutual (PSM) model has been endorsed, subject to a full business plan, which could result in the creation of a new independent organisation to provide library services on behalf of the council. The decision follows a public consultation, which received more than 2,000 responses, which asked for views on a range of different approaches. The PSM model has already been successfully implemented in a number of other areas in recent years, including Devon, Nottinghamshire, Suffolk and York and is a model that would allow savings to be made without reducing the quality of service customers receive. By pursuing a Public Service Mutual the county council is not privatising libraries or outsourcing services to a profit making organisation.

#### HIGHWAYS

**Extra Funds** - Ken Crofton, Herts County Councillor has advised that there will be £29 million available to add to the Herts Highways budget over the next 4 years to improve unclassified roads. They have also been successful with a central government grant appli-

cation for an extra £1.8 million government funding to assist in further pothole repairs.

**May Pond Green** - The Parish Council has purchased a replacement Wild Service Tree for May Pond Green and a date for planting will be arranged in due course. The Parish Council would be grateful for any offers to help water the tree during the summer months.

**Gulley Cleansing** - This is scheduled in June 2018 and the Parish Council has submitted a list of gulleys that are not draining properly to James Vine, Highways District Service Agent and Ken Crofton, Herts County Councillor. **Orchard Road** - Ken Crofton, Herts County Councillor, advised that the stretch of Orchard Road from the Desborough Drive bus shelter to the junction by Tebbutts is on the list for jet pack treatment when the equipment is next in the area.

#### LOWER GREEN

**Damage to Verges** - Netherdown (Herts) Ltd have confirmed that they will ensure any verges damaged by them will be restored to their original state once works are over. They have also confirmed that from now on deliveries have been advised to enter the village via Churchfield Road not Hertford Road and will reinforce this with future deliveries. They will also try and keep the use of larger goods vehicles to a minimum. However, due to the size and weight of some items, they can only be delivered in the larger goods vehicles. **PLANNING** 

**6/2018/0158/OUTLINE - Land South of Money Hole Lane -** Outline permission for the relocation of runway, erection of clubhouse,hanger, car park and aircraft parking with all matters except access and layout reserved - *Tewin Parish Council objected based upon noise, pollution, nuisance, unsuitable location, site is too close to housing, clash with Luton flight paths, nuisance of flight paths over Tewin, nuisance and hazards of acrobatics over or near populated areas, unsuitable and dangerous access.* 

At the time of print a decision had not been made.

**6/2018/0873/OUTLINE - Land to North East of WGC, Panshanger** - Outline application for a residential-led development of up to 650 residential units, a two form entry primary school, provision of six gypsy and traveller pitches, a new local centre (comprising retail and community uses), new vehicular access

from Herns Lane, car parking, associated infrastructure and landscaping works.

**NB**: This application uses all the available non Green Belt land with no provision for part of the runway applied for in the previous application. Deadline for comments is 2nd May 2018.

#### EAST HERTS LOCAL DISTRICT PLAN MAIN MODIFICATIONS CONSULTATION

The following comments from Tewin Parish Council have been submitted:

#### 1. Reference MM/10/15 - Policy VILL2 Group 2 Villages

IV. Prior to a Parish Council preparing a Neighbourhood Plan, development in the villages listed above will be limited to the built up area as defined on the Policies Map. (Renumbered) Paragraph 10.3.9 specifically states that Group 2 villages in the Rural Area Beyond the Green Belt can use a Neighbourhood Plan to include development on the periphery of the built up area. By inference, this means that Group 2 villages either washed over or inset from the Green Belt cannot use a Neighbourhood Plan to include development on the periphery of the built up area.

Clause IV of VILL2 does not make this distinction clear, and a better wording would be "In Group 2 villages in the Rural Area beyond the Green Belt, development on the periphery of the main built up area of the village, as identified in an adopted Neighbourhood Plan, will be permitted. Otherwise development in the villages listed above will be limited to the built up area as defined on the Policies Map."

#### 2. Reference MM/10/18 - Renumbered 10.4.2

Group 2 Villages located within (washed over by) the Green Belt will not be permitted to amend their village development boundary through the Neighbourhood Planning process.

(Renumbered) Paragraph 10.3.9 specifically states that Group 2 villages in the Rural Area Beyond the Green Belt can use a Neighbourhood Plan to include development on the periphery of the built up area. By inference, this means that Group 2 villages either washed over or inset from the Green Belt cannot use a Neighbourhood Plan to include development on the periphery of the built up area.

To be consistent with 10.3.9, it would be useful if the final sentence of 10.4.2 was written "Group 2 Villages located within (washed over by <u>or inset from</u>) the Green Belt will not be permitted to amend their village development boundary through the Neighbourhood Planning process."

## Team Vicar's Letter

The Underwoods have been smoking. We're getting quite good. Having built a smoke house at the bottom of the garden and spent two days in the Lake District learning the art, last month the Rectory was full of the delights of smoked cheese, kippers, bacon, butter, garlic, nuts and aubergine (for the vegetarian two).

There's another kind of smoke house I'm rather fond of. The church has also been smoking for centuries. Incense burned during services fills the church and its congregations with sweet-smelling smoke -a sign of both the mysterious holiness of God and the prayers of his people rising into the air. Granted not everyone likes this, and at Tewin and Datchworth it's not a practice we indulge in, but whilst being busy with the Underwood smoke house it did leave me with a point to ponder...

The Underwood smoke house leaves everything stinking. Everything. Open the door to retrieve the cheese, the smoke sticks to your clothes and hair and is impossible to remove without shower gel the strength of sheep dip. Bring the smoke goods into the house – the house stinks too. Even the metal baking trays, after a hot soapy wash, still stink of smoke - because smoke sticks - that's why it's so useful to food. And so if smoke sticks and permeates into every pore, it made me think of every prayer that has ever been said for me or by me. The symbolism of prayer in the wafting thurible at churches seems to suggest that prayers disappear into the air but I now wonder if that is true. Having spent time with smoke, and indeed discovering quite how much it loves to cling, it gave me a different picture of prayer leaving a residue on the pray-er and the prayed for. How these tokens of holy love have an eternal quality, and so we may well picture that they permeate our beings covering us in the love of those who utter them, and the love of God who hears them.

I was prayed for at my baptism, as a chubby babe when I had no sense of what was going on. Yet as the years have passed I have found myself thinking of the power of those prayers at the time, and how they have played their part in moulding who I am today. I think prayers, like smoke, stick – but we might be thankful their aroma is somewhat less pungent.
