Parish Council Audit

PKF Littlejohn LLP has completed the external auditor report and certificate in respect of the annual return for Tewin Parish Council and has issued an unqualified audit opinion as they consider the information in the annual return is in accordance with proper practices and

the relevant legislation and regulatory requirements have been met. This was approved and accepted by Tewin Parish Council and the notice of conclusion of audit and audit form is displayed on the Parish Council notice board for the statutory 14 days.

Tewin Pavilion

The Pavilion extension works are now finished and the Parish Council would like to thank the grant organisations: Tarmac via the Landfill Communities Fund, National Lottery Awards for All, East Herts Council Community Fund, Friends of Tewin, Tewin Cricket Club and Tewin Tennis Club. The extension has provided a more spacious hall with new more effective heating enabling more parishioners to participate in local facilities as well as larger changing rooms for the Cricket Club. One of the changing rooms has had a kitchenette installed so that the Tewin Tennis Club can use it for coffee if the hall is busy. The Parish Council would like to thank Tewin Memorial Hall for accommodating the various clubs during the works and everyone for their patience during this time.

Tree Works on Upper Green

Herts County Council, Rural Estates Department has apologised for the error concerning Gristwood & Toms removing trees on Upper Green on 9th August and on 11th October. HCC has confirmed that they have made a note on the files so this won't happen again. A copy of the tree survey has been requested for Tewin Parish.

Fairholme Stables Planning Application

3/18/2212/FUL - Fairholme Stables, Archers Green Lane, Tewin - Demolition of residential dwelling and outbuilding. Erection of 7 dwellings together with associated parking amenity space and vehicle access.

3/18/2211/FUL - Fairholme Stables, Archers Green Lane, Tewin - Demolition of existing buildings, erection of 5 dwellings together with associated parking amenity space and access from Archers Green Lane.

<u>THACS Experimental Watercolour Art Workshop</u> <u>6th November 10 a.m.- 4 p.m.</u>

There are still places on what promises to be a very exciting day. Jude O'Sullivan, who is our excellent tutor, will be giving us an opportunity to test techniques of sea salt, cling film, bleach, and wax resist on water-colour. It is a day suitable for students of all abilities. What you need to bring are 2 sheets of A2 watercolour paper, small sheets of watercolour paper or a watercolour sketchbook, watercolours and various brushes, a salt grinder with sea salt and a drawing board. However, Jude will provide all of these except the A2 watercolour sheets for participants who do not have other materials. (A2 watercolour sheets can be purchased from ART VAN GO in Knebworth).

The course will be held at Bramfield Village Hall whose ceiling-to-floor windows overlooking countryside provide a wonderful atmosphere and light for painting. The cost is £33 for members and £36 for non-members and participants are asked to bring something to share for lunch, which is usually a gastronomic delight.

Team Vicar's Letter

On August 4th 1918, 4 years after WW1 began, King George V attended a church service with Queen Mary and members of the Houses of Commons and Lords asking for the day to be a national day of prayer. 100 days later the war ended. Prayer can change things. This year's Remembrance Sunday marks the 100th anniversary of Armistice where fighting in WW1 would cease at 11am on the 11th day of the 11th month 1918.

Again, it was King George V who, in the following year, called for the nation and the Commonwealth to observe a two minute silence in 'remembrance of the glorious dead'.

It is often said that silence speaks when words cannot which is really what we do when, like so many other places around the world, we hold a two minute silence on 11th November, because there is nothing we can say that makes sense of the loss of life. The church has often played a major part in helping people to do that; to be silent when words fail us. These silent prayers can change things too.

Do join us at St. Peter's on Sunday 11th November. We will begin, as we always do, listening with heavy hearts to the roll of honour and then standing in silence as we remember both those whose lives were lost or shattered in war 100 years ago as well as those who still suffer the consequence of conflict now. But the invitation is not just to do that, but also to pray. The service will continue in church where we will add our prayers for peace with the millions of others that will be said that day. And if we are courageous enough to let our prayers transform our hearts, then perhaps they may somehow begin to transform the world.

TEWIN ORCHARD: APPLE DAY ONCE AGAIN A GREAT SUCCESS

Over 1,000 people celebrated the apple harvest at Tewin Orchard on Sunday, 7th at Herts and Middlesex Wildlife Trust's annual Apple Day event. Attendees enjoyed tours of the orchard, craft stalls and home-made refreshments. Children were treated to storytelling, wildlife crafts and a visit from Bertie the badger, the Trust's mascot. There were also fresh apples, apple juice and preserves to buy – all made from this year's apple harvest. Sales and donations raised over £4,000. The money will help the Trust protect and improve wildlife in Hertfordshire and Middlesex.

Lesley Davies, Herts and Middlesex Wildlife Trust's Chief Executive, said: "Our annual Apple Day is always a highlight in the Trust's calendar. It's fantastic to see so many people inspired and excited about wildlife. We would like to thank our wonderful volunteers, especially our volunteer wardens Anna and Michael Clark at Tewin Orchard, Councillor Ken Crofton for his generous donation and everyone who supported this year's Apple Day. The event was a great success and we are already looking forward to Apple Day 2019!" Tewin Orchard is one of Herts and Middlesex Wildlife Trust's nature reserves and supports a wide variety of wildlife. It has locally distinct fruit varieties and a specially-constructed badger hide which hosts badger-watching evenings from March until October.

Tewin Cricket Club



The curtains closed on Tewin Cricket Club's season last month after what has been a fantastic summer for the club.

Aided by the glorious Summer heatwave, the club played 52 fixtures over the Summer, winning 33, losing 17 and drawing/tying two. The first team secured back-to-back promotions, only losing two games all season, and will play their cricket in Division 5B of the Saracens Hertfordshire Cricket League next year.
