Churchwardens' Notes

Our popular series of Summer Evensongs will be held every Sunday evening at 6.30pm, commencing on 25th July and continuing on each Sunday to 5 September. This year two will be held at St Peter's, Tewin. These will be on 15th August and 5th September and the theme this year will be "Journeys". We generally have some refreshment after the service, which gives an opportunity to chat to visitors from other churches in the team.

We are still awaiting the final fixings for the north windows in the nave. These are being made by a blacksmith and, once fitted, will allow us to remove the cords. Meanwhile, another element of the work carried out in 2009 has proved to be most successful. This is the new gulley placed on the path to the vestry door to divert rainwater away from the north wall of the church. Hopefully, the internal plaster will now dry out.

Now a little piece of history...... When Tewin Wood was in the early stages of construction, the agent was Alfred Bishop, who lived in Keepers Cottage on Desborough Drive. He died in 1952 at the age of 63, and was buried in the same grave as his parents in Tewin churchyard. However, whilst a memorial plaque was put in the bus shelter in Tewin village, there was no acknowledgement of the burial on the grave. Over 50 years later this has been rectified thanks to his grand-daughter; and Coralie held a short service at the graveside on 5^{th} June when a new memorial stone was placed on the grave.

Ada Izzard and Frank Harris feature with a number of other people in the village, most of whom are named in attached notes kept with the original storyboard. It could be Peggy Harris, too, present and Tewin residents of the time may know everyone shown. The films were made to a very high standard for national distribution and the archive. If you search in 'Hertfordshire' for example, you will find 'Cats Eye Cunningham' the Hatfield test pilot with Hatfield aerodrome material and the Comet.

Also, Graham Dangerfield in colour with his animals at Wheathampstead and the clip of the Cuffley Zeppelin memorial opening in the 1920's actually shows my grandmother on the garden side of the roped off area!

Unfortunately, adverts break into the pictures as you open them and you have to wait until they clear - clicking only brings them up large, but you get there in the end and the website is well worth exploring. If you click on the enlarge symbol, it goes full frame on the computer.

PLAYGROUND

The playground will still be open during the Pavilion refurbishment however it may be shut for 24hrs in order to carry out some remedial works on the gates sometime during the summer.

BUS SHELTER

The landlord of the Rose and Crown asked the Parish Council to advise Parishioners that the bus shelter is covered by the pub's CCTV.

DOG FOULING

There have been complaints about dog fouling within the Parish and the Parish Council would like to remind Parishioners of their Dog Fouling Policy which is in line with that of East Herts Council :-

- Be a responsible dog owner and carry disposable bags to ensure you can clean up after your dog, keep your dog under control at all times, keep your dog out of dog restricted areas, and do not allow the dog out alone.
- Use a poop scoop or a suitable bag and dispose of deposits at home in the dustbin or in any Council litter or "doggie" bins. In the interests of hygiene, always please tie the neck of used bags.
- Dog fouling is a nuisance and can also be a danger, particularly to young children, as it can lead to serious illnesses such as toxocariasis.
- Failure to clean up after a dog in your charge will lead to a Fixed Penalty Notice for £50, or prosecution, which may lead to a fine of £1,000 plus costs. It is not an acceptable defence to claim ignorance of the dog's actions or that you did not carry means to dispose of the fouling at the time.
- Report irresponsible dog owners to our Animal Warden on 01279 655261, by using our online form Dog Fouling Notification Form or by email. Please provide us with as much information as possible about the dog, dog owner, and the times and locations the owner regularly walks the dog.
