The proposal would therefore be contrary to Policies GBR1 and DES4 of the East Herts District Plan 2018 and the National Planning Policy Framework.

3/18/2212/FUL - Demolition of existing buildings, erection of 7 dwellings together with associated parking amenity space and access from Archers Green Lane - *TPC Object - EHC Refused due to inappropriate development in the Metropolitan Green Belt and other harm identified in respect of adverse impact on openness and character of area. Very special circumstances have not been identified that would clearly outweigh the harm by reason of inappropriateness and the other identified harm. The proposal would therefore be contrary to Policies GBR1 and DES4 of the East Herts District Plan 2018 and the National Planning Policy Framework. Insufficient information has been provided to demonstrate that the loss of the existing equine recreational facilities can be justified in accordance with Policy CFLR6 of the East Herts District Plan 2018.*

Appeal - Both planning applications 3/18/2211 and 3/18/2212 have been submitted to the Planning Inspectorate for appeal and Tewin Parish Council has submitted a response to the Planning Inspectorate.

Playground Extension

Tewin Parish Council has agreed to a small extension to Upper Green Playground to include a seesaw and three different types of small roundabouts suitable for children up to the age of 8 years. This is to be financed by a donation from Friends of Tewin. Works are expected to take place over the summer.

Playground Resurfacing

Tewin Parish Council has agreed to renew the safety surface of the Upper Green Playground with Matta surfacing which is free draining and fire retardant. These works are expected to take place over the summer.

Since 1748 the reigning monarch has had an official birthday in the summer to have a better chance of good weather for outdoor celebrations. It is combined with The Trooping of the Colour also known as the Queen's Birthday Parade. Since 1958 it has been held on the 2nd Saturday in June., which this year falls on 8th June 2019.

Blood Donation

June 14th is World Blood Donor Day. Giving blood saves lives. The blood you give is a lifeline in an emergency and for people who need long-term treatments.

Why are you needed to give blood?

New blood donors are needed from all backgrounds to ensure there is the right blood available for patients who need it.

What is needed?

- Nearly 400 new donors a day to meet demand
- Around 135,000 new donors a year to replace those who can no longer donate
- 40,000 more black donors to meet growing demand for better-matched blood
- 30,000 new donors with priority blood types, such as O negative, every year
- More young people to start giving blood so we can make sure we have enough blood in the future

Who can give blood?

Most people can give blood. You can give blood if you:

- are fit and healthy
- weigh between 7 stone 12 lbs and 25 stone, or 50kg and 160kg
- are aged between 17 and 66 (or 70 if you have given blood before)
- are over 70 and have given blood in the last two years

How often can I give blood?

• Men can give blood every 12 weeks and women can give blood every 16 weeks

The Trooping of the Colour 2

This impressive display of pageantry by her personal troops, the Household Division, takes place on Horse Guards Parade, with Her Majesty the Queen herself attending and taking the salute. Over 1400 officers and men are on parade, together with two hundred horses; over four hundred musicians from ten bands and corps of drums march and play as one. Some 113 words of command are given by the Officer in Command of the Parade.

Screen On The Green

On Monday 17th June we are showing "*Bridge of Spies*" (2015). Starring Tom Hanks, Mark Rylance, Amy Ryan and Alan Alda and directed by Stephen Spielberg, this is an historical drama based on true events.

Set in the Cold War, it tells the story of a lawyer who negotiated the release of Gary Powers, a US Air Force pilot whose spy plane was shot down over the Soviet Union, in exchange for Rudolf Abel, a KGB spy being held in America. The film received many accolades with Mark Rylance winning both the Oscar and BAFTA Award for Best Supporting Actor.

We take a break during July and August but in the meantime we'll be busy planning the programme for next season, so if you have any suggestions for films you'd like to see, let us know. Since *Screen on the Green* started in 2012 we have shown over seventy films covering a wide range of genres – comedy, drama, thriller, musical, classic, foreign language, fact based, sci-fi and western. In my role as Chairman I would like say a big thank you to the wonderful team of helpers who give their time and energy to make the Film Nights such fun and of course to all you loyal supporters who come along on the night.

During the ceremony, The Queen is greeted by a Royal salute and carries out an inspection of the troops. After the massed bands have performed a musical 'troop', the escorted Regimental Colour is carried down the ranks. The Foot Guards and the Household Cavalry then march past Her Majesty, and The King's Troop, Royal Horse Artillery, rank past. The Queen rides back to Buckingham Palace at the head of her Guards, before taking the salute at the Palace from a dais.

Team Vicar's Letter

On the 22nd of this month we will again be celebrating St Albans Day, and I thought I might make a case for our local saint. I am slightly biased in all of this, not only because he is our local saint, but also because I worked in his Abbey for 6 years and before that, at the very start of my ministry, I was Curate at a church in London dedicated to St Alban.

Like any history the facts are a little disputed, though the most famous and full account comes in Bede's Ecclesiastical History of the English People, which places the martyrdom in 305 and on this particular date of 22nd June. What is fairly common among the accounts is that Alban was a Roman citizen from Verulamium who sheltered a priest fleeing from persecution by an edict on the Roman Emperor. He was then executed following a brief trial somewhere near the top of the hill where the Abbey now stands - though some believe his martyrdom was in London. Various other details, including the marvellous story of how his first executioner refused and died with him, whilst the second one's eyes fell out as he delivered the knock out blow, are also found in the differing accounts. Most controversial is the year of the martyrdom with a range roughly from 205-310 being suggested. However there is enough common ground to say that Alban is rather a 'good' saint - he's certainly 'real', he himself committed no acts of war or violence (unlike many ancient British warrior saints), he was the subject of religious persecution, and stood up for religious freedom, he was martyred for his beliefs, and we have a pretty good idea of where all this took place, and a great Cathedral and Abbey Church (free entry incidentally) to remember it, and this place is in this country.

All of which is of course to say that none of the above, certainly with any certainty, can be said of St George

Now I realise that this may be straying onto controversial ground, and that affection for St George, at least through the flag and Royal connections, may mean he is not likely to be usurped as Patron Saint of England. But what about Alban for Patron Saint of the United Kingdom? How would that sit as an idea? David Munchin

What is Pentecost?

Pentecost is the festival when Christians celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit. It is celebrated on the Sunday 50 days after Easter (the name comes from the Greek *pentekoste*, "fiftieth"). This year, 2019, it falls on 9th June.

It is also called Whitsun, from White Sunday, but does not necessarily coincide with the Whitsun Bank Holiday in the UK which is fixed as the last Monday in May.

Pentecost is regarded as the birth of the Christian church, and the start of the church's mission to the world.

Dealing With Not Knowing

I realise that there is immeasurably more that I do not, and will never, understand than the small amount that I do understand. I am generally not at all bothered by this and the things I do not understand are similarly not bothered by me.

Electricity and the internet are two examples of my lack of understanding. I could decide that, as a result, I do not believe in them and turn my back on them. I do not. There is evidence to prove that they exist and work even though they may not be perfect.

The most important of the things I do not understand is God. One of the big problems is that God does not do things in the way I think he/she should. Life itself is such a mixture of good and bad, pain and pleasure, success and failure, joy and misery. Given my way, I would not have allowed the bad parts in at all and wonder if they are a mistake. The early biblical view was that God made all things good but humans spoilt it. We can spoil things but for example we did not have a hand in the fate of the dinosaurs nor did we invent the idea of the food chain so called, and which I find disturbing. So is it either God's mistake or is it what was intended? Alternatively is it all just a huge cosmic accident without rhyme or reason and with nothing behind it.

I could on the grounds of my lack of understanding turn my back on the possibility of the existence of God. That is unless as in the case of say the internet, there is some proof. There is not the same type of proof. For me and, for most of the time, there is sufficient evidence in the biblical accounts of the life and teachings of Jesus, in what I see and hear and experience, in what is around me, and in the people I know, to say yes to the possibility of the existence of God. Where do you stand? I suspect that proof awaits our next form of existence. As for my lack of understanding, and in the meantime - (may it last for long) - perhaps I have just got to get around it.

Regimental flags of the British Army were historically described as 'Colours' because they displayed the uniform Colours and insignia worn by the soldiers of different units. The name 'Colour' continues to be used to this day. The principal role of a regiment's Colours was to provide a rallying point on the battlefield. This was important because, without modern communications, it was all too easy for troops to become disorientated and separated from their unit during conflict.
