East Herts Council District Plan

The East Herts District Plan was subject to an Examination in Public with hearing sessions held between October 2017 and January 2018 followed by a period of public consultation on the Main Modifications agreed through the Examination between February and March 2018.

Following receipt of the Inspector's Final Report on the Examination of the East Herts District Plan on 9th July 2018, an Extraordinary Council meeting has been arranged for Tuesday 11th September 2018, at which the Council will be asked to determine the adoption of the District Plan.

Orchard Road Leak & Potholes

Affinity Water have visited the site and have been called back as the leak has re-occurred. Herts Highways have issued Affinity Water with a Section 81 defect notice and they will monitor the site until completion.

The gulley will also be cleansed as part of the priority gulley cleanse which is due in Tewin imminently.

Harwood Close Roadworks

Following the reappearance of the void under the road at the entrance to Harwood Close, Herts Highways have arranged to re-attend the site to backfill the excavations and will arrange for a planned drainage investigation to identify any defects within the highway drainage system. The issue has also been reported to Thames Water so they can check the foul water line.

Tewin Cowper School Planning Application 3/18/0873/FUL

New reception block, new car park, new games area and alterations to existing play area.

This has been withdrawn and a new planning application will be submitted shortly with a new hipped roof to address the concerns of the immediate neighbours.

Team Vicar's Letter

A couple of years ago a small group of people from Tewin and Datchworth churches visited Stevenage Community Foodbank. It was set up by the Town Councillor, Jon Mead, who, on a visit to a resident one afternoon, happened to make a chance comment as her child ate beans on toast. "You'll be having your dinner later then" he said to the mother. But he was wrong. She explained that actually three nights a week she could only afford an evening meal for one of them, and so it was her daughter that ate, and that was just how it was.

From this Jon was moved into action and the Foodbank was set up. When we visited we met a number of people who were struggling to make ends meet. A man who was being made homeless as his partner had died and the council tenancy was in her name. A young father who had just been given emergency custody of his young child who were being housed in a bed and breakfast. And a young woman who came back to deliver a thank you card to the Foodbank – recently back in employment and grateful to those who helped her out when times were tough.

This month we celebrate harvest. The church will be richly decorated, we give thanks for the work of our farmers, we will have gifts to give to some of the elderly of our villages, our collection will go to support farmers in developing countries— but also we will collect tins, packeted food and toiletries for the Foodbank. The amount of people who experience food crisis in this country is increasing and Foodbanks are struggling with demand. You can leave a donation in the box in the church porch or Tewin stores at anytime. Do please give generously.

What are Quarter Days?

In British and Irish tradition, the **quarter days** were the four dates in each year on which servants were hired, school terms started, and rents were due. They fell on four religious festivals roughly three months apart and close to the two solstices and two equinoxes.

The significance of quarter days is now limited, although commercial leasehold payments and rents for land and premises in England are often still due on the old English quarter days.

The quarter days have been observed at least since the Midde Ages, and they ensured that debts and unresolved lawsuits were not allowed to linger on. Accounts had to be settled, a reckoning had to be made and publicly recorded on the quarter days.

The English quarter days (also observed in the Channel Islands and Wales) are:

Lady Day (25 March) Midsummer Day (24 June) Michaelmas Day (29 September) Christmas Day (25 December)

Lady Day was also the first day of the year in British dominions (excluding Scotland) until 1752 (when it was harmonised with the Scottish practice of 1 January being New Year's Day). The British tax year still starts on "Old" Lady Day (6 April under the Gregorian Calendar corresponded to 25 March under the 'new' Julian Calendar). The cross-quarter days are four holidays falling in between the quarter days: Candlemas (2 February), May Day (1 May),Lammas (1 August), and All Hallows (1 November).

There is a mnemonic for remembering on which day of the month the first three quarter-days fall (Christmas being easy to recall): Every quarter day is twenty-something, and the second digit of the day of the month is the number of letters in the month's name. So March has five letters and Lady Day is 25 March; similarly June has four letters and September nine, with Midsummer Day and Michaelmas falling on the 24th and 29th respectively.

At many schools, class terms would begin on the quarter days; for example, the Autumn term would start on 29th September, and thus continues to be called the *Michaelmas term*, especially at more traditional universities.
