#### Tewin Drivesafe Speed Awareness Group

The 5 large "Slow Down Community Speed Watch Operates Here 30mph" signs have been installed throughout the village to promote speed awareness.

Tewin Drivesafe Speed Awareness Group is a dedicated team of volunteers that turns out 2 to 3 times a month to speed check vehicles entering or leaving the village. They use a portable speed indicator device ("SID") which highlights each car's speed to help improve all drivers' speed awareness as many people are not aware how fast they are driving on local roads which have a 30mph limit.

Tewin Parish Council are very supportive of the Drivesafe group and are hopeful that their continued operation will encourage motorists to slow down through Tewin. ## **Team Vicar's Letter**

These winter months are quite often a time when people's minds dream of sunnier times. Holiday bookings are at their highest during January and February. But this year I am having a very exciting time planning a somewhat longer break than usual.

Every ten years or so clergy are offered a sabbatical (or extended study leave as the new management of the Church of England now like to refer to it). It is a three month period out of parish life to experience and learn new things, to refresh and rest. How the time is used is variable. Super active cycling clergy may decide to do something daft like cycle from Welwyn to Rome (like our Team Rector did last year), but I don't quite have the puff to get over the alps. Rather I will be spending the months of May – July inclusive studying poetry.

I will be looking at all sorts of things, but have the delight of spending a bit of time in Florence, which inspired the exiled Dante in his epic The Divine Comedy. I will be visiting various literary festivals, pilgrimages and retreats as well as a bit of a stay in a theological library and a trip to France with the hope of having a bit of time to put pen to paper myself. I am also in contact with a number of poets and offering to buy them lunch if they'd give me an hour to tell me about their craft (my theory being they are largely a penniless bunch and so would be pleased to meet anyone who will shout them a sandwich).

It is an absolute treat and out of it I hope to return refreshed, inspired and sensitive enough to know not to bore you all completely with poetry overdoses in sermons and letters. But I do hope in my travels, through both pages and countries, to find tiny treasures that I may from time to time hold up to show you how they glisten in the sun.

It is also an absolute treat to work with such good Ministry Team colleagues and church wardens and to know that the treasures of churches I leave behind for that short period will be carefully looked after until I return.

#### **Revision of St Peter's Church Electoral Roll – Important Notice**

Our Church Electoral Roll is required to be revised every 6 years and so is due to be updated by April 2019 and confirmed at the annual APCM meeting which will be held on 25<sup>th</sup> April.

If you are already on the Electoral Roll or indeed would like to be added to it, then you will need to complete 2 forms. One is the application itself and the other relates to data protection and the use of your details.

We are now finalising and printing the forms, which will be available very shortly in Church. If you wish to remain on the Roll or be added to it, then your forms should be completed by 31<sup>st</sup> March and left in the wooden collection box at the back of the Church. If you have any queries about the process or the forms, then please speak to Pauline Brown or Nicky Hadley in the first instance. If required their telephone numbers are on the back of Tewin Magazine.

Tradition has it that Christmas decorations should come down the evening before Epiphany or, if that date is missed, then left up until Candlemas. But what is the significance of these dates? Were they just plucked out of the ether?

The liturgical or Church year is divided into several seasons. It begins with **Advent**, which looks forward to **Christmas**. The visit of the wise men to Jesus is remembered at **Epiphany**, after which there is a period of 'ordinary time'. The six weeks of **Lent** prepare us for **Easter**, which celebrates the resurrection of Jesus, leading forward to his **Ascension** and the gift of the Holy Spirit to the Church at **Pentecost**. 'Ordinary time' then resumes until the end of the year.

The Feast of the Epiphany, which always falls on 6 January, marks the beginning of a season which recognizes Jesus to be the Son of God.

The word 'epiphany' means 'manifestation' or 'appearance', and the Feast of the Epiphany marks the recognition of the newborn Jesus by the world. Later, the Church remembers the Baptism of Christ by John, when a voice from heaven declares Jesus to be God's beloved Son. Finally, on 2 February, the season of Epiphany ends with the Feast of the Presentation. Jesus is brought to the Temple by his parents after observing the traditional 40-day period of purification (of mothers) following his birth. There, he is recognized by Simeon, who declares him to be 'a light to lighten the Gentiles and the glory of God's people Israel.'

The traditional service for this feast includes a procession of candles, and so it is often known as Candlemas.

There is an old rhyme which says that:

*The Snowdrop, in purest white array, first rears its head on Candlemas Day* 

The Snowdrop is also known as the Candlemas Bell.

#### Tewin Website Annual News Bulletin www.tewinvillage.co.uk

The website group has met six times this year to monitor and review the content of the site. There were 63,528 hits on the website during 2018, an increase on the previous year of over 7,000. The average number of visitors to the site each month is 5,294, however in August the number peaked at 7,532, presumably due to interest generated by the Tewin Classic Car & Craft Show.

I'm pleased to say that our Group continues to meet with a very cheerful spirit. Malcolm Allen continues to convene our meetings, Anne Hall takes the notes and is the Tewin Webmaster and Felicia Green is our Technical Advisor. Friends of Tewin own the domain name and funds the registration costs every two years.

During the earlier part of 2018 we concentrated our efforts on reviewing the Business Page. Listed Businesses were contacted and asked if the details shown on the site are correct. Many needed updating and some businesses that had ceased to trade were removed.

We moved on to reviewing the pages listed under The Tewin Directory in an attempt to update the vast amount of information that these pages contain, much of which is out-of-date.

We also started looking at the Photographs and Videos area in an attempt to make it easier for members of the public to share their photographs of Tewin. We have been researching the possibility of using Flickr as a means to simplify the procedure for uploading photographs and this project is still on-going.

The Home page is frequently updated to show current information and we hope this is a useful asset for the village. We also do our best to keep the Events

Calendar up-to-date to let people know "What's On" in Tewin but obviously we are completely reliant on groups and organisations giving us details of their forthcoming plans.

I want to thank all of the website group for their contribution and friendship this year:

#### **Britain Changes to Decimal Currency**

On the 15th February 1971 Britain went decimal. All the banks were closed on the 11th and 12th to prepare for the changeover. 3 million pounds was spent on converting the country's phone boxes to take the new two pence piece and every cash register in the country had to be changed.

#### **Home Insulation Grants**

With the arrival of cold weather and the increase in heating bills now may be the time to check the insulation of your home.

It's sometimes possible to obtain free loft and/or cavity wall insulation to improve the energy efficiency of your home.

Offers change all the time and are usually for homes that need the most improvement by way of saving energy and that achieve the largest reduction in carbon dioxide emissions.

If you are interested in free loft or cavity wall insulation it's strongly recommended that you first contact your energy supplier to see if they are able to offer free or subsidised insulation.

Sometimes this is dependent on postcode or the receipt of particular benefits.

If free loft/ cavity wall insulation is not available to you or you want to arrange your own insulation measures, using a local contractor, then East Herts Council can offer a grant. For further details view the <u>Home Insulation Grants</u> page at https://www.eastherts.gov.uk/insulationgrants

The grant scheme is open to all homeowners in East Herts District. If you've been excluded from subsidised schemes because you used lofts for storage or have narrow wall cavities, it's worth considering applying.

The council can help towards the cost of home insulation by providing a

- 50% grant of up to £200 towards loft insulation works which provides 270mm depth loft insulation and
- 50% grant of up to £300 towards the cost of cavity wall insulation

Loft and cavity wall insulation are very important and have some of the fastest paybacks of any home insulation measure.
