FLIGHT

It had taken only 30 minutes since we had parked the 4WD in the haystubble field. The strong ammonia-like smell from the hay + manure pile 100 yards away buzzed in our nostrils but spurred us on to work hard and fast. Two large canisters of gas hung inside the brown basket as it was rolled off the blue trailer onto the grass.

Then the whirr of the angry fan and the yellow whoosh of gas-fired hot air had filled the red & green canvas as it lay on the grass, until s-l-o-w-l-y it began to rise Whoosh and roar, the guy-ropes tightened and then freeee at last we three were rising steadily into fresher air. The strong floor of the balloon-basket and 25 feet of thin air now separated our feet from the stubble field below.

The fires blasted loudly with a smell of hot-metal as two tongues of flame shot high into the balloon chamber - they fuelled our slow and steady rise to 300 ft and more. Two riders on the bridleway below stopped awhile to pat & reassure their horses as they looked up.

We crossed above a field that was waxy-blue with long-grown flax and maybe thought there was the faintest smell of flowers wafting up in the air. W-h-o-o-a-a-a-r-r-r went the flames once more and again the smell of hotsteel was imagined. The cheeky whoop-whoop of a piped steam-whistle below gave way to the clink-clank of huge metal wheels as the big steamengine pondered its way down towards the ChurchFields. The smell we caught in the air now was a mixture of black-burning coal and the high clean tincture of metal and oil from the proud steam-wagon.

Fire and air above looked down on coal and fire below. Fire and coal below gazed up at air and fire above. With a helping gust of wind from the West we broke free of each others' gaze and spun along towards the East side of the village. As we passed beyond and above the high square church tower we saw by the river below, two wizened old ladies in Sunday best dresses. They were dancing a jig to the sound of the bells and swivelled their heads in a Bollywood kind of way. I am sure they looked up at us and waved. Later that evening when we had returned to the village. I took the dog out for her nightly walk through the blue flaxen fields. She was so pleased at our return. and she bounded off happily along the path across the field. If she could smell the coal or the oil in the air, she didn't give it a care, but she did leave her scent by the corner tree before bounding off to race a figure of 8 round the twin scarecrows in the low field by the river.

Plants for a Parched Garden

When a garden is fried and the grass is the colour of straw you could be forgiven for dreaming of luxurious, lush foliage. Most plants do their growing in Spring, so the foliage you see on the plant in the garden centre in August is all that it is going to make until next spring. However there are some rare exceptions which go on making more lush foliage right to the end of the season.

Melianthus major will continue making new growth sometimes all the way to Christmas. A decent specimen bought now and planted in good soil and sun will fill out and unscroll many more waxy grey-green leaves.

A young plant of purple cut leaf elder bush such as *Sambucas nigra* 'Black Lace' (ultimately 2-3m tall x 2m wide) will go on making new leaves at the ends of its twigs when planted in seriously enriched soil. Just chop it back to 1-1.5m in Spring to produce another crop of dramatic foliage. Its wine purple colouring is a great partner for silver greys such as *Elaeagnus* 'Quick Silver' oleaster (2.5 x 2m) and looks superb infiltrated by the white-felted stems of the Dusty Miller grape vine, *Vitus vinifera* 'Incana'. This vine is also terrific planted through the purple smoke bush, *Cotinus* 'Grace', or one of the dark-leaved ninebark bushes (*physocarpus*, up to 2m x 2m) such as 'Diabolo' or 'Lady in Red' which you could also plant now.

2018 has been a year for some significant commemorations -70 years of the NHS, 100 years since Britain saw the first votes for women - and in November we will remember the centenary of Armistice day, the end of the first world war.

It will be a poignant marker in our calendar, because we will have to hold together in remembrance both the joy, relief and hope that a new peacetime brought to millions, alongside the great loss of life occurred during that conflict and in countless conflicts since.

Our church would like to be able to mark that visibly during our Remembrance Day service, and we are inviting every member of the community, young and old, to contribute. The idea is that you make a poppy and/or a dove in whatever way you wish and leave it in church by the 21st October.
