Parish Council Audit

PKF Littlejohn LLP has completed the external auditor report and certificate in respect of the annual return for Tewin Parish Council and has issued an unqualified audit opinion as they consider the information in the annual return is in accordance with proper practices and the

relevant legislation and regulatory requirements have been met. This was approved and accepted by Tewin Parish Council and the notice of conclusion of audit and audit form is displayed on the Parish Council notice board for the statutory 14 days and on the website.

PPP/P3 GRANT

A grant of £1000 has been awarded towards the drainage works on FP11 at the back of Upper Green and the contractor will do the works during a dry spell over the winter.

Plane Disturbance

Following a complaint raised by a Parishioner the Parish Council raised the concern with Luton Airport and they advised that Luton airport has two directions of operation, depending upon wind direction as aircraft are required to take off and land into the wind for safety reasons. These are known as easterly and westerly operations and can change the aircraft tracks near to specific areas. The aircraft using the easterly operations are most likely to cause disturbance to Tewin residents and they occur on average about 30% of the time due to the prevailing wind direction in the area.

Dementia Friendly Rural Communities

The Parish Council has agreed to support some parishioners in helping make Tewin a Dementia Friendly Community and hopes that the parish will support them as well.

<u>Highways</u>

Churchfield Road New "Vehicles in the Road" Sign - Highways advised that it is not a priority but can be considered under the County Councillor's Local budget. Highways are checking with design engineers to see if the proposed sign is suitable for this location. The Parish Council agreed to ask Cllr Ken Crofton if he would allocate some of next year's Local Budget towards this sign. **Raise Existing Triangle Signs at bottom of Churchfield Road** – Highway advised that a Ringway HIT gang will attend to this in next few months. **Paint Churchfield Road Bridge** - The Highways Structure Team are considering whether the ends of the bridge can be painted with white paint so they are more visible. **Remove Vegetation Around Churchfield Bridge** - Highways are checking with HCC Land Charges to see who owns the land. Ringway will only get involved if private vegetation is overhanging the carriageway.

Flooding on Churchfield Road between bridge and B1000 – Ringway are aware of the issue and it is on their list of requested works. This is currently medium/low priority and when they next have works planned for Churchfield Road this will be included within the scheme.

Weed Spraying - East Herts Council has advised that this will take place in the parish during September and this has been chased.

Autumn Show on Saturday 7th September

Congratulations to all the exhibitors at the Autumn Show! The display in the afternoon was lovely, especially since the show of exhibits was accompanied by several displays of childrens' work.

It's amazing how imaginative people can be, just given the opportunity. For example, one of the Arts & Crafts categories was a picture entitled "A study of the hand". In addition to the expected pictures of the human hand, there was a picture of the hands of a clock and one of a hand of cards!

This was the 18th annual Autumn Show and it attracted 97 exhibitors who entered 271 exhibits. These numbers are very similar to those of the Autumn Show last year, with both shows being noticeably smaller than in previous years. We could speculate about the reasons for this reduction in the number of exhibits, but I would rather focus on ideas for generating more exhibits for next time. If you have any comments about the show or suggestions for improving future shows, then please let me know. I would be particularly interested in any suggestions you may have about how to make the schedule more appealing to potential exhibitors and how to generate more interest and entries.

When it came to the presentation of the prizes, the adult trophy winners were Susan Whitbourn for Flower Arranging, Ray Keppler for Flowers, Michael Clark for Vegetables & Fruit, Terry Brand for Arts & Crafts, Terry Brand for Photography and Hilary Tipping for Culinary. The Shire Park Bowls Club President's Shield for horticulture was won by Ray Keppler, whilst the RHS Banksian Medal went to Michael Clark. The *THACS* Adult & Child Pairs trophy was won by Debbie Hall with her daughter Erin Murray. The George Humble Crawford Award for Children's Photography was won by Annabel Goodison, who also won the Tewin Cowper School Parents' Association Award for the highest number of points in the children's classes for horticulture, arts & crafts and culinary. The cost remains unchanged at $\pounds 3$ for adults and $\pounds 2$ for children aged 10 years and over. Bats and all other equipment are provided by the club together with soft drinks.

Games are played in a friendly and sociable manner and not too seriously. Why not come along and give it a try.

The club has two teams once again entered in the St Albans, Hatfield and Welwyn Table Tennis League. Home matches are played in the School Hall on Thursday evenings. The new season has already begun and our teams have made an encouraging start.

Our first team, following their promotion as winners of Division 3 last season, play in Division 2 and although the standard of play is much higher our team has got off to a good start. So far 3 draws and a win against strong opposition.

The second team play in Division 4 and although the first match was postponed, they won the next two matches 10-0 and 8-2.

Much of the credit for the successful start to the new season must go to our three junior players. Nathan Reeves, aged 13, playing in the first team is close to a 50% win average which is a tremendous performance in a strong senior league. Playing for the second team in Division 4 Lewis Budd, aged 16, has won all his 6 games so far and Andres Howson, aged 13, has a 66% success average.

Lewis and Andres were pupils of Tewin Cowper School when they joined our club with few Table Tennis skills but have improved their game considerably over the years to force their way into the League teams. The Club is immensely proud of the 3 junior members and are happy in the knowledge that the future success of the club is safe in their hands.

On Monday 18th November we will be showing "*Pride*" (2014), a British comedy-drama based on true events. In the summer of 1984 a group of lesbian and gay activists raise money to help families affected by the Miners strike. Despite being initially rebuffed by the National Union of Mineworkers the activists persevere and as the strike drags on the two groups discover that standing together makes for the strongest union of all.

Directed by Matthew Warchus and starring Bill Nighy, Imelda Staunton and Dominic West, it was screened as part of the Director's Fortnight section of the 2014 Cannes Film Festival. *Pride* received critical acclaim with praise for a screenplay that showed accessibility and humour without trivialising the issues addressed in the film. Team Vicar's Letter

There are some things I'd love to forget but seem not to be able to - like the time I ended up with my mouth attached to the then Bishop of Bedford's ear. This may seem a difficult thing to do by accident, but I assure you it is possible. After a charity event at which I was speaking he leaned forward as we were saying goodbye. I thought he was going for the polite peck on the check. Turns out he was only stretching to open the door...

But then there are the times when I really want to remember something, like one of the many passwords I have been forced to set up to for access to important accounts, and then my mind goes blank.

Memory can be frustrating, difficult and painful. Yet the failing memory of someone slipping in to Alzheimers reminds us of how precious the ability to remember is and how much it roots us into our families and communities. Those caring for someone in that position will find their own memory of who that person was before the cruelty of illness both an aid in their continuing love for them and a painful reminder of what has been lost.

November is a time for memories and because of that can be a month which is bitter-sweet. We begin the month with All Saints day – a time to give thanks for lives of courage and faith, whose memories have been passed through generations. The remembering of these past lives give hope to the suffering in our present.

Then we have All Souls, a time to remember loved ones we have known, but who we are now separated from by death. We will remember them by name in a special service on the 3rd November. A week later people will gather again to remember those fallen in war – memories which are now largely passed to new generations to hold as important and precious for our future as well as our past.

Churches are a good place to remember: the history of generations gathering to do the same, the prayers of people before us soaked into the air and the strength of the walls which have held immeasurable hopes and fears, loves and loss, brokenness and healing. And they are places where the story of God is still remembered and proclaimed. So as we hold our memories before us – whether they bring us delight or sorrow, we come to be reminded that, soaring or struggling, God remembers us.

'I will not forget you' says the Lord 'See I have inscribed you on the palms of my hands' Isaiah 49:15-16

We stripped the large Storage Hut on Friday afternoon and Friday evening in the rain, and it also continued as we put up three large tents and seven gazebos the next morning. Those working outside got rather wet to say the least but somehow they had the largest smiles! Attendance was almost the same as last year's Sale. Our most ardent shoppers weren't going to be put off by a soaking! As a result we took over £4,000 on the day - £4151 to be exact, and this total has since increased little by little, taking us above £4,200. A remarkable result considering the weather.

Jean and I had hoped for a sunny day to help us achieve an all-time record income as this was to be our last Jumble Sale after twelve years heading the team. We've seen the profits grow during the last 25 Sales but now we both feel it's time to step back and let a younger generation take charge and put in new ideas. Neither of us want to see the Jumble Sales stop and we have no intention of walking away. We both want to be part of the team in future years. A Committee is being formed and we are looking forward to serving on it but in a lesser capacity. We've both been associated with the Jumble Sales for 30 years and people who were then just nodding acquaintances are now firm friends. We've had many laughs, and even more smiles, over the years and feel sure there will be many more to follow. The Jumblers are a fantastic team of people, who have worked enthusiastically and diligently with us over the years for which we are very privileged.

The Memorial Hall Committee is also very grateful for the generosity of Villagers and others, who donated such a wide variety of goods, which has enabled us to have such successful Jumble Sales over the years, and we feel this generosity will continue in the future.

Autumn on the Farm

If you look out of your window, or go for a walk, you will see that the countryside has turned from lovely golden fields to dark brown dirt. Farmers always talk about farms as having a good bit of dirt.

The Harvest has been safely gathered in and is piled into the barns. The combine has been blown down to remove the dust from the very dry cereals which it has just cut and put into storage until next year. The trailers await their next job.

Farmers refer to wheat, barley, oats and rye as cereals. Unlike your breakfast cereals, the cereals in the barn need looking after just like a baby. It is a valuable crop. You have to take its temperature with a very long probe and if it gets too hot from the sun, we blow in cool night air to lower the temperature. If the crop is a bit damp, we blow in warm air from the ventilated floor.

We have to make sure that no birds or creatures (large or small) get into the barn as we are selling our cereals as Grain Assured. This means that everything we do has to be the best for the grain and for the general public who eat it.

There are three main types of wheat:

- Feed wheat, which is the lowest grade, is made into pellets for cattle feed, dog food and bird food
- Biscuit wheat, which is the middle grade, is made into biscuits such as digestives and Hobnobs
- Milling wheat, which is the top grade, is used for bread and pastries.

The protein levels and 'Hagberg' levels are checked to determine the suitability of the wheat for bread-making. The Hagberg falling number is the measure of a specific enzyme, with higher levels being preferred by millers.

The wheat we grew this year is called Skyfall. It has good disease resistance, short stiff straw and early maturity. It is a bearded wheat. We buy fresh seed most years from a seed merchant. This year we chopped our straw and ploughed it back into the soil to make humus and to improve the soil ready for next year's crop.
