<u>East Herts District Plan</u>

On 23rd October 2018 East Herts Council adopted the East Herts District Plan as a development plan document. The Inspector confirmed, subject to a number of main modifications, the Plan was sound and recommended its adoption.

The documents can be viewed at the Council's website at www.eastherts.gov.uk/districtplan and are available for inspection during normal office hours at East Herts Council Offices in Hertford and Bishops Stortford, town council offices and libraries across the district. The Parish Council has been working towards gaining a Group 2 status for Tewin for a long while and the main point of note is that Tewin is now designated as a Group 2 village rather than a Group 1 village.

Group 1 Villages will need to accommodate at least a 10% increase in housing stock (based on the 2011 Census) over the 16-year period between 1st April 2017 and 31st March 2033.

Group 2 Villages are generally smaller villages where limited infill development, together with small-scale employment, leisure, recreation and community facilities will be permitted. This development should take place within the village development boundary.

No specific housing target has been identified for Group 2 villages. Where housing development does take place, this will contribute towards the Council's windfall allowance

All development should:

(a) Relate well to the village in terms of location, layout and connectivity;

(b) Be of a scale appropriate to the size of the village having regard to the potential cumulative impact of development in the locality;

(c) Be well designed and in keeping with the character of the village;

(d) Not represent the loss of a significant open space or gap important to the form and/or setting of the village;

(e) Not represent an extension of ribbon development or an addition to an isolated group of buildings;

(f) Not unacceptably block important views or vistas and/or detract from the openness of the countryside;

(g) Not be significantly detrimental to the amenity of neighbouring occupiers.

Team Vicar's Letter

Sometimes it strikes me as odd that many of us spend so much time 'preparing' to be as ready as possible for a 'perfect Christmas'. Why is it that out of all the seasons we celebrate somehow we think this one should have the perfect meal, the perfect presents, the perfect family with which to enjoy it – because the story at the heart of it all is far from that kind of idea of perfection.

When Jesus was born it seems few of those involved were perfect or prepared! We have the unmarried, heavily pregnant teenager, Mary, carrying a baby which is not Joseph's, travelling miles from home to be counted for the Roman census. There is no Booking.Com or Trivago, all the places to stay are full and, as we know, baby Jesus, the King of the world, is born not in luxury but in dirt and straw. As Jews living under occupation this young family knows what it is to be an outcast in society, indeed will soon find themselves as refugees fleeing the wrath of Herod.

The first Christmas was raw not perfect. It may be that circumstances this year mean that 'raw' is closer to how you feel, if so, God meets you there.

It may be that circumstances mean this is a particularly special Christmas filled with the joy of angels, if so, God meets you there. God was incarnate in Jesus (that is, God came to us in real, pinchable, touchable flesh and blood in Jesus) to meet us, whatever our circumstances, however prepared or unprepared we are, however raw or joyous we feel.

The Christmas message is one of love. God loves us and came to us, and comes to us still.

And that is a good reason to celebrate whether or not the turkey arrives in time.

Ringing To Mark 100 Years Since The End Of WW1

The Tewin ringers were proud to be part of the Ringing Remembers commemoration which saw bells ringing out across Britain on 11th November to remember the fallen. Part of the initiative was to recruit 1,400 new ringers to the tradition, being the number of bell-ringers lost in the First World War.

The St Peter's Sunday Service ringers rang half-muffled before the morning service on Armistice Day and the tenor was tolled at 11 a.m. to signal the start of the two minutes silence around the War Memorial outside the church.
