PAVILION EXTENSION OPENING

Last summer Tewin Parish Council completed an extension of Tewin Pavilion on Upper Green which added extra space in the main function room for the many activities that take place there, extra space in the changing rooms for the cricket team, and a kitchenette for the tennis players. The work was funded by Tarmac via the Landfill Communities Fund, Big Lottery Fund -

Awards for All and East Herts Council Communities Activities Grant. The opening took place on 13th March 2019 at a meeting organised by the Village Hall Network Consortium and the Parish Council would like to thank East Herts Councillor Michael McMullen, Claire Pullen, Housing and Health Projects Officer, East Herts Council, Tim Hayward-Smith, CDA for Herts and the Village Hall network consortium for attending.

DOG FOULING POLICY

Tewin Parish Council endorses the following advice published on the East Herts Council website:

- Ø Be a responsible dog owner and carry disposable bags to ensure you can clean up after your dog, keep your dog under control at all times, keep your dog out of dog restricted areas, and do not allow the dog out alone.
- Ø Use a poop scoop or a suitable bag and dispose of deposits at home in the dustbin or in any Council litter or "doggie" bins. In the interests of hygiene, always please tie the neck of used bags.
- Ø Dog fouling is a nuisance and can also be a danger, particularly to young children, as it can lead to serious illnesses such as toxocariasis.
- Ø Failure to clean up after a dog in your charge will lead to a Fixed Penalty Notice of £50, or prosecution, which may lead to a fine of £1,000 plus costs. It is not an acceptable defence to claim ignorance of the dog's actions or that you did not carry means to dispose of the fouling at the time.
- Ø Report irresponsible dog owners to our Animal Warden by telephone on 01279 655261, by using our online form Dog Fouling Notification Form or by email. Please provide us with as much information as possible about the dog, dog owner, and the times and locations the owner regularly walks the dog.

Tewin Parish Council Policy

- Ø Tewin Parish Council endorses the views of East Herts Council as stated above.
- Ø It is Parish Council policy not to install "doggie" bins, as they are not in keeping with the rural environment, and litterbins can be used instead.
- Ø Tewin Parish Council will consider requests for additional litterbins.

The Tewin Cowper School Award goes to the child with the highest number of points in the children's classes for horticulture, arts & crafts and culinary. Lauren Murray won convincingly by being first in her age group in all three of these classes:-very impressive! Finally, the Les Borg Cup for Children's Photography was won by Peter Goodison.

Team Vicar's Letter

I am now taking a sabbatical, three whole months of delighting in the words and wisdom of others as I delve deeper into some of my favourite poets. It means you won't be able to get hold of me, but churchwardens and covering clergy will gladly give advice and help when needed. You will also get the delight of the words and wisdom of David Munchin, Team Rector, for the following three months in this magazine!

In this letter I want to share with you the words and wisdom of someone who was much loved and respected amongst many in this team of churches. Malcolm Slaughter was a long standing member of the congregation of St. Peter's, Tewin. He contributed to church life in many ways, and most recently as safeguarding officer. However, following a sudden heart attack Malcolm sadly died on the 29^{th} March. It seems more than poignant that the day he died was the day that his written reflection was set as the reading in our home produced Lent booklet. It seems more than poignant that he chose for that reflection to look back on his life and to assert to us all, his trust in a forgiving God who is there at our end, as much as at our beginning. Alpha and Omega, A – Z, both Wisdom and Word.

Revelation 21:5-7

And the one who was seated on the throne said, "See, I am making all things new." Also he said, "Write this, for these words are trustworthy and true." Then he said to me, "It is done! I am the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end. To the thirsty I will give water as a gift from the spring of the water of life. Those who conquer will inherit these things, and I will be their God and they will be my children.

When I read this passage from Revelations it makes me reflect on my own life. My birth, my childhood, my youth, my marriage, my family. I wonder where I have failed and where I have succeeded. What could I have done differently. Can one balance things out! No, but God is all forgiving. And the only answer I can offer is belief in God and service to others. 'To give and not to count the cost' is the first line of a prayer I use often in church. My life began with Jesus, through birth (creation) and though it has wandered from the pathway at times, my belief is that God is at the beginning and end of all things and will see me through until I am called to that heavenly kingdom.

Rogation Sunday

26th May 2019 is Rogation Sunday. In the Christian Calendar, Rogation Sunday is the 6th Sunday after Easter Day, the Sunday before Ascension Day (which is a Thursday).

It is the day when the Church has traditionally offered prayer for God's blessings on the fruits of the earth and the labours of those who produce our food. The word "rogation" is from the Latin *rogare*, "to ask".

Traditional Rogation Services can involve a walk around the village or neighbourhood with stops at the river, meadow, farm, a garden and church with a hymn, reading and prayer at each. It is a day when the "real" world is linked more closely to the service.

Such services are usually organised by the Anglican church but other denominations join in locally

NEWSFLASH FROM TEWIN STORES Tewin Stores Committee propose an exciting plan to secure the future of the shop and café

Thanks to its team of loyal volunteers Tewin is one of the few villages in Hertfordshire to retain its village shop. However, Tewin Stores is not immune to the pressures that have forced the closure of so many other local shops; the good news is Tewin residents now have the opportunity to help secure the future of this community asset and to this end the Tewin Stores Committee are seeking residents' help. The current owners of Tewin Stores are providing us with the opportunity to purchase the freehold for £150,000. Recently a resident of Tewin kindly bequeathed £100,000 to Tewin Stores and therefore the Committee need to raise a further £60,000 to complete the purchase and cover associated costs. Subject to the successful purchase of the freehold the Committee plan to seek further funding from various bodies to enable the development of the shop and its Cafe to better meet the needs of residents. Any surplus funding from the purchase of the freehold will go to the development of the store.

The Tewin Stores Committee has consulted various bodies and has concluded the best way of raising the necessary funds is through the issuing of new shares in Tewin Stores. A prospectus setting out the details of the share sale including, we hope, details of valuable tax relief available for income tax payers on the purchase of new shares, will be announced in the coming weeks. Shares will be priced at £25 each. It would greatly help the Committee if residents could, in confidence, indicate their willingness to purchase shares by emailing Company Secretary, Eleanor Lohr, at tewinstorespurchase@gmail.com giving details of their: name, address and the number of shares they are considering buying. Alternatively residents can register their interest at the shop by completing a form and posting it in a secure ballot box. The Committee wants to broaden the appeal of the shop and cafe for all the residents of Tewin and surrounding areas and hopes that residents will support their plan; regular updates will be given on progress and on any refurbishment plans.
