#### East Herts Council District Plan

Following the issuing of a holding statement from the Secretary of State, Rt. Hon James Brokenshire MP, there has been a delay in adopting the East Herts Council District Plan. East Herts Council remain confident in the soundness of the Plan and will work with the Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government to resolve any issues. Due to the impact that this will have on the local and wider community and in view of the thorough examination of the Plan that has already taken place, East Herts Council will encourage the Secretary of State to act expeditiously to avoid further uncertainty. Support is being provided by Mark Prisk and Oliver Heald, David Williams, colleagues from other districts and from Essex County Council. ## **Team Vicar's Letter**

As I write the Team Rector, David Munchin, is currently cycling over the Swiss Alps as part of a 1,900 mile cycle trip from Welwyn to Rome. I hope, by the time you read this he will have arrived safely and will be enjoying the world's largest Cornetto.

His ride is part of a three month sabbatical that clergy are offered every ten years or so - a chance for refreshment and extended study. He will spend a month on his bike travelling alone across Europe, a month at the Anglican Centre in Rome and then a month studying in Norfolk.

The wonders of technology mean however that despite being far from home it is quite easy to see what he is up to. A tracker on his bike, which is linked to his Facebook page, means dedicated followers can see his exact location. It's strangely addictive watching this tiny blue dot wind its way across Europe. It's so accurate that you can see every wrong turn, guess when it has been hovering for 20 minutes that it's probably yet another puncture, or know that the scenery must be spectacular as he cycles the edge of great lakes, or winds up mountainous roads.

For those of you who are Harry Potter fans there was a magical version of this cycle app called the marauders map. Once in Harry, Hermione and Ron's possession it allowed them to track the movements of everyone in Hogwarts school. Particularly advantageous was knowing when the caretaker was out of the way so they could sneak out at night.

It crossed my mind then, as it does now watching David, that it would be quite wonderful to have an app to track members of the congregation. Not in a crazed stalker way, but rather because every Sunday we are sent out with the words 'Go in peace to love and serve the Lord', and every week, in unseen different ways, there is all sorts of good work happening that few really see. The visit to a poorly neighbour, the runs to the foodbank, the travels of Furniture Friends, the community activities. I can imagine all sorts of dots moving about, being busy or sitting still in prayer.

But I guess I'll never see it all, although I guess God does.

#### Hallowe'en

All Hallows Eve (31st October). The evening before All Saints Day (1st November). As a child growing up in 1950s Scotland I was told that this was the time when the divide between the Spirit World and our world was at its thinnest and that ghosts and witches were on the lookout for unsuspecting children. We were only vulnerable if we were outside after dark and able to be recognised. We therefore dressed up, often as ghosts or witches to fool them into thinking that we were one of their own, and went 'guising. This involved knocking on the doors of our immediate neighbours and checking out our disguises by seeing if they knew who we were.

Much puzzlement was feigned and we were invited in to perform our 'party pieces' to see if that could help them identify us. We would entertain them by singing a song or reciting a poem or dancing. After the big reveal we would leave with a piece of cake or an apple or, if we were very lucky, a small sweet. This may help explain to younger readers out there why that strange couple in Godfries Close insist on being entertained before parting with a treat.

We were also accompanied by a Jack O'Lantern to help chase away the dark. This was made not from a soft-fleshed pumpkin (we'd never seen one) but a turnip (neep), the hollowing out of which with a spoon was not for the faint hearted or those short of time. At some point in Northern Britain there is a line at which a turnip becomes a swede and a swede becomes a turnip. In the interests of clarity, the turnips used were the large orange-fleshed vegetables.

When we returned home a washing up bowl of shallow water was waiting on the floor with one apple for each child floating around in it. We'd take it in turns to kneel down by the basin with our hands behind our backs and attempt to retrieve an apple with our teeth. Not an easy task even if your mother had chosen small, slightly soft apples! In some households, though not in ours, potato scones or small buns were covered in sticky, black treacle and suspended from the ceiling. The object of the game was to stand with hands behind your back and try and eat the scone without getting covered in treacle.
