HERTFORD ROAD SPEED LIMIT

Tewin Parish Council agreed to support the Tewin Drivesafe Team's proposal to Hertfordshire Highways for a 20mph speed limit along Hertford Road. The proposed limit is to run from the village

sign, past the shop and along the north and south sides of Lower Green. It does not include the west side that links School Lane and Upper Green Road.

The Tewin Drivesafe Team have done a survey of residents living on the roads bordering the proposed area. There was overwhelming support and with just a couple of houses not yet surveyed, not a single person disagreed.

Now that the birds have finished nesting, Tewin Parish Council would be grateful if all residents who have hedges on their land bordering a footpath or pavement would cut them back if they are overhanging or partially blocking the path.

Firstly, you should check with your neighbours, to see if they know who owns the car. Failing this, there are a number of things you can do:

If the car has been stationary for some time, and appears abandoned, you should report it to East Herts Council 01279-655261.

If you think the car may be stolen, due to damaged locks / ignition or being left insecure please ring 101 or report online at https://www.herts.police.uk/Report/Report and the Police will conduct checks on the vehicle.

The Weather on the Farm

Things have not altered much on the farm since last month. At this time of year the farmers take stock of the countryside. You may have seen the very level cut hedges around our village and the Church drive. We clear away the fallen trees and branches. The farmer tidies up the countryside and is very much controlled by the weather. And yes, we do moan that there is not enough rain or it's too windy to spray or it's too wet on our fields to sow the new seeds. At the moment sowing is the problem. It has been a stop/start affair with about 50% sowed to date. You cannot take or drive a tractor on wet fields as it leaves deep ruts which fill with water. This is not what we want and we are keeping our fingers crossed that the rain will stop and we will finish our drilling soon. We have had 150ml of rain so far as we write this in November. Some of our wheat has been sold and you might have been saying a few choice words when stuck behind one of those 44 ton grain lorries heading up to Muspatts yard. Some has been sold through a merchant to a WGC company for pet food and some of the best sold to Heygates Mill. We also grow Naked Oats. During combining the husk falls away, thus why it is called Naked Oats. The natural groat is nutrient dense giving high energy and is marketed through the Superioats brand to various end users. It is processed for bird food, dog food, poultry food and horse feed with its versatility reaching as far as cosmetics, being used in, for example, lipsticks!

We also grow Daytona Peas. Our climate produces the best 'Blue' peas in the world. The blue refers to the even colour retention. Daytona has consistently delivered good samples for the human and micronising pet food market. Much of the crop is exported to the Low Countries, especially Holland, where it is used in a traditional dish of ham and pea broth.

Christmas Crackers

Christmas Crackers were invented by Thomas Smith in 1846 after seeing the 'bon-bon', a sugared almond wrapped in a piece of paper with a twist at each end, on a visit to Paris. His bon-bons sold well at Christmas but not at other times of the year. In the early 1850s he added a simple love poem. In about 1860 he added the banger, two pieces of chemical impregnated paper which made a loud noise when pulled apart. They were originally called 'cosaques' but soon became known as crackers.

Team Vicar's Letter

I'm not sure which one of us put an election on our letter to Santa but it seems that's the one delivery that is guaranteed this year. So as well as the jingles for High Street stores we'll find ourselves surrounded by political promises, and as well as Christmas cards dropping through the letter box, we'll be picking up communication mail from our local candidates. Some might feel this is a bit of a spoiler on the season, however I think there are good reasons this political stance could provide a more authentic Christmas experience, should we give it some thought.

Politics shapes the Christmas story as we know it. Luke's gospel tells us Mary and Joseph travel to Bethlehem precisely because Quirinius, governor of Syria, was commanded by the Roman Emperor Augustus to conduct a census for the purpose of taxes. Before we meet the child Jesus Matthew's gospel is keen to establish his credentials as a descendant of King David, and to acknowledge the political exile of Jesus' ancestors to Babylon. The wise men cause a threat to the political order with the news of a newborn king so that King Herod plans to kill the child. Mary and Joseph flee and live as refugees in neighbouring Egypt. Meanwhile, fuelled by the desire to cling to political power, Herod orders all young children in and around Bethlehem be slain.

The Christmas story is about God entering our world. The baby Jesus finds his life shaped by the political stage around him from before he leaves the womb. The politics of the world with its competing factions, impact his life from his birth until his final breath on the cross.

Politics too shapes all of our lives. It has profound effects on the lives of those who are very similar to us and those who live in very different circumstances. The bible is clear that our concern should never be just for our own standards of living but rather for those who are particularly vulnerable or in need. Perhaps we could see our vote as a Christmas present to our neighbour as well as a desire for ourselves.

So if you want to add that authentic dimension to Christmas this year, make sure you visit your local polling booth. Oh, and also, do take a mince pie to those good people who'll spend the day volunteering so you can cast your vote.

As usual, with the actors, we shall have a real baby, real donkey and real sheep. It is a real treat!

Our Carol Service will be held on Sunday 15th December at 6.30pm. Thank you to all those people who have expressed an interest in joining the choir. Please keep coming forward – we particularly want people of all ages to sing at the Carol Service.

On Christmas Eve we shall celebrate Midnight Mass by candle light at 11.30pm, and on Christmas Day at 10am there will be a family Holy Communion service.

TEWIN BELL-RINGERS RING IN SUPPORT OF THE MOTOR NEURONE DISEASE ASSOCIATION'S 40TH ANNIVERSARY

This year the Motor Neurone Disease Association (MNDA) marked its 40^{th} anniversary as a registered charity on Sunday 6^{th} October. MND causes the messages from the motor neurones gradually to stop reaching the muscles, resulting in progressive muscle wastage, affecting the ability to walk, talk, eat, drink and breathe. Professor Stephen Hawking was a high-profile sufferer from MND. In the case of some people, all they have left is sight and sound, and for this reason the MNDA have called the campaign to mark their 40^{th} anniversary "Sight and Sound – It's all I have left".

They asked bell-ringers all over the country to link into the 'Sound' aspect by requesting that as many towers as possible should arrange some ringing at, or as near as possible to, 7.00pm on Saturday 5th October to raise awareness of this disease and to recognise the 40 years of fundraising and research to help all those affected. They also asked for public buildings to be lit up in blue and orange (the MNDA colours) as a visual reminder. Six members of the Tewin band of ringers rang for 20 minutes at 6.30pm on 5th October with several members of the band having a particular interest in supporting this cause. The Lay family would like to dedicate this ringing to Graham's brother, Colin Lay, who died in January 2012 from this dreadful disease.
